The Secretary of State and Ambassador Roosevelt arrive the SouthWest Gate, Diplomatic Entrance and wait for the arrival of the Prime Minister of Singapore.

11:55 a.m.

His Excellency <u>Lee</u> Kuan Yew, Prime Minister of Singapore, arrives the Diplomatic Entrance accompanied by Ambassador Punch Coomaraswamy and Minister of Defense Dr. Yeo Nigh Hong.

They will be met by the Secretary of State and Ambassador Roosevelt, escorted into the Diplomatic Reception Room, and the Prime Minister will then sign the guest book.

The Prime Minister and his accompanying party will be escorted to the Red Room for refreshments.

11:58 a.m.

All guests are ushered into the State Dining Room except for the Prime Minister.

12:00 Noon

THE PRESIDENT will arrive the State Floor via the elevator and will proceed to the Red Room where he will greet the Prime Minister.

THE PRESIDENT and the Prime Minister will then proceed from the Red Room to the State Dining Room and be seated.

Luncheon is served.

1:30 p.m.

At the conclusion of the luncheon, THE PRESIDENT will escort the Prime Minister via the elevator to the Diplomatic Reception Room where they will hold briefly as other guests proceed out of the Diplomatic Reception Room and find their cars.

All other guests will proceed down the Grand Staircase and out the Diplomatic Reception Room.

As soon as the other guests have departed the Diplomatic Reception Room for their cars, the PRESIDENT will escort the Prime Minister to his car.

THE PRESIDENT then returns to the Residence. All remaining guests depart.
