SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH SELECTED CORPORATE EXECUTIVES

- I. -- Thank you and welcome to the White House.
- II. -- I know that Bill Verity and his staff have a full agenda set for you over the next 24 hours.
- III. -- I just wanted to thank you for coming and tell you how important I think the work of Bill Verity and the Task Force is.
 - IV. -- We started this effort 8 months ago. I know we have come a long way since then and that we have a long way to go.
 - V. -- That is why you are here today to understand a little more about what the Task Force is doing, and where we are going from here. We also would like you to be our Ambassadors of Private Sector Initiative.
 - VI. -- You know, I told Bill Verity when we started this project that I didn't want a fancy report. I wanted him to go out and surface those private sector initiatives out there, and encourage more people to do the same. In short, we wanted action. And judging from what Bill tells me, here is seeing around the country, we're getting it.

 - VII. -- I understand most of you are Chief Executive Officers of your companies and leaders in your communities.
- VIII. -- You and I both know that there is a lot of positive private sector activity happening out there, but the Task Force needs your help in telling that story.
 - IX. -- Let me tell you about just one initiative. Last year I asked Bill Baroody, President of the American Enterprise Institute and Subcommittee Chairman of the Task Force "Models" Committee, to compile a study about current initiatives and new alternative approaches to meeting human needs without federal funds. The book is finished and has many examples which might be applicable in your own communities.
 - X. -- Also, I understand that Bill Verity's Task Force project bank now has over 600 examples of private initiative and volunteer projects. I'm sure you will be hearing more about that later.
 - XI. -- If I could ask you to do one thing, it would be to begin a dialogue in your communities about different approaches to solving community problems. I know that many of you are already doing this.
 - XII. -- Well, I hope that the next 24 hours are helpful. Bill Verity and his staff are doing some very exciting things which you will hear about. Thank you for coming.
