TALKING POINTS

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH  
DEFICIT REDUCTION ACTION GROUP

- Thank you for taking the time to join us today for a discussion of one of the most important domestic issues facing this country.
  
- First of all, I want you to know how much I appreciate all the work undertaken by the Deficit Reduction Action Group. I'd like to offer special thanks to Jack Albertine of the American Business Conference for the outstanding job he's doing as the leader of the coalition.
  
- Red and Wayne have kept me fully informed of your many activities, including your statements of support, your contacts with Members of Congress and your grass roots work.
  
- I don't need to tell you how important this legislation is! It is the key to further spending reductions and to maintaining the integrity of the entire budget process. It is the only current path available to reduce deficits and bring down interest rates.
