- TO AMBASSADOR HABIB AND HIS STAFF MUST GO OUR SPECIAL THANKS FOR THEIR TIRELESS AND COURAGEOUS EFFORTS.
- I AM GENUINELY HOPEFUL THAT AN END TO THE DESTRUCTION OF BEIRUT IS IN SIGHT AND THAT THE BLOODSHED IS OVER.

- BUT I MUST CAUTION YOU THAT WE ARE NOT YET ASSURED OF SUCCESS.
- TO BE SUCCESSFUL, THE WITHDRAWAL PLAN WILL REQUIRE ALL THE PARTIES INVOLVED TO CARRY OUT THE AGREED SEQUENCE OF EVENTS.

THE MNF WILL ASSIST THE LEBANESE ARMED FORCES IN CARRYING OUT THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE SAFE AND ORDERLY DEPARTURE OF THE PLO LEADERS, COMBATANTS, AND OFFICES, AND FURTHER THE RESTORATION OF LEBANESE GOVERNMENT AUTHORITY OVER THE BEIRUT AREA.
- MY DECISION TO CONTRIBUTE A U.S. CONTINGENT TO THE MNF WAS NOT TAKEN LIGHTLY.

- A U.S. CONTINGENT IN THE MULTINATIONAL FORCE WAS INDISPENSABLE TO THE SUCCESS OF THE PLAN WHICH PHIL HABIB HAS NEGOTIATED.
- FRENCH FORCES WILL DEPLOY FIRST. U.S. FORCES WILL ENTER ONLY AFTER THE WITHDRAWAL IS WELL UNDERWAY. THIS SEQUENCE CONSTITUTES AN ADDITIONAL SAFEGUARD.
- THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE PLO SHOULD TAKE ABOUT TWO WEEKS. I DO NOT EXPECT U.S. FORCES TO BE IN LEBANON FOR MORE THAN THIRTY DAYS.

- TO SHOW OUR SERIOUSNESS OF PURPOSE, THE MANDATE OF THE MULTINATIONAL FORCE MISSION WILL TERMINATE AND THE FORCES WILL BE WITHDRAWN IF THE PLO FAILS TO DEPART.
- WE HAVE RECEIVED ASSURANCES REGARDING THE SAFETY OF THE FORCE AND I DO NOT ANTICIPATE HOSTILITIES. YOU ALSO HAVE MY COMMITMENT TO REPORT TO THE CONGRESS CONSISTENT WITH THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF THE WAR POWERS RESOLUTION.


