I. PURPOSE

This meeting will give you an opportunity to meet briefly with your nominee for the position of Secretary of the Department of Energy, Don Hodel. Your intention to nominate Don will be announced later in the week. This meeting has been scheduled to provide you with an opportunity to meet with him prior to an announcement.

II. BACKGROUND

As you are aware, Don Hodel has been serving as Under Secretary of the Department of the Interior. In a conversation with me today, Don indicated that he would make brief comments in the following areas:

1. Defense component of the Department of Energy: Don will seek assistance from NSC in an evaluation of the Department's programs in this area. He is particularly interested in the new production reactor and laser technology.
2. Non-defense components of the Department: Don believes that it particularly important to forge a "new consensus" in the country with respect to our energy policy, specifically addressing the following--
 - natural gas deregulation [we will review the issue of accelerating natural gas price decontrol within the next few weeks];

- avoid federal subsidies;
 - keep federal support of energy on the research and development side of the ledger;
3. Management and administration: Don wants to improve the moral within the Department and the internal management.
 4. Energy/Commerce Merger: Don believes that as a new consensus emerges with regard to the federal role in the energy area which relies more on a free market approach, the need for a Department of Energy will diminish.

I. PURPOSE

This is the second of the introductory sessions related to the development of the FY'84 budget. In this meeting, we will look retrospectively at what appear to have been the political constraints upon our budget reduction efforts.

Subsequent sessions will discuss: management savings; potential new initiatives; a prospective analysis of political constraints and opportunities; and choices among major budget components.

Following these introductory sessions -- as previously noted -- your guidance on a set of basic issues will be sought and discussed with the Cabinet. Thereafter, the ordinary budget process will go forward -- with major issues and appeals brought to you for decision during the first weeks of December.

This meeting is not a decision meeting.
