PRESIDENTIAL REMARKS: PBS YOUNG ARTISTS SERIES SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 1982

First I want to thank our master of ceremonies and master of the violin Itzhak Perlman. Jascha Heifetz once said that a concert violinist must have "the nerves of a bullfighter, the vitality of a woman who runs a nightclub, and the concentration of a Buddhist monk." I should add, Itzhak also has the ebullience of a newly-elected Congressman. What all that adds up to is incredible talent. When Itzhak picks up the violin, the strings he plays are those of our heart.

There's another thing I'd find impressive about Itzhak even without his gifts of music and personality. He lives in Babe Ruth's old apartment in New York. Now that's something few violinists can claim.

Ken Noda was a babe himself when he began his musical studies at the age of five. Someone once asked the great pianist Artur Schnabel [SHNOBBLE] if he had a secret for playing the piano. He said, "It is a very simple one. I sit down on the piano-stool and make myself comfortable -- and I always make sure that the lid over the keyboard is open before I start to play." Well, Ken makes playing the piano look about that easy. Of course, we all know what determination and sacrifice it's taken for Ken to reach the skill he has dazzled us with this evening. And I'd be willing to bet we're going to be hearing a great deal about this young man in the years ahead. That's the great thing
