SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS

- This is the first meeting of the Republican Leadership for the 98th Congress. Look forward to having such sessions regularly. Want to say a special word of welcome to the newly elected members of the Leadership---Dick Lugar, Bob Lagomarsino and Jim Martin.
- Also want to salute my trusted partner and good friend Howard Baker. He has been and will continue to be throughout this Congress one of the finest, most skillful Majority Leaders of this century.
- Now, down to business. Want to preview briefly my State of the Union message which I will deliver at 9:00 p.m. tonight and the budget and legislative initiatives that will follow.
- Recognizing that the state of our Union is strong, but our economy is troubled, I will propose a four-part bipartisan plan for economic growth and reduced deficits:
- A Federal spending freeze---taken as a whole, the total budget for FY1984 will increase no more than the rate of inflation.
  - Specific measures to control the growth of the so-called "uncontrollable" spending programs.
  - Adjustments to restore America's defenses which will not diminish our ability to negotiate arms reductions or endanger our security.

- Because we must insure reduction and eventual elimination of deficits, a stand-by-tax---or insurance policy, if you will---limited to no more than 1% of GNP to start in 1986 only if *deficit equals 2% of GNP*

- At the same time, I will oppose efforts to undo the basic tax reform we have enacted (the third 10% and indexing).

--- Realize <sup>the</sup> this 4-part plan is easier to describe than it will be to enact but the deficits must be reduced and the budget balanced in this decade.

--- I will submit to the Congress an Employment Act of 1983 designed to get at the special problems of the long-term unemployed as well as the young people entering the job market.

--- On other fronts, I will propose a stronger approach in the field of international trade; policies to revitalize American education; action to relieve the skyrocketing cost of health care and comprehensive legislation to provide catastrophic illness coverage for older Americans.

--- There are many other items I will propose tonight---including the Caribbean Basin Initiative--but I want to ask for your special help in getting enactment of the Social Security plan recommended by the bipartisan Commission. There are elements in it, of course, that none of us prefer, but taken together it forms a package all of us can support. The bipartisan plan will do the job.

--- Now I want to ask Dave Stockman and Don Regan to say a few words. We will, of course, be doing full briefings for you on the budget before its submission next Monday.

(AFTER STOCKMAN AND REGAN COMPLETE THEIR COMMENTS)

--- I want to call on Howard and then Bob before general discussion.

(AT CONCLUSION OF GENERAL DISCUSSION)

--- What we've accomplished during the past two years was made possible in large measure by the leadership and teamwork gathered in this room. I hope we will continue to stand together this year.

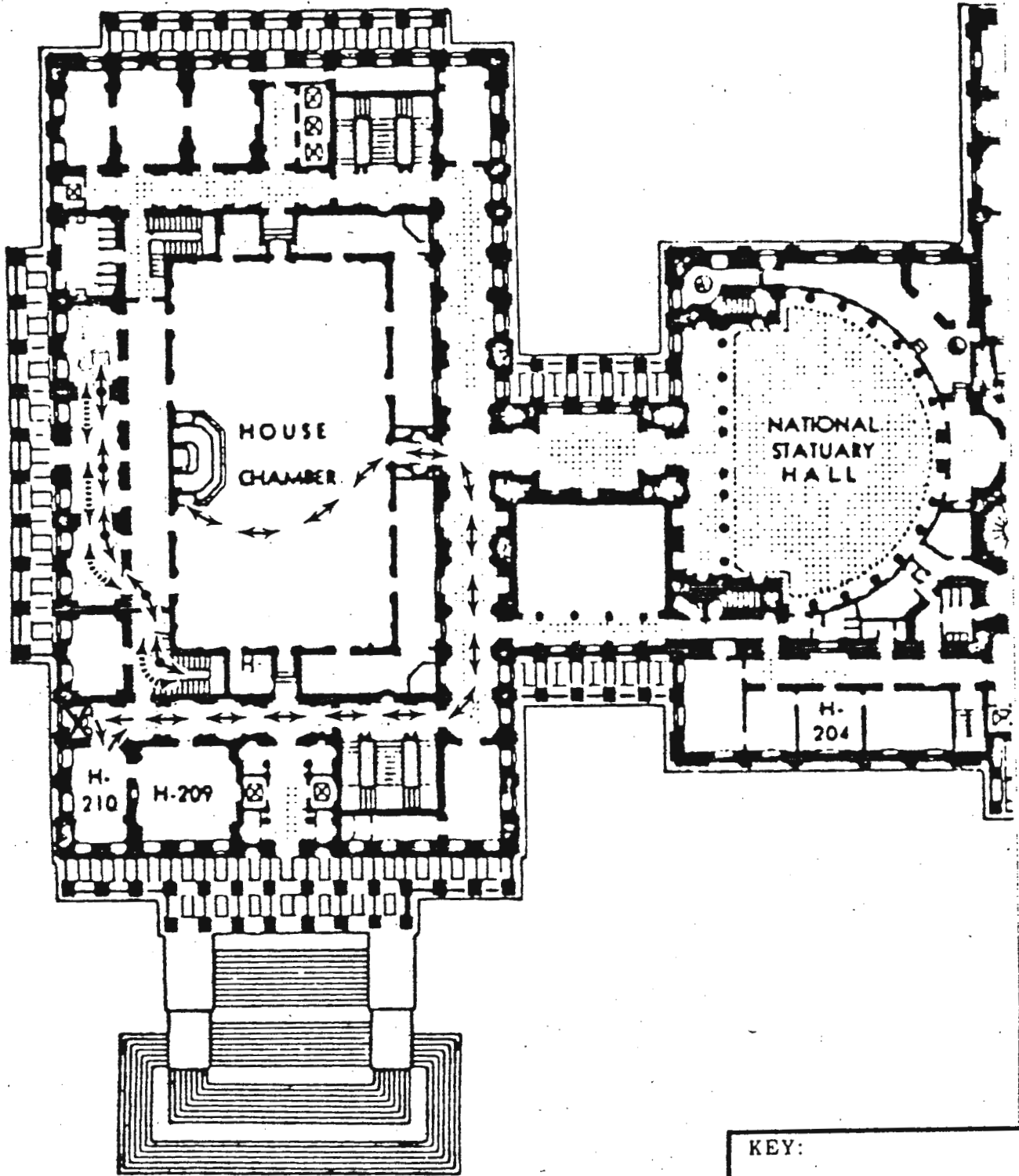
