I. PURPOSE

An off-the-record luncheon meeting with Arthur "Punch" O. Sulzberger who is the publisher of the <u>New York Times</u>. The Vice President will also attend the luncheon and is a good friend of Mr. Sulzberger.

II. BACKGROUND

The New York Times has been in the Sulzberger family since 1896. In 1963, Arthur O. Sulzberger took over the paper as president and publisher.

Mr. Sulzberger served in the Marine Corps on two different occasions, from 1944-46 and then again during the Korean War. He began his journalistic career as a cub reporter on the New York Times covering local stories. During his career, he undertook a variety of assignments including state news, various posts as a foreign correspondent, and assistant treasurer of the New York Times.

As chief executive of the New York Times, "Punch" Salzberger is credited with having made comprehensive changes in the organization of the publication. His first change was to unify the Sunday edition, which functioned as a separate entity, with the daily paper. He broadened the scope of the paper by expanding the coverage of areas such as religion, sports, science, the arts and women's news. The New York Times is one of the only publications which has a standard policy of publishing the complete texts of presidential addresses and press conferences, important legislation and important documents, such as the lengthy Warren Commission report. It is also one of the few publications which allows senior editors to "bump" advertising in order to obtain more space for news.

Mr. Sulzberger owes his nickname of "Punch" (which he has retained through the years) to his father. Upon his birth, the elder Mr. Sulzberger wrote and illustrated a book to celebrate the arrival of his son. In it, the father remarked that his son had "come to play the Punch to Judy's endless show," referring to his daughter Judith.


