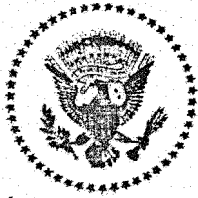

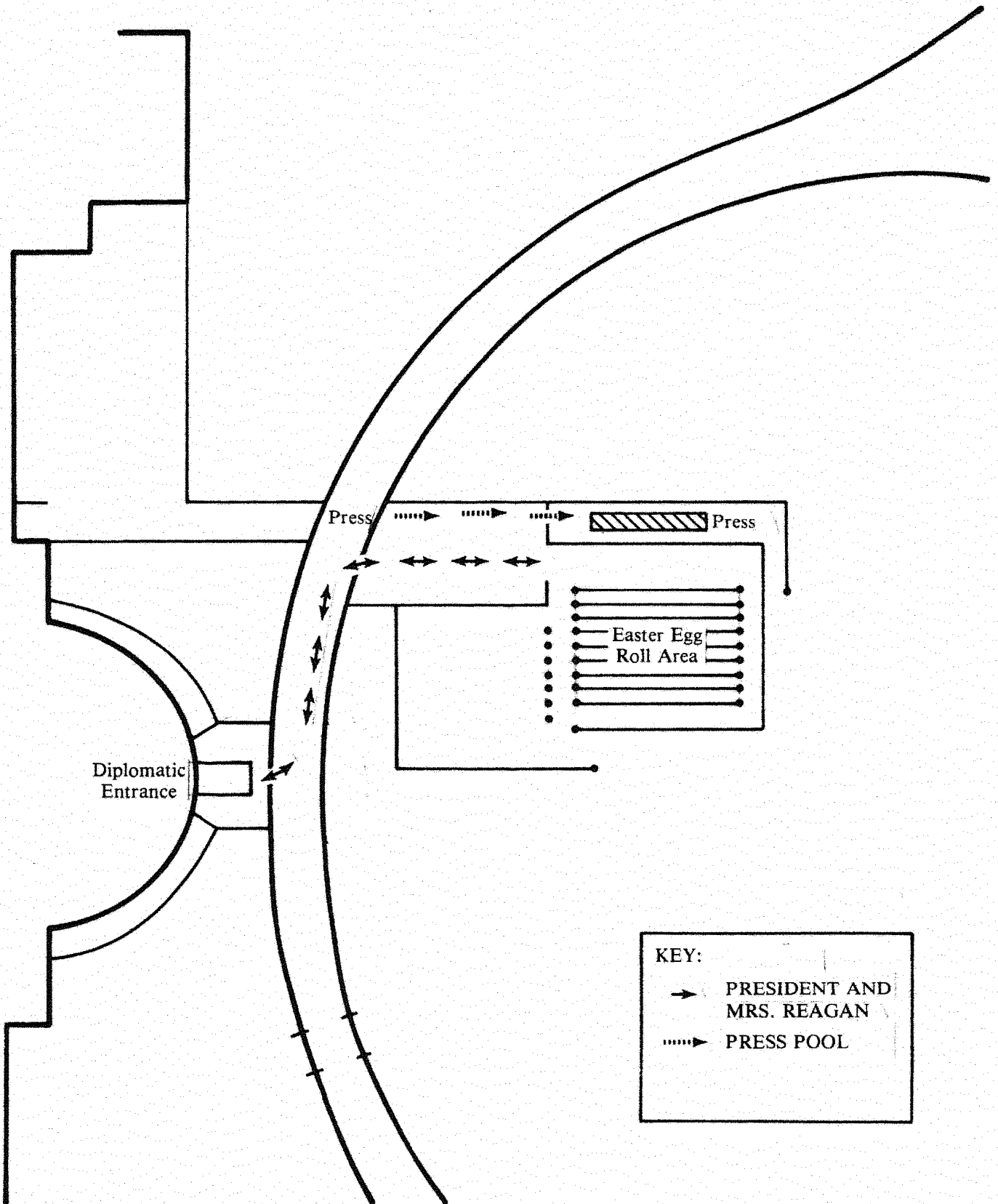

I. PURPOSE

A brief courtesy call at which you will be presented a "White Paper on Services and U.S. Trade Policy."

II. BACKGROUND

David Abshire, Director of the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), and Hank Greenberg, President of American International Group, Inc., have requested a meeting with you to discuss U.S. service industries and trade policy. U.S. service industries such as data processing, computer programming, banking, insurance, construction and travel, have grown dramatically in recent years and contribute substantially to U.S. economic growth, job creation, and exports.

Under the auspices of CSIS, Hank Greenberg chaired a panel of CEOs who produced a white paper on the importance of U.S. service exports and the need to reduce current barriers to trade in services.
