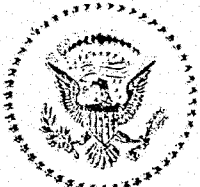

MEETING WITH WWII AMERICAN WOMEN POWS

I. PURPOSE

To recognize the contributions of these women POWs and to highlight the general contributions of women in the military.

II. BACKGROUND

These 31 women were among the 81 women taken prisoner in Bataan and Corregidor in 1942 when the Japanese completed their takeover of the Phillipines. During their incarceration, they continued their roles as hospital personnel (all but two were nurses) and cared for the ill and injured. When American troops liberated the Phillipines in February 1945, they found that all of the women had miraculously survived.

Having gone unrecognized for many years, these POWs have been brought together here in Washington for their first reunion since their Liberation Day in 1945 when they returned to the United States arriving at Bolling Air Force Base, Thursday, April 7. In addition to being recognized at the White House, these POWs are also being honored at the Pentagon and the Veterans Administration.

WORLD WAR II AMERICAN WOMEN POWS

TALKING POINTS

-- It is certainly an honor to have you all here today. I must add that having you here at the White House seems to be about 40 years overdue. It is surprising to me that your contributions and sacrifices for this great country of ours have not been acknowledged every year since your Liberation Day of April 7, 1945.

-- Time heals many wounds. I hope that now, so many years after you were imprisoned at Bataan and Corregidor that the horrors of war have faded in your memory. Your service and sacrifice is just another example of the contributions of women to the overall fabric of our society -- contributions that often go unrecognized. I know that I speak on behalf of all Americans when I say "thank you" for your efforts during World War II in preserving the freedoms and liberties that we all cherish.

-- I know that national ceremonies were held today at the Pentagon honoring and recognizing the sacrifices of our missing. In their honor, the POW/MIA flag flies today and tomorrow over the White House, the Pentagon, the State Department, and the Veterans Administration.

- As I greet you today, I am reminded of the sacrifices made by so many Americans down through the years as they served their country -- in times of war and in times of peace. America is not an aggressive nation. We do not seek to acquire more world real estate or to rule over others; however, there are those nations that do pursue such goals.

- There are aggressive nations in the world today, and it is vital that the United States has a national defense that will keep us secure from the attacks of aggressive nations.

- I am committed to attaining and maintaining whatever level of defense is needed to keep peace and prevent war and bloodshed. I am committed to assuring that our children and grandchildren will not only be able to live in peace and in security, but that they can also enjoy the freedom we Americans so cherish.
