I. PURPOSE

To discuss the strategic forces proposal (arms control/ Midgetman/MX) and encourage support and expeditious action by the House Appropriations Committee.

II. BACKGROUND

Pursuant to the requirement of the FY '83 Continuing Resolution, the President has forwarded to the Congress recommendations on the United States strategic forces, in particular, a basing plan for the deployment of the MX missile.

The Continuing Resolution provides for the introduction in the House and Senate of a concurrent resolution of approval which is to be referred to the respective Appropriations Committee. The Committees must report a resolution to their full body within 45 days after the introduction of the legislation. The 45-day period will expire June 3.

The Defense Appropriations Subcommittee conducted on May 3 hearings on the strategic forces package. Witnesses included Strategic Forces Commission Chairman General Brent Scowcroft and Secretary of Defense Weinberger.

The Subcommittee, whose Chairman, Congressman Joseph Addabbo (D-New York), is opposed to the President's strategic forces recommendation, will consider next week reporting a resolution of approval to the full Appropriations Committee. Administration's position will be advocated by ranking Subcommittee Republican, Congressman Jack Edwards of Alabama, the author of the resolution of approval in the House.

BACKGROUND (CONT'D)

Last December, during the lame duck session, the Defense Subcommittee approved MX funding by a one-vote margin. A subsequent effort to delete funds at the full Committee level failed on a tie vote. Ultimately, the full House dropped MX funding from the FY '83 Defense Appropriations bill.

None of the Appropriations Committee Members in attendance for this meeting have publicly opposed the strategic forces proposal. However, several are undecided, while the others are leaning in support or are totally committed. In order for the resolution of approval process to proceed, a clear majority of the House Appropriations Committee must support the strategic forces package.

10:00 - 10:05 (5 minutes)	Presidential remarks.
10:05 - 10:07 (2 minutes)	President calls on General Jerome F. O'Malley, Vice Chief of Staff, United States Air Force, for remarks on military aspects and commitment to the package.
10:07 - 10:10 (3 minutes)	President calls on Deputy Secretary of State Kenneth Dam for remarks on arms control aspect of the package.
10:10 - 10:40 (30 minutes)	President calls on Republican Congressman Jack Edwards of Alabama, ranking Member of the Defense Appropriations Subcommittee, for remarks and to open discussion.
10:40 - 10:45 (5 minutes)	President concludes meeting.

TALKING POINTS

- -- Thank you for taking time from your busy schedules to join me this morning. I have, as you know, endorsed the bipartisan Commission on Strategic Forces recommendations, including deploying 100 M-X Peacekeeper missiles in existing silos and commencing work on a small missile.
- -- I have strongly endorsed and urged the Congress to join me in supporting the Commission's recommendation to pursue arms control agreements that promote stability and move us toward a more stable ICBM structure.
- -- I therefore welcome the letter, sent by some of you, urging me to take the lead toward achieving long-term stabilization. It may not surprise you, but I believe that I have already taken this lead, and I have no intention of relinquishing it.
- -- We have already begun a careful examination of the points raised in the House and Senate letters. Our examination includes an interdepartmental review of how these recommendations can best be integrated into our overall arms control approach. These letters represent the kind of bipartisan spirit, which could lead to our common goals of effective deterrence and equitable arms control agreements.

- -- The central value of the bipartisan Commission's recommendations -- which Secretary Weinberger, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and the entire National Security Council, all joined me in supporting -- is its thoughtful integration of the relationship between specific modernization programs (like Peacekeeper), these programs collective role in assuring effective deterrence, and their significant role in promoting arms control.
- -- As we pursue our integrated approach, I welcome Congress' support of arms control agreements that are balanced, promote stability, constitute significant force reductions and are verifiable.
- -- To implement our integrated approach, I also need your support for the overall recommendations to include development and production of the Peacekeeper missile and its deployment in existing silos near Warren AFB, Wyoming. Our integrated package also includes development of a small, single-warhead missile.
- -- If the United States decides to forego the Peacekeeper missile, the Soviet Union would not have any real incentive to agree to reductions, and our deterrence posture would be weakened. Each of the four past administrations has made proposals that have become embroiled in partisan politics. Let's close ranks to move forward on both, thereby taking an essential bipartisan step toward promoting stability and ensuring our national security.
- -- I would like to ask General O'Malley and Acting Secretary Dam to say a few words.

I. PURPOSE

To respond to Senator Orrin Hatch's (R-Utah) request to bring Mrs. Barney Clark to the White House to meet the President.

BACKGROUND II.

On December 1, 1982, Dr. Barney Clark, of Des Moines, Washington, made medical history when he became the world's first human to receive a permanent artificial heart. This surgery was performed at the University of Utah Medical Center and represented more than a quarter of a century of research. As a result of this advancement in medicine, Dr. Clark lived for 112 days following the surgery. He overcame many setbacks along the way and provided an opportunity for doctors to learn a great deal from his experience with the artificial heart. The official cause of Dr. Clark's death was "circulatory collapse due to multiorgan system failure," but the heart itself was in good working order at his death, having beat nearly 13 million times.

Dr. Barney Clark prospered in his Seattle dentistry practice until his retirement five years ago. Barney and Una Loy Clark were married in 1944 and had three children: Dr. Stephen Kent Clark, a surgeon; another son, Gary, who works for a stereo corporation; and a daughter, Karen Shaffer. All three Clark children live in the Seattle area, as does Mrs. Clark.

Una Loy Clark is in Washington this week to testify before the Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee hearing on smoking prevention on Thursday, May 5. The Committee, which is chaired by Senator Hatch, has arranged for Mrs. Clark to be introduced early in the hearing so that she can come meet you. Unfortunately, Senator Hatch, who requested this meeting, may not be able to leave the hearing to escort Mrs. Clark to this meeting. However, Mrs. Clark will be accompanied by her daughter-in-law, Theresa Clark, and members of the Utah and Washington Congressional delegations.

You will recall that on March 24, 1983, you called Mrs. Clark to express your condolences on her husband's death.


