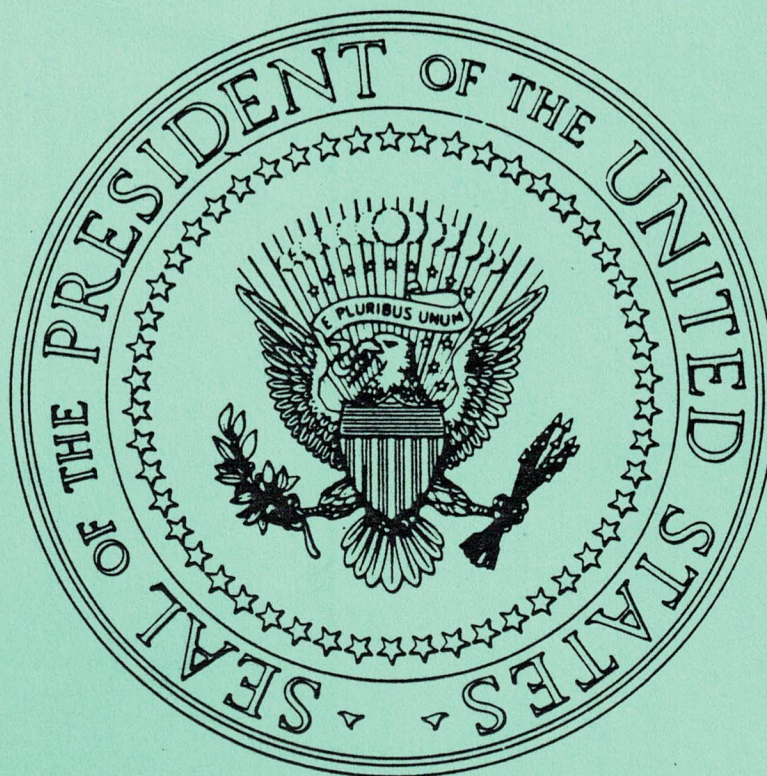

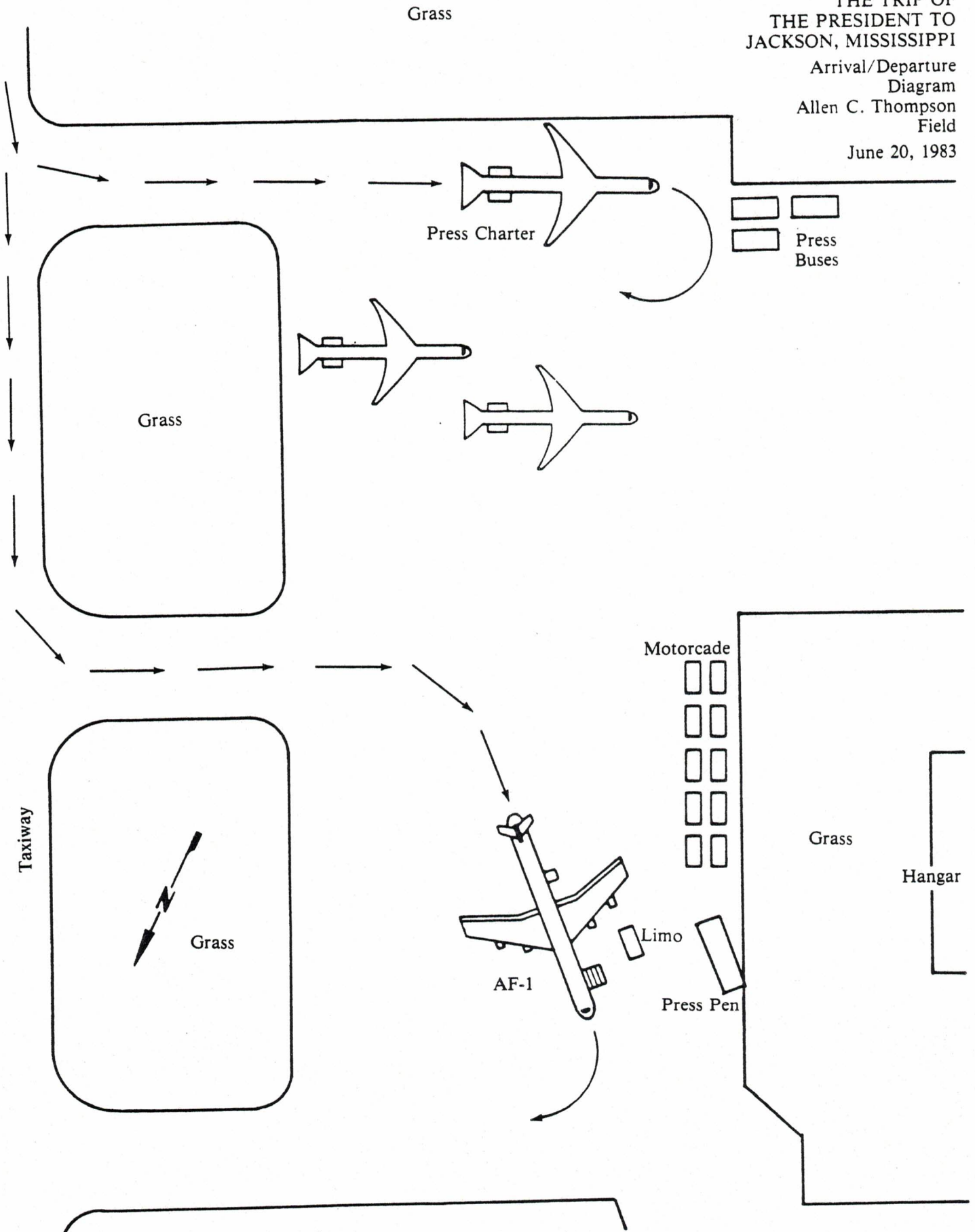

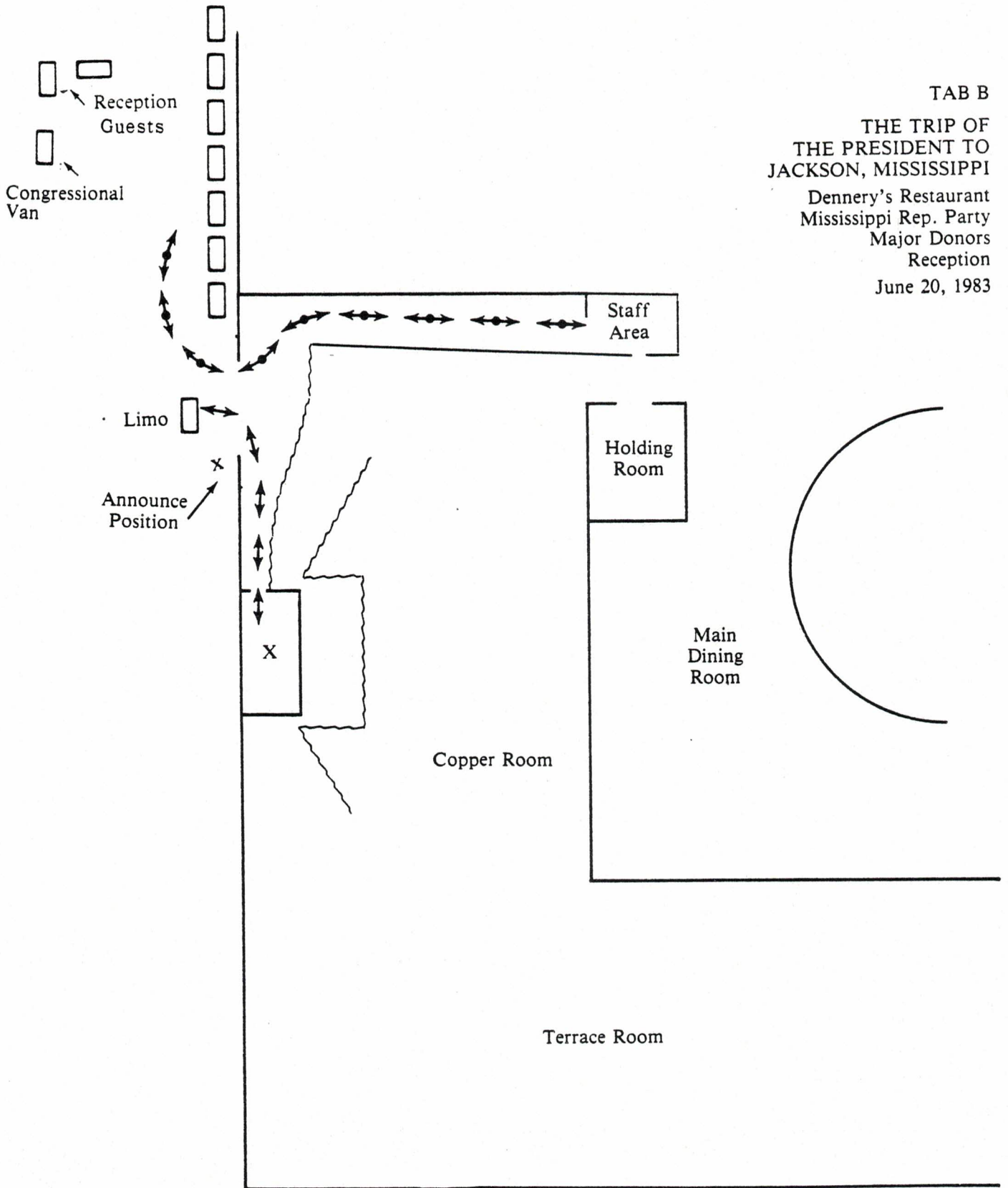
Arrival/Departure

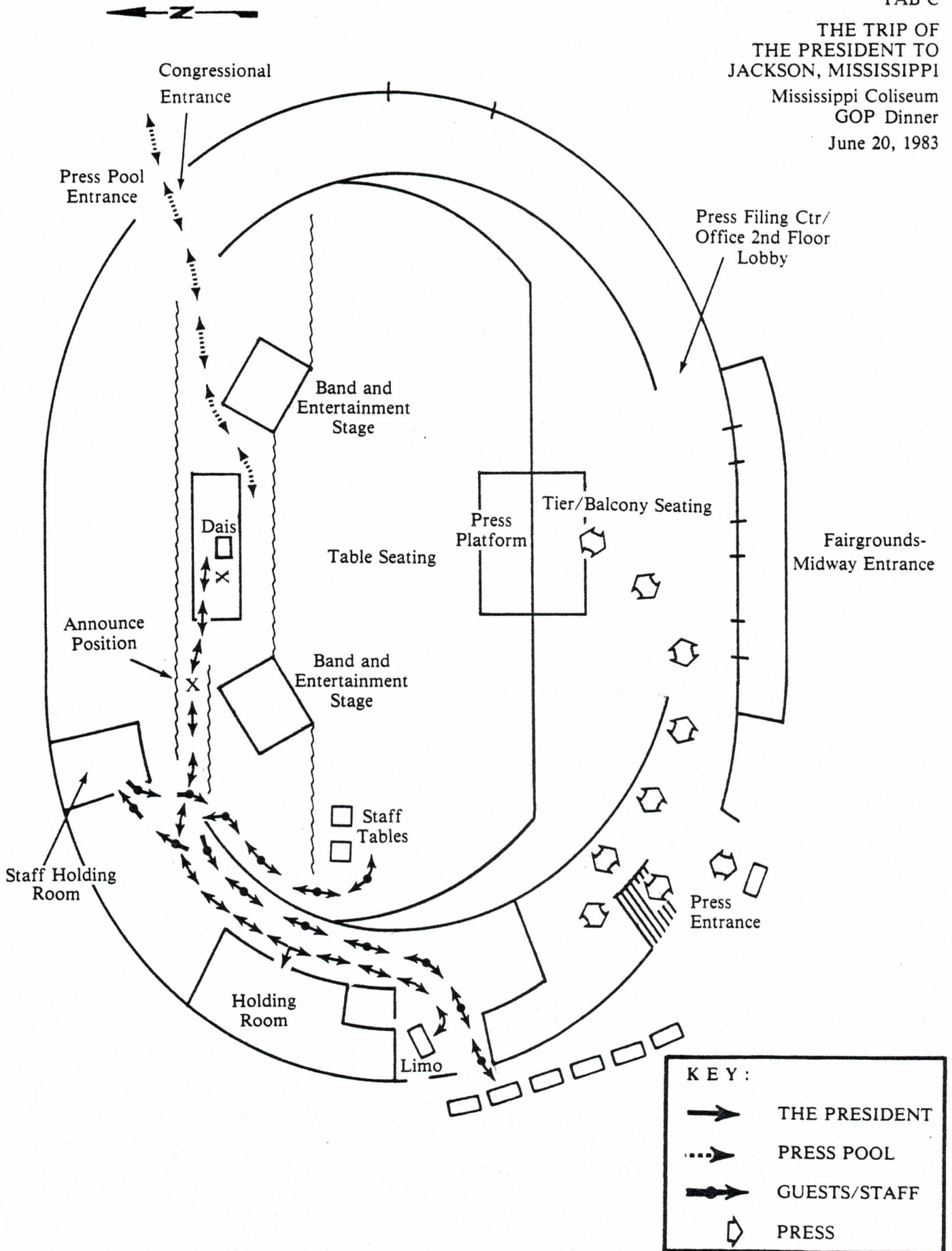
