To sign the Railroad Solvency Amendment of 1983 (H.R. 1646).

II. BACKGROUND

The Railroad Retirement Solvency Amendment of 1983 (H.R. 1646) has passed Congress and is now ready for your signature. This bill will prevent the drastic rail pension reductions that would otherwise have been necessary to save the system from insolvency. According to the Railroad Retirement Board's actuary, it will assure the solvency of the rail pension system at least until the end of the decade. This will be accomplished through real contributions and sacrifices on the part of all parties involved, and through Federal participation.
