I. PURPOSE:

To meet with a long time supporter from the black community who wishes to be helpful now and in the future.

II. BACKGROUND:

Reverend Hill is pastor of Mount Zion Missionary Baptist Church of Los Angeles. He campaigned extensively for the President in 1980, has maintained his support since that time. He is influential in the church community in both Los Angeles and the State of California.

In addition, he is Vice President of the National Baptist Convention U.S.A. and has offered advice and help in establishing a rapport with its leadership. The Convention has 5,000 member churches with a membership of seven million persons. Reverend Hill is also influential with the white conservative church leadership.

Reverend Hill met with the President when he was Governor and during the presidential campaign. He has not had the opportunity to meet with him since his election. He is a member of the President's Task Force on Private Sector Initiatives.
