I. PURPOSE

To discuss upcoming Presidential action on the Dairy and Tobacco Adjustment Act of 1983 (H.R. 3385).

II. BACKGROUND

On Friday, November 18, 1983 the Congress completed action on omnibus dairy and tobacco legislation (H.R. 3385). In its final form H.R. 3385 contains the following major provisions: (1) establishment of a new Federal price support program for dairy producers including a "paid diversion" mechanism under which producers would receive Federal payments for cutting back on production; (2) the requirement that the Secretary of Agriculture provide additional assistance to farmers and ranchers in drought-stricken areas; (3) adjustments of the domestic price support mechanism for tobacco, including a provision relaxing restrictions on non-farmer ownership of production allotments; and (4) authorization of a marketing order mechanism for eggs and poultry which produce commercial eggs.

H.R. 3385 has been received at the White House, and the President has until Saturday, December 3, 1983 to take final action.

H.R. 3385 has been exceedingly controversial within the Administration and on Capitol Hill--due almost entirely to the dairy program provisions. Given the possibility that this bill may not receive final Presidential approval, the purpose of this meeting is to give Congressmen and Senators on both sides of the issue an opportunity to make their arguments directly to the President.

## TALKING POINTS

- o I'm glad all of you could make it back to town for this meeting.
- o Because I must sign the dairy and tobacco bill within the week if it is to become law, I wanted to give you an opportunity to present the case for the bill.
- o I know that some of you have written and been in touch with the staff here to let us know how strongly you feel on this issue.
- o But frankly, I have a hard time working up any enthusiasm for creating a new multi-billion dollar program to pay dairy farmers not to produce.
- o That's a pretty tough pill to swallow, especially after we didn't even get the opportunity for a vote on the major budget savings we proposed, such as the target price freeze.
- o I am also concerned that this dairy bill will establish a precedent for the future farm bills of the coming session.
- o It is also not clear to me that we have seen the last of dairy bills.
- o Some of the good aspects of the bill, such as the price support reductions, are timed to occur at some pretty hot moments in the political season.
- o But as I said, the purpose of this meeting is to give you a chance to present the case in favor of letting this bill become law, so I've probably done too much talking already.
