Dear Morton:

I enjoyed our last meeting at your office and will look forward to the upcoming election with great interest.

You may recall that I indicated a desire to remain with BIFAD in some capacity beyond the term of my appointment which will end November 3,1983. It has been brought to my attention by the staff of BIFAD and my director Jiryis Oweis that I have made a valuable contribution to their work. They have indicated a willingness to keep me involved in the research I am conducting now if the administration supports my request for an extended term.

I personally feel that it is valuable to have someone loyal to the President in this position because it provides an excellent vantage point from which to evaluate development programs of all regional bureaus of A.I.D..
