*St. Louis*  
Veterans Organization Leaders

February 14, 1981

- In his announcement last week, the President listed Veterans Administration compensation and pension benefits were among the seven program areas where significant budgets cuts must not be made.
- Our overall economic situation, however, is grim. It was in the interest of the previous administration to make things appear as rosy as possible, but many things are much worse than most of us realized.
- In order for the government to be able to continue to meet its obligations to veterans, to afford an adequate national defense, and to provide for the other necessary functions of government, we must turn this country's economy around. That means a new era of restraint of government programs which burden productive taxpayers. That means fighting inflation by cutting government. To do that we need your help.
- Mr. Don Moran of the Office of Management and Budget will outline for you the problems now facing our economy. Then he will give you the parameters of the economic package which President Reagan will present to the nation next Wednesday.

As you know, the veterans organizations were supportive of the campaign last year. Because of delays and disagreement regarding the filling of the position of VA Administrator, there has developed a certain sense of uneasiness in the veterans groups about the Administration's policies towards veterans.

Bob Spanogle expressed for the entire group their personal support of the President and their relief at his rapid progress in recovering from his wound.

The veterans presented the attached letter to Mr. Meese from their respective National Commanders.

Gabby Hartnett expressed concern at the proposal to process veterans' claims at one (or three) central office(s) rather than adjudicate claims at the 57 regional offices as at present. He expressed the view that claims might now take six months to process.

Ed Meese pointed out that most claims are not processed in person by claimants and that it is largely now done by mail.

The veterans said they feel that OMB wants to vector the V.A. hospitals into the private sector.

Ed Meese said that the V.A. estimates quoted in the letter may be incorrect and that figures from within the bureaucracy are legitimately suspect. He said that the Administration proposes no cuts in V.A. medical personnel.

Cooper Holt said Don Moran at OMB has not talked to anyone at V.A. except Moran's own four people.

Mr. Meese pointed out that there are very large percentages of empty beds in V.A. hospitals. The veterans replied that one reason the beds are vacant is that there are not enough medical personnel to staff the wards.

The veterans said that the V.A. has economized better than the private sector hospitals. They said that 68 percent of V.A. patients have no medical insurance. Cooper Holt said 36 percent of V.A. patients have incomes less than \$2,000/year.

Mr. Meese said the goal of the President is to improve the quality of medical care afforded veterans, that the Administration is interested in moving the V.A. more in line with the Defense Department as a component of national defense. He said his own view was that the V.A. should report through a cabinet secretary, for better administrative control.

Bob Lyngh said, "We are for that."

Mr. Mecse said we will have the new V.A. administrator, whom we are close to picking, consult with the represented organizations as we develop veterans policy and programs. He promised to see that the questions raised in the veterans' letter were answered, by some of his own people as well as by OMB people. He closed by saying that the President, of all people, is not interested in slighting veterans.

Schneider will discuss the President's increases in the defense budget. We have asked Secretary Lehman to discuss the President's policy for military preparedness. Dave Sullivan was to address the President's arms control philosophy.

Bill Schneider, Secretary Lehman and Dave Sullivan all accepted, but now Sullivan would clearly be inappropriate.

These leaders whom we are briefing all have substantial networks which can be motivated to support actively the President's legislative program.

No doubt they have all read this morning's paper regarding Dave Sullivan's abrupt departure. We urgently need another well qualified Administration spokesman. Because I have had previous very successful dealings with Sven Kraemer, I would like to request that you designate him to give our meeting tomorrow a briefing on the President's arms control philosophy. If you prefer, his remarks will be off the record.

The President today announced his intention to nominate Charles Timothy Hagel to be Deputy Administrator of Veteran's Affairs.

Mr. Hagel is presently serving as Deputy Commissioner General of the 1982 World's Fair (Energy Expo '82) to be held in Knoxville, Tennessee. **PUBLIC TELEVISION LOOKS AT THE VIETNAM VETS  
EXPERIENCES THROUGH SPECIAL PROGRAMS ON VETERANS DAY**

WASHINGTON, D.C., September 28, 1981--Veterans Day, November 11, will be commemorated on public television with special programs on the experiences of the Vietnam War veteran.\* National radio personality Larry King will host two hours of documentaries and special reports about the veterans who came home to a less than enthusiastic nation.

"The Vietnam Veteran: A Matter of Life and Death Special," will be distributed nationally by the Public Broadcasting Service (PBS) at 9:00 p.m. (ET) on November 11.\* This special program combines two documentaries "Frank: A Portrait of a Vietnam Veteran" and "Warrior's Women" along with special reports on the black veteran and veterans who have found themselves in prison with "post traumatic stress disorders."

"Frank: A Portrait of a Vietnam Veteran," the first documentary presented during the evening, looks at the problems of the returning vet through the eyes of one, who today is a social worker living in Boston. Frank is a twice-wounded, often-decorated U.S. Navy river patrolman. Upon his return from Vietnam Frank found himself unable to reconnect with society. In a compelling and emotionally-charged recollection, Frank tells the story of the night he arrived back in the States and

his subsequent bouts with alcohol, drugs, a divorce, recurrent nightmares and occasional violent impulses.

The second documentary in the two-hour special is "Warrior's Women," a story of the women Vietnam veterans came home to. Four women speak candidly about the problems they faced and how their lives were affected. They also raise questions about society's neglect of the Vietnam veterans and the effect this will have on the next generation.

Black Americans made up a disproportionate share of foot soldiers in the Vietnam War. The next segment explores the impact of the returning Vietnam vet on the black community.

Another segment looks at the large number of vets who have ended up in prison.

"The Vietnam Veteran: A Matter of Life and Death Special," is a presentation of WGBH Boston and is funded through a grant by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) and public television stations.



SUBJECT: Background Meeting With Veterans Groups On 1983 Budget

On November 18 at 3 PM meeting was held between MCB, Bob Nimmo the VA Administrator, and Don Moran of OMB, and the leaders of twelve major veterans groups. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the impact of the 1983 budget on veterans, and give veterans the opportunity to ask questions and make suggestions before budget-making process is completed.

The following three key points were made by Nimmo & Moran:

1. The 1983 budget for the Veterans Administration would increase in dollar figures from the 1982 budget to nearly match inflation. The Administration is showing a special concern for veterans versus other groups. However, vets must realize need for cuts in all areas.
2. The number #1 priority of this Administration is to provide quality medical care for vets. Decision has been made not to have budget cuts impact on health of vets (Dept. Med. & Surgery).
3. Exact budgetary figures cannot be given at this time because of statutory prohibitions. Nevertheless, want input from vets in terms of budgetary priorities.

Veteran leaders made following points:

- Under Carter Administration, V.A. went from 5% to 3.4% of Federal budget. Reagan Administration much more responsive to vets needs.
- Concern expressed over what new initiatives V.A. making to help vets- housing and medical research.
- Concern expressed over impact of cuts in other programs on vets- Social Security, Unemployment etc.
- Concern expressed over potential changes in means test for medical services- counting of liquid assets.

Memo: Vets Meeting November 18,1981

The overall tone of this meeting was excellent. Veteran leaders continually compared responsiveness of this administration with that of Carter. They were pleased with positive impact Nimmo was having on budget process at OMB. In addition, leaders complimented Office of Public Liaison for work in facilitating communication between VA, OMB and veterans.
