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

As Peter Keisler mentioned to you last week, I have been giving some consideration to the feasibility of starting an independent student youth group.

One of the reasons I have been thinking along these lines is because I feel that there is a definite need for a pro-free enterprise, pro-political freedom (i.e. anti-communist) "spontaneous" movement in America. I believe a movement of this type could be an effective counter to Soviet propaganda efforts as well as an across-the-board aid to President Reagan and the conservative cause.

I am enclosing a report which outlines my opinions on this issue. Jack has read the report and he agrees with my conclusions in entirety. ## STATEMENT BY

Mr. Edward Leigh, British Director of the Coalition For Peace Through Security and Chairman of the British National Council For Civil Defense (which has over 60 parliamentary sponsors).

"I am as committed to real peace and to disarmament as the delegates of the Euro Peace Tour 82 but I believe that the only road to preserving both our peace and freedom is through multilateral, mutual, and verifiable disarmament not unilateral or one sided by the west first. Here are some questions that the press may want to ask the delegates.

\* However effective peace movements are in the west there is no likelihood or even remote possibility of them really being tolerated in the Soviet Union any more than free trade unions.

\* The British Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament (a sponsor of the tour) is committed to total unilateral disarmament by Britain and closure of U.S. bases. This will weaken NATO and embolden the Warsaw Pact.

\* The more successful the CND and their allies are, the more disinclined will be the Soviets to negotiate arms reductions or dismantlement of SS2Os already in place knowing that the European governments will be forced by political pressure to refuse deployment of cruise and pershing missles.

\* The Soviet Union has a 100% superiority in tactical nuclear weapons in Europe and a large superiority in conventional weapons. Any measure of unilateral disarmament may actually encourage the Soviet Union to wage a limited war in Europe.

\* Secretary General Luns of NATO said recently that the Soviet Union had spent tens of millions of dollars on funding European Peace Groups.

\* The Morning Star, Britain's Communist newspaper gives preferential advertising rates to the British CND and openly boasts that 20% of its national council are members of the Communist Party of Great Britain. And a number of CND officials have been receiving free trips to Moscow, expenses paid by the official Soviet Peace Groups which itself totally rejects unilateral disarmament by the Soviet Union.

\* Soviet diplomats have been expelled by Norway, Denmark, and Holland for funding the so-called Peace Groups.

BRITAIN'S fast-growing Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament is rapidly being taken over by the far Left, despite its general secretary's repeated claims that its leadership is broadly based.

Monsignor Bruce Kent, the CND's general secretary, insists that all political views are represented in the movement.

But my investigation shows the extreme Left are taking over in no uncertain way and using the CND for their own political ends. These are the facts :

A least seven CND leaders are either card-carrying Communists or sympathisers. Leading Communists have used CND platforms to attack U.S. militarism and the Thatcher Government, while praising Soviet 'peace making' initiatives.

Trotskyists are moving successfully to take over the CND Youth movement and use it as a recruiting ground for their revolutionary policies. The extremist Socialist Workers' Party has used public concern over Cruise missiles to launch CND branches in East Anglia where the weapons will be based and to build up its own membership.

CND officials with Communist leanings include : Sally Davison, a CP member who was national organiser until recently; Dr John Cox vicechairman and a CP member ; Duncan Rees, vice-chairman and a CP member; Ian

Star, but says he is outside the party.

The Communist Party of Great Britain, headed by its industrial organiser, Mr Mick Costello, has led a campaign at trade union conferences this year to win national union and branch affiliations to the CND.

Top Communists believe the success of their campaign to sell the CND to the unions

played a big part in the Labour Party Conference decision to support unilateral disarmament — Britain going it -alone in getting rid of nuclear weapons.

Government fears on the Left's takeover were expressed this week by Defence Minister Geoffrey Pattie who said : "The skill of the Communists and far Left lies in their ability to foster and support

movements which draw in large numbers of non-political people by playing on their legitimate anxieties.

'A straightforward "Make Britain Weaker" movement would get nowhere. But a CND movement designed to do exactly the same thing commands support because many people are so worried about the danger of war that they refuse to think through the consequences of their actions,' said Mr Pattie.

The CND provides expression for one of the deepest fears facing mankind today, nuclear obliteration.

But there are political forces at work which see the CND as the perfect medium for channelling mass discontent over the bomb threat into other issues, such as the destruction of capitalism. And to achieve this they are infiltrating at a steady rate of success.

# 'PEACE' VISITORS ARE BIG HIT VITH RUSSIANS

THE RED carpet was laid out for a party of 19 Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament sympathisers when they flew to Moscow as official guests of the

Soviet Peace Committee. For ten days the group were treated like foreign dignitaries, starting from the moment they bypassed customs on arrival.

At times, there was a police car heading their motor cavalcade, flashing warnings as they swept through traffic lights on red.

Each member of the party had to pay only his return air fare of around £190 at a special party rate.

Everything else was paid for by the Russians, includ-ing trips to the ballet and visits to Leningrad, Tashkent, and Samarkand.

Now that the party is back in Britain they have issued a five-page report of the visit. It is a remarkable docu-

ment.

It reveals that the CND sympathisers — all of them wanting Britain to scrap its entire nuclear weaponry-asked the Russians to make a ten per cent cut in their nuclear strength.

The Russians refused. Although most of the party are members of the CND, they did not travel under the CND banner.

"In Tashkent we were greeted on the tarmac by the local Orthodox Archbishop together with the representa-tives of the Peace Committee of Uzbekistan. "Imagine our surprise when

"This cavalcade, which became familiar on every journey in Uzbekistan, pro-ceeded with flashing blue lights to cross all the red traffic lights in our path."

Russian TV and radio gave the visit saturation coverage, the report says.

During the visit the group met "many eminent people in Soviet society . . . the only group we missed was the Jewish community."

One criticism made in the report was of the difficulty in meeting specialist bodies:

"Specialist groups or indiriduals concentrating on peace work are harder to find than in Britain.

In Moscow, the report says, Councillor Gerry Ross, from Hackney "made a long plea for nuclear-free zones and twinning with London".

#### Turnaround

The visitors had two meet-ings with the Soviet Peace Committee, the second session seeing the Russians refusing to approve a lengthy docu-ment produced by the visi-tors

"A major turnaround ensued when, with brilliant dexterity the one or two offending passages (one relating to a unilateral cut of ten per cent by the U.S.S.R. in its nuclear strength) were removed, and every other item was simply ticked 'agreed'. The invitation from Moscow was sent to "The Northern Friends Peace Board," a Quaker group set up in 1913. And the 19 people on the trip were selected by the board's full-time secretary, Mr Rowland Dale, who lives in Gledhow Wood Grove, Leeds. Leeds.

Leeds. He told me: "Everyone on the trip was loosely CND. They were all unilateralists, in favour of Britain getting rid of all her nuclear weapons. I am a firm believer in this. BRUCE KENT is a radical politician as well as a Roman Catholic priest in that order.

. .

He runs the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament (CND) as its full-time general secretary, having been the chairman up to November 1979. That June, he had marched to the Royal Navy's base at Faslane and incited sailors not to use nuclear weapons. Before that, he was also chairman of War on Want (an offshoot of leftwing Liberation) which was criticised by the Charity Commissioners for putting out Marxist propaganda.

Bruce Kent's philosophy is summarised in what he told an obscure meeting of socalled Religions for Peace in May 1980, as reported in the "Church Times" and "Catholic Herald". "The Churches are handicapped by profound anti-Communist feeling and profound nationalism at variance with Christian teaching", said this pro-Marxist monsignor whose name appears more often in the Communist press.

### An evil


This is doubletalk, for Marx and Lenin stated that Communism and Christianity were incompatible. The multiracial Catholic Church has been condemning Communism since 1846, when a papal encyclical called it "intrinsically evil".<sup>1</sup> Bruce Kent's espousal of revolution also defies the command of Pope John Paul II that priests should avoid politics (as laid down in Canon Law).

Rev Joseph Christie, the told London Jesuit. Broadcasting on 24 May that Bruce Kent knew nothing of worldly matters and should be preaching the Gospel. Several other clergymen have criticised him, while outraged layfolk have forced him out of meetings. Loyal members of Pro Fide may complain to Rome. because Cardinal Hume is took weak to curb him.

### Bureaucrat

This self-styled peacemaker has been increasingly influential during a clerical career that has always been in the limelight of central London. Born in 1929, he was no youth when he entered a seminary and he already had an MA when ordained in 1958.

As the Rev Bruce Kent, he was based at two Catholic churches in Kensington until 1964, by which time he was also inside the diocesan



bureaucracy. As a Monsignor, he then became briefly a privvate secretary to the then Archbishop of Westminster. Ironically, the late Cardinal Heenan loathed Communism — having seen Stalin's Russia. Then he visited British troops in Korea by way of Hiroshima.

Heenan makes no comment on the nuclear deterrent in his autobiography, but he did brand Labour leftwingers as "Communist in all but name". These are the very people with whom this one time assistant is now televised, shouting "Vote Labour": Michael Foot, Tony Benn, and their like.

Bruce Kent has cultivated moulders of opinion since the mid-sixties, when he bacame a chaplain at the University of London. At one stage, he was also chaplain to the Guild of Catholic Journalists — which may have helped him become an adviser on religious broadcasting.

### Soviet praise

in 1970 he wrote a shoddy pamphlet on peace, in which he crossed swords even with St Augustine and St Thomas Aquinas. For, while residing at 111 Gower Street, he got involved with Pax Christi. Most Catholics distrust or ignore this Roman-sounding pacifist movement, which is actually open to all. Pax Christi demonstrated against NATO outside Wesminster Abbey in May 1979 and it was billed bang next to the Communist Party among backers of CND's massmeeting on 26th October 1980. "Izvestia" recently praised Pax Christi.

After being its chaplain in the mid-seventies, Bruce Kent went to St Aloysius, Church almost opposite Euston Station. Here, in October 1978, he opened One World Bookshop, whose pseudointernationalism had been condemned as far back as 1920 by Pope Benedict XII. Its shelves were full of revolutionary literature about central America and southern

Africa just before Namibia and El Salvador hit the headlines.

Contributing to a Penguin book last year. Bruce Kent praised the godless revolutionary, Saul Alinsky, as well as Julius Nyerere whose dictatorship bankrupted Tanzania.

### Agitprop

So he is no simple soul yearning for peace and quiet. Nor has Bruce Kent a parish, for he is merely "also in residence" beside St John's Church at 39 Duncan Terrace, Islington. But he broadcasts just like the prewar peace-priest in America called Father Coughlin, who derided Allied defence until he was caught out copying Goebbels word for word. Bruce Kent called the new President Reagan "simplistic" only days after "Pravda" did!

His entire activity fits exactly into the pattern of Communist agitprop, unmasked in the papal encyclical of 1937 known as Divini Redemptoris. Also entitled "Atheistic Communism"<sup>1</sup> it warned: "nobody, who desires to save Christian civilization from extinction, should render it assistance in any enterprise whatever".

Bruce Kent had to admit working with Communists on 27 July after the Daily "Daily Telegraph" disclosed that a quarter of CND's council were in the CPGB. Significantly, he evaded an accusation that Communists completely controlled the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament. Nor did he mention being on the council Nuclear of European Disarmament (END), a separate supposedly with campaign, Edward and Thompson other Marxists.

Bruce Kent denied getting money from the World Peace Council (WPC), which he admitted was a Soviet front. But he cabled congratulations to its meeting in Bulgaria in September 1980. When

leftwinger James Lamond MP became a vice-president. Bruce Kent echoed the WPC's line on the BBC World Service on 15 May, when he said NATO was "preparing for annihilation". He had already attacked Cruise missiles during a broadcast from East Berlin on 17 December 1980.

December 1980. Yet in "The Guardian" of 10 December 1979 he had praised Brezhnev's bogus offer to withdraw some troops from Europe (just before the invasion of Afghanistan). This was in a letter signed by Bruch Kent, Jack Jones, Alan Sapper, Alf Lomas MEP, James Lamond MP and other so-called progressives.

By contrast, in the Morning Star" of 8 "Morning Star" of 8 November 1980 he lambasted Reagan and the Christian fundamentalists behind him. These happen to include Catholics lobbying against abortion which (both in the USA and UK) outnumber all wartime casualties this century. Bruce Kent ignores this holocaust and calls pro-Lifers here "irrelevant", while working in CND with such campaigners for abortion as Jo Richardson MP and Renee Short MP.

Bruce Kent is also a sponsor (with other pro-Marxist CND Clergymen) of Christian Action, whose journal knocks law and order. Its issue of autumn 1979 condoned homosexuality and scoffed at Sodom and Gomorrah which suffered something like atomic annihilation for their sins.

#### Gimmicks

Never does Bruce Kent repeat the lesson of the scriptures that war is the wrath of God. Nor does he mention the work of the Devil. Instead he hints at direct action to get "a very different world", as in the March issue of "New Internationalist" published by Oxfam and Christian Aid. He also suggested here erecting dummy shelters as a gimmick in churchyards.

Bruce Kent also omits, along with his clerical title and collar, the most apocalyptic factor of all for a genuine Catholic. That is Fatima<sup>2</sup> whose millions of pilgrims for peace for outnumber CND's demonstrators.

The Vatican believes that the Virgin Mary appeared there in 1917, when thousands of people testified to seeing something "brighter than the sun" long before the atom was split. The apparition told three Portuguese children that Russia would rebel and might wreck the world. Lucia, now an old nun, said then that she had seen Hell — which the scriptures mention 17 times.

scriptures mention 17 times. "We are not working on the Bible, Das Kapital or Magna Carta", said Mgr Bruce Kent MA to the World Disarmament Campaign in April 1980.

On an '80s Issue, a '50s Tactic Is Embittering the Debate

Can it be that the nuclear freeze—that uppity, leaderless movement—is going to take us back to the days of McCarthyism? Will we hear its advocates called "unwitting handmaidens of the Communist Party" the wonderful epithet that the senator flung at the Senate elders who recommended his censure?

San arrange

The freeze inovement is still comparatively young and its sponsors' lists groan with heavy establishment names—Billy Graham, Averell Harriman, Cardinal John Krol of Philadelphia, to name a few—but already the word is out that they are doing Moscow's work.

We will shortly be observing the 25th anniversary of the death of Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy, who gave his name to an effawhen opposition to official policy guaranteed slurs on patriotism. You'll find an echo of that time in a piece of literature being circulated at freeze meetings.

"The Soviet Union Needs You!" readsthe white-on-black headline. Beneath a picture of soldiers marching in Red Square legend reads, "Support a U.S. Nuclear

It is published by the College Republican National Committee and is meant primarily for distribution on college campuses, where, interestingly enough, the younger brothers and sisters of Vietnam protesters are casting a cold eye on the freeze and joining pro-nuke forces.

Says College Republican National Committee Chairman Jack Abramoff, a recent graduate of Brandeis and future Georgetown law student: "We want to shock them out of an irrational and emotional reaction. To wake up students, we find it necessary to come out with a bold stroke.

"We don't say that everyone involved in this is a communist. But they are supporting the Kremlin line."

Twenty-two House Republicans signed the Markey-Conte freeze resolution, among them John LeBoutillier (N.Y.), a brash, conservative freshman of whom the College Republican National Committee expected better things.

"We intend to confront him," says Abramoff. While the literature is aimed at students, several copies showed up at a turbulent-Capitol Hill press conference where touring representatives of the European peace movement ran into hostile questioning by spectators masquerading as reporters. Abramoff was one

"Why don't you talk about Afghanistan? Why don't you talk about Poland? What about yellow rain?" they were asked repeat

edly.

"I have never seen such crude arrogance; we met nothing like it elsewhere," said one member of the delegation, the Rev. Volkmar Deile, head of the West German Action-Reconciliation organization.

The College Republicans have made it a priority to stop the freeze movement among their contemporaries. They zeroed in on the Europeace tour, sent out truth squads at every stop, put up their "The Soviet Union Needs You!" posters, and made sure that the freeze proponents were asked if they were "unilateral disarmers."

That is how the administration really regards the proponents, even though the resolution they support calls for a "mutual, verifiable" freeze on U.S. and Soviet arsenals.

Signs of panic are evident in the administration as the freeze fever mounts. President Reagan was so distressed by a popular call for a halt in the arms race that he went so far as to say the Soviets have "a definite margin of superiority," a claim contested by Democratic huwks and members of his own Cabinet.

Secretary of State Alexander M. Haig Jr., in a speech touted by Reagan as the last word on nuclear policy, once again said that a freeze at current levels "would perpetuate ... an unequal military balance ... and reward a decade of unilateral Soviet buildup."

Haig complained that the administration policy had been "caricatured as a policy of building up arms in order to reduce them." He then gave details proving that the caricature is, in fact, the policy—"by maintain-

ing the military balance and sustaining deterrence, we protect the essential values of western civilization."

Some Republicans believe that the freeze movement is a fad that crossed the ocean from a continent of pacifists, neutralists and pinkos-and, they hope, no more durable than Northern Ireland's peace move: ment. But polls show that 72 percent of the American people are in favor of the freeze movement. It has no Abbie Hoffmans to madden blue-collars. Its modest, swamped national organization portrays it in television commercials as a mainstream, grassroots kind of thing: Members of Congress have been flooded with mail-Rep. Michael D. Barnes (D-Md.) has received more letters on this topic than on all other subjects combined. At home in their districts. they stumble over city councils rushing to pass resolutions supporting the freeze.

You can't call an entire country subversive. You can call the freeze movement a commie front if you want to, but that, means that three-quarters of the American public are "unwitting handmaidens." Even the College Republicans may not want to go that far. Response to "U.S.-EuroPeace Tour '82" Coordinated by The Coalition For Peace Through Security in conjunction with the College Republican National Committee

Although we became aware that a European "Peace" Tour would be taking place more than a month in advance, the information regarding their actual activities and schedules was not received until there was less than three weeks to prepare.

In the first week of March we received our information packet from John Rees regarding the U.S. Europeace Tour 1982. This information was the first major step towards countering the so called "peace" leaders. This packet included a list of 37 cities the Europeans would be attacking as well as their local coordinators in each of those cities. It also provided us with information regarding the individuals coming to the U.S. and their sponsoring organizations here, American Friends Services Committee and Clergy and Laity Concerned. This information proved to be substantially correct and of invaluable assistance.

The next step was to inform as many people as possible of the situation we were being confronted with, the danger involved and how they could help.

The first mailing was the lead article, written by Lori Merryman, for the College Republican National Committee newsletter, <u>CR Report</u>. This newsletter reaches over 15,000 CR's nationwide and served primarily as a warning of what was yet to come and how to contact us if they spotted any activity on their campus.

Next, a more detailed report of the "Europeace Tour" was mailed to 500 CR leaders across the country. This included information on the cities we knew they would be in and how to contact us to begin organizing opposition.

We adopted a Youth For Multilateral Disarmament flyer to the U.S. nuclear disarmament situation and had it blown up into a 17"x22" poster. As well as being distributed to colleges nationwide, it was also distributed on Capitol Hill and printed in the Washington Inquirer. The poster became so well known that in a speech supporting a nuclear freeze, Congressman Edward J. Markey(MA) called the poster an "affront to their integrity".(See Congressional Record, March 30, 1982)

We also wrote and printed a one page flyer entitled "Peace at What Price" attacking the European pacifists for sympathizing with the Soviet Union. This was distributed at their speaking engagements along with a brochure on "yellow rain" provided by Amy Moritz and the National Center For Public Policy Research. This brochure on chemical warfare proved to be an effective counter offensive weapon.

We were also able to provide our local organizers with tough and embarassing questions for the Europeans. They found it particularly difficult to respond to several questions regarding communist links with the European "peace" movement. In particular, a question regarding why the CND received discount advertising from The Morning Star (the communist newspaper of Great Britain) proved to be most embarrasing.

Of the 37 cities we had information on we were able to make contacts in 29 of them. Of those 29 cities we were able to effectively counter the Europeans in 21 of them. A list of those cities and a brief explanation of the counter action taken follows:

- Denver, CO Radio call in show 60% of questioners were our people. Anna Grinyer did not know how to respond to Communist allegationssaid she had "never read The Morning Star.
- Salt Lake City, UT small crowd at gathering of Brigham Young Universityposters and literature distributed-no press-poorly received.
- Eugene, OR Without any enticement, Grinyer complained of a "smear campaign" of CND going on in the U.S. After questioning on <u>Morning Star</u>, she went into a tyrade for several minutes.
- Tampa, FL We had several protestors distributing literature and posters-asked tough questions. YAF state chairman, David Finzer, got several minutes of radio time and subsequent requests for interviews. Response included a letter from someone complaining "yellow rain" brochure was a piece of "insidious and dangerous, anti-Soviet propoganda."
- Atlanta, GA 30 protestors at Georgia Tech University distributed literature &carried signs including "KGB Go Home". CR state chairman, Ralph Reed, got several minutes of radio time.
- Syracuse, NY Several questioners at press conference carried the tone of the conference - received no local press.
- Rochester, NY Several protestors distributed literature and asked questions at public forum. Tough time responding to questions, particularly on Morning Star.
- Boston, MA Several protestors and one T.V. station ignoring them. Kent became infuriated at allegations printed on literature being distributed and confronted our leading organizer, Ian Ballon. Kent and Ballon got into a shouting mstch that was covered on the evening news-showing discontent of students with the so called "peace" movement.
- Ann Arbor, MI Several protestors distributing literature through crowd. No press.
- St Louis, MO 10-15 protestors distribute literature and ask questions at public meeting. Difficulty responding to Communist allegations. No press.
- Lincoln, NE CR club chairman, Steve Grasz, held a press conference on campus denouncing the Europeans who were coming and claiming communist allegations. Received phone calls at CRNC from 2 newspapers wanting more info. Received favorable press.
- Hartford, CT Several protestors distributed literature and asked questions at public meeting. CR organizor, Paul Erickson, received more than equal time on local news coverage.

Baltimore, MD - CR's, organized by state chairman Cynthia Aiello, protested

at two events. Europeans became frustrated by continued harrassment and refused to answer questions. Although there was a lot of media covering the events they received no press.

- Washington, DC Press conference at the capitol was the last event of the tour. We were continually called on for questions and 90% of the questioners were hostile to Europeans. They finally cut the press conference short. Received minimal television coverage on one station.
- Pittsburgh, PA several protestors distributed flyers and posters. This was the first stop for Edward Leigh and Leonard Holihan shocking Bruce Kent his primary opponents in Britain were on his trail in the U.S. Covered by one television stating it was a "small lecture that was not well received."
- Philidelphia, PA "Peace leaders" were catalyst for an "Interfaith Peace Witness" involving 15,000 people. Our 25 protestors were able to get television time on all three network affiliates as well as being mentioned in the Philadelphia newspaper.

In many of the cities as well as in four cities we did not have organized protestors (Burlington, VT; Providence, RI; New Haven, CT; Portland, OR) special efforts were made in contacting the media. This included sending out press packets to the media and following up with phone calls. The press was quite interested in what we had to say, particularly in the case of Edward Leigh, a conservative European.

While we were very pleased with what we were able to accomplish, a lack of time and funds prohibited us from doing anymore. In areas where we did not counter the Europeans they were generally well received.

As well as The Coalition For Peace Through Security and the College Republican National Committee; Young Americans For Freedom, Young Republicans, Teenage Republicans and several local conservative religious organizations were quite useful in the help they provided.

## CAMPAIGN FOR NUCLEAR DISARMAMENT COLLEGE REPUBLICAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE "WHITE PAPER" PREPARED BY: PETER NASSETTA

The Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament (CND) is a left wing European based organization actively promoting <u>unilateral</u> nuclear disarmament for Britain. CND boasts of a membership of over 35,000--anincrease of more than 11 times their size in January 1981. Membership applications are coming in at a rate of 300-400 a week and at least 25% of CND leadership are self proclaimed Communist Party members.

CND has called for unilateral (<u>one-sided</u>) nuclear disarmament in Britain including the removal of U.S. nuclear weapons based in the United Kingdom. While one-sided disarmament is quite an extremist response to the present nuclear arms situation, amazingly 42% of the people in the U.K. now support such a policy.

CND argues that war is inevitable as long as nuclear weapons are in existence. In addition, they state the following reasons for their policy objectives: 1) Unilateral disarmament would reduce the risk of war as well as remove Britain as a nuclear target; 2) a nuclear free Europe would be a stable Europe and 3) if the West disarms, then the Soviets might also.

These arguments carry little weight with a rational mind and the case against them explains the reality of the situation.

Clearly, nuclear weapons have changed the nature of warfare. However,war has not occurred in Europe for 36 years, a record for this century, and during all that time the West has had nuclear weapons. Not being in possession of nuclear weapons does not remove the threat of nuclear attack. Japan had no nuclear weapons in 1945. Britain will never be removed as a nuclear target for the Soviets because of British military and political importance.

A nuclear free Europe would not be a more stable Europe. This type of thinking completely ignores the Warsaw Pacts military superiority in conventional weapons. In fact, the presence of nuclear weapons in Europe has restrained the aggressive use of Soviet forces.

Multilateral disarmament would be nice but the Soviets have never allowed positive verification to be certain they are abiding by an agreement. Furthermore, the Soviets have no reason to even negotiate if they think the West is disarming anyway. <u>Unilateral disarmament is</u> <u>a step backwards</u> from true arms reduction, not a step towards it.

Though their arguments are weak, CND has become a powerful force in Europe. The British Labour Party has taken a strong unilateralist position. The phenomenal growth of CND over the past year has forced the ruling Conservative Party to constantly remain on the defensive.

The astonishing success of CND in Britain has encouraged these extremists to move beyond their own borders. In late March, 25 of CND's top organizers will begin a heavily funded campaign in the United States in an attempt to rally support for American unilateral disarmament.

CND has targeted 150 American colleges and universities to hold teach-ins and stage rallies in support of unilateral disarmament. These extreme leftists hope this will be the issue to bring back the radicalism that covered American campuses in the 1960's. Where El Salvador and nuclear energy have failed, the left hopes unilateralism will exploit the concern of young people and cause a radical resurgence of the Vietnam era.

The entire anti-nuclear, "peace" campaign in the United States is already planning and organizing for a major demonstration at the U.N. on June 12, 1982. When CND arrives they will attempt to be a catalyst in the efforts of these far left, so called "peace" organizations.

"A war is just if it is...in the cause of Socialism and Communism"6 "We should remember Lenin's words, that in our society, everything which serves to build up Communism is moral." 7

"Communists do not conceal that the <u>elimination of the rotten Capitalist</u> <u>system and the building of Socialism</u> on a worldwide scale is their ultimate goal." 9



# **CRs Celebrate 90 Years**

More than 300 college Republican leaders from across the country gathered in the nation's capital recently to celebrate 90 years of service to the Republican Party and their country.

Vice President George Bush was on the guest list, which also included Reps. # **High Frontier: New National Strategy?**

It's called High Frontier. It's a new national strategy. And it gives President Reagan the opportunity—in one bold stroke—to: 1) slam shut the window of U.S. military vulnerability; 2) fast-thaw the nuclear movement; and 3) greatly limit the damage from any Soviet first-strike attack.

The President can accomplish all this within five years using existing technology, at a total cost to the taxpayer of only \$10 billion a year.

Headed by the former Defense Intelligence Agency Chief Daniel Graham, a team of defense and space technology officials drew the blueprint for a "High Frontier" shield against a Russian nuclear attack. High Frontier would rely on a multi-layered series of cheap, simple devices to filter out "at least 95 percent" of a Soviet first-strike launch, according to Graham and his staff of

# **How High Frontier Works**

1. A Soviet missile arcs out of a silo aimed at the United States or Western Europe.

2. An American satellite tracks the missile using radar and computes its trajectory.

3. A small, non-nuclear explosive is launched at the Soviet missile. As the intercepting weapon nears the missile, it implodes, somewhat like a grenade, into several hundred explosives. Given the high speed at which missiles move, even an ice cube would cause enough impact to destroy an ICBM. Some of the explosives hit the missile.

4. The Russian attack missile is zapped in outer space.

more than 20 experts. These devices include:

 Orbiting non-nuclear satellites that intercept Soviet missiles as they come off their pads into outer space;

2) Ground-based anti-missile systems that defend against missiles which manage to leak through the double-wave of satellite defenses;  And, civil defense measures to protect population centers from the small number of missiles that might reach their targets.

The High Frontier system could be constructed using the space shuttle and other existing technology over a five year period. No laser beam lead times, no Star Wars assumptions. (cont. on page 4)

# Got Five Minutes-Do Your Income Tax!

Imagine being able to graduate from college and enter an economy with a top marginal tax rate of only 19 percent. Imagine a world free of bracket creep, marriage penalties and high interest rates. Imagine being able to fill out your income tax form in less than five minutes.

This is the kind of economy the flat rate income tax movement aims to deliver for all working Americans and college students preparing to enter the job market.

A flat rate tax would do two things: it would eliminate almost all deductions and exemptions that largely benefit the rich. It would also, in one bold stroke, result in the most significant tax rate cut since President Reagan's tax cut package passed last year. It would create a simple tax system, reduce the income tax return form to the size of a post card and create a single low tax rate for every American worker.

The flat rate tax movement has picked up a great deal of steam during the last several months, surprising political leaders and commentators alike. Six bills have already been introduced in Congress, the most significant sponsored by Republican Reps. Phil Crane (III.), Ron Paul (Texas), and George Hansen (Idaho).

The legislative action is not solely the work of Republicans or supplysiders. Bills have also been introduced by Democratic Rep. Leon Panetta (Calif.) and Sen. Dennis DeConcini (Ariz.). President Reagan recently said the flat rate tax was "a very tempting thing" and promised further study of the issue. Both the Treasury Department and the Office of Management and Budget are preparing thorough studies for the President.

The College Republican National Committee (CRNC) has recently set up an independent foundation, the Washington Research Foundation (WRF), to work full time on the flat rate tax. The WRF has published a 32-page study of the issue, a thorough review available for those interested in learning more about the idea. A button bearing the slogan "Cut Taxes to a Flat Rate" has been printed by the CRNC and is now available for distribution.

The CRNC is also working closely with the Heritage Foundation and former Treasury officials Paul Craig Roberts and Dr. Norman Ture to prepare flat rate tax legislation that would revolutionize American fiscal policy.

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# Reaganomics

As the campaign season heats up, college Republicans will frequently be coming under attack from liberal opponents on the issue of "Reaganomics."

It is therefore fortunate that, as school opens for the year, *Reaganomics*, by Bruce Bartlett, which was published after the 1980 elections, is now available in paperback. Bartlett was on the staff of Congressman Jack Kemp, and works with the Joint Economic Committee. Bartlett is one of the most significant spokesmen for supply-side economics in America.

Reaganomics is not a tedious review of obscure economic theories. Instead, Bartlett has written a concise, brilliant review of the historical success of marginal tax rate reduction, both in the United States and around the world.

He devotes chapters to the success of tax cuts in West Germany, Japan, Puerto Rico, and in the United States during the Mellon tax cuts of the 1920s. A fascinating section is dedicated to the Kennedy tax cut of 1964, which closely resembled the Reagan tax cut, and led to unprecedented economic growth in the 1960s, a sharp drop in minority unemployment and a reduced federal budget deficit within three years. The powerful, invaluable evidence provided in *Reaganomics* leads the reader to one conclusion: the success of the tax reduction in generating economic growth and job opportunities is historically irrefutable.

Armed with Bartlett's *Reaganomics*, college Republicans defending the Reagan program will be unbeatable on campus. They will be able to effectively demonstrate that every significant marginal tax rate cut in history has made the economy strong and healthy again. And they will be able to pose the question to their opponents: "Can you show me a single tax cut that, given time to work, did not create jobs and unprecedented economic growth?" The truth, as Bartlett points out, is there is only one answer for President Reagan's critics—no.

Armed with High Frontier, plus supporting assessments from a number of government agencies which have confirmed its concept, President Reagan has the secret weapon needed to undercut the nuclear freeze crusade. High Frontier would add nothing to the country's offensive arsenal and thus render the whole disarmament debate moot.

Replacement of the deterrence strategy with a doctrine of Assured Survival would not only free up U.S. military and foreign policy planning, it might turn the grassroots nuclear freeze movement inside out.

Much ado has been made about the small town voters in Vermont and marchers in New York who supported a "verifiable, mutual freeze." When polled, however, the same people admitted that the Soviet Union could not be trusted to participate. What people seem to be saying, then, is that they want a fresh alternative to the current nuclear debate.


