MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

Subject: The Federal Role In Education

Introduction

The tenth amendment to the U. S. Constitution reserves to the States and the people the responsibility for education. We thus have 50 separate statewide education systems, eight territorial education systems, and many private schools, colleges, and universities. The Federal role in education must, therefore, specifically take cognizance of the fact that education is fundamentally a State, local, and private responsibility.

In this context, this memorandum describes the components of a role which could, and we believe should, constructively be performed at the Federal level. It also describes what, in our opinion, should not be done at the Federal level. The proposal significantly reduces the scope of the Federal role from what has been the recent practice. We seek your approval of and comments on this approach as a basis for considering the appropriate organization of Federal education activities and proposing further reforms in legislation, regulations, and budget priorities.

The best way to summarize the impact of this new definition of the Federal role as proposed by the Department is to quote the following from Mandate for Leadership published by the Heritage Foundation:

"As the Department of Education divests itself of some of its administrative responsibilities, there will be a substantial reduction in personnel, as well as a reduced Federal presence in our schools. But this need not mean that the Federal role in education must be passive or that the Government should abandon its legitimate concerns about the quality of American education. Rather, the Federal Government will be freed to pursue a far more effective role in helping our schools and colleges improve their performance. This should be the basis on which the Secretary of Education explains his policy of reducing his Department's controls over American education."

The Foundation also noted more specifically:

"There are three types of educational activity in which Federal participation is desirable. They have been eclipsed in recent years by the Government's increasing involvement in the process of grant administration, but could be revitalized to give substance to a new Federal role in education. They are: a) information gathering and dissemination; b) consultation and technical assistance in dealing with on-site teaching problems; and c) educational research and development."

Restrictions on the Federal Role

Any description of the Federal role in education ought to be carefully circumscribed by a description as to the limits and bounds of the Federal responsibility. The following should definitely be considered outside of the Federal role:

1. The Federal Government should not direct, control, or supervise the curriculum or instructional program of State, local, or private educational institutions.

2. The Federal Government should not prescribe teaching methods, textbooks, or content of instruction, nor exercise control over them.

Appropriate Federal Activities?

The following activities, however, deserve serious consideration for inclusion in a Federal role. Each would, of course, be constrained by the restrictions outlined above. In addition, the description of each role contains some restrictions

on the way in which that role should be carried out. A valid Federal role, if not conducted appropriately, may seem to be an inappropriate role. This memorandum seeks to separate consideration of the role, per se, from mistakes that may have been made in the way that role was conducted in the past.

1. Data Gathering and Analysis

A center for gathering data on the condition of American education is needed in order to discern trends and directions and to help point out gaps to both educators and consumers of education. Recognizing this need, in 1866 the 39th Congress established a Department of Education "for the purpose of collecting such statistics and facts as shall show the condition and progress of education in the several States and territories and of diffusing such information respecting the organization and management of schools and school systems and methods of teaching as shall aid the people of the United States in the establishment and maintenance of efficient school systems and otherwise promote the cause of education throughout the country."

More recently, in the early 1950's the National Council for Chief State School Officers issued a call for uniform reporting categories for all State and territorial school systems so that data could be aggregated at the Federal level to provide a picture of the condition of education both within and across the various States and territories. This call resulted in the publication of A Common Core of State Educational Information in 1953. This publication has been up-

dated annually since then and provides the basis for nationally comparable statistics on education.

Data on the country as a whole cannot be compiled by the individual States and would not be comparable if done on a State-by-State basis. Moreover, as the Heritage Foundation noted, parents need information on schools and school systems in order to be effective consumers. Frequently such information is not available (or would not be meaningful) at the State or local level -- for example, trends in the plans beyond high school for graduating seniors -- and can only be obtained and analyzed at the Federal level.

Thirty percent of the population of the United States is involved in education as a full-time "occupation" -- either as students or as employees. This figure includes persons involved in both public and private education from kindergarten through graduate school. With these vast numbers of citizens involved in the American education enterprise, there should be an informed source for constructive criticism to point out deficiencies in this enterprise. This role is a logical extension of the data gathering and analysis function discussed above, as is the role of an advocate for education that can articulate the interrelationships between education and other parts of our society.

However, in carrying out this role, care must be taken to see that the requested data is widely useful and that its collection imposes as little administrative burden as possible.

Moreover in any analysis of the data, care must be taken to represent the public interest, rather than specific constituencies such as teacher lobbies. And use of the data by States and localities, as well as by independent researchers, to undertake their own analyses of various components of the education enterprise and draw their own inferences on the condition of education should be encouraged.

2. Promoting Productivity and Security

To promote an efficient and productive economy, maintain the nation's competitive position vis-a-vis other countries, enhance our national security, and improve the health and well-being of our people, it is necessary to support a basic and applied research capability in our major academic institutions. Support for research and the maintenance of research capability has long been provided by Federal Departments and agencies such as the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Defense, and the National Science Foundation.

For example, the National Institutes of Health in HHS supported basic research in the functioning of dog and whale

hearts in the hope that such understanding could eventually have a direct applicability to human medicine. From that research, discoveries led to new techniques for open heart surgery and the development of pacemakers, which have substantially prolonged the productive lives of many people.

Similarly, research on the electrochemical process of the mind have led to new techniques in brain surgery and have great promise for future discoveries in how people learn which could potentially revolutionize teaching techniques at every level of education.

With declining discretionary funds available from Federal Departments and agencies as well as from other sources, there has been increasing concern in recent years about the capability of our universities to support the type of research necessary to facilitate future technological and intellectual discoveries and enhance our social, economic, and national security. Academic institutions are finding it increasingly difficult to maintain modern research plants and to attract young scholars into basic and applied research.

Comment:

3. Research, Demonstration, and Improvement

There is a need for better research in American education. This research should concentrate on finding ways to teach more effectively, and to foster quality in an education enterprise that lacks discipline and vigor. Research should also concentrate on increasing the efficiency and productivity of schools, and finding ways to yield better results for the two hundred billion dollars spent each year on education in the United States. We need to develop more effective ways to measure learning and accomplishment in education. Research could explore ways for these measures to be used to provide incentives and reward excellence in teaching and learning, as well as other approaches to enhancing student and teacher motivation. Concepts that bring the ideas of free enterprise into education should be developed, tested, and evaluated, including merit pay plans, voucher plans, tuition tax credits, and other competitive and free-choice concepts.

Emerging technologies, some long-discussed and now spreading rapidly, offer another challenge for research and leadership. New horizons are opening up in information storage, retrieval, and communication which require students to become familiar with the use of computers and other electronic technologies. For example, computer card catalogues and bibliographic reference systems are now used in many libraries, enabling students with the necessary know-how to search effectively for references through a far larger volume of literature. Minicomputers and videotape equipment are being bought by

many households. Uses of teletext for delivery of information through the home TV set are being explored in the U.S. and, more extensively, in other countries. "Intelligent videodiscs," which combine minicomputers and random access TV, are being used by industry and could have considerable potential for education. One school in four already is using computers for instruction. Research to help schools identify the impact of such technologies for education, to guard against harmful effects, and to find ways to use them constructively to enhance learning will be important.

Educational research has developed many useful products to improve education. For example, a National Institute of Education publication, Research Within Reach, which summarizes the results of research on teaching children to read in terms that classroom teachers can understand and use, has been distributed to reading teachers throughout the country. Another NIE-supported project, the Beginning Teacher Evaluation Study, is helping many elementary school teachers of mathematics and reading to manage their classrooms so as to increase the time students spend actually learning.

Federal support for research and development can focus this kind of expertise on deficiencies in the quality and productivity in education. It can address problems that are common nationwide, and get the maximum pay-back from spreading the results throughout the country. Problems that are sparsely scattered or of low-incidence within a State or locality -- such as finding ways to meet the needs of the severely handi-

capped or the gifted and talented -- can also be assisted by federally supported research, as can opportunities requiring a national market, such as developing closed-captioning to print dialog as text on TV screens for the deaf. A research agenda should be developed with guidance from those who are responsible for education at the State and local levels, and should be designed to be responsive to the needs of practitioners. In addition, the Federal Government can assist States and localities to share educational knowledge and to identify and share effective educational practices with each other so that each can learn from the mistakes and successes of the others.

4. Strengthening and Increasing Capacities

There are deficiencies in American education that are nationwide in scope, including widespread declines in reading comprehension, writing skills, and knowledge of mathematics, and science. Many young people have inadequate career development skills, and many adults lack the basic education needed to learn and keep up-to-date occupation-specific training. These problems undermine the ability of Americans to participate

effectively as citizens, to help defend the nation, to earn their living, to increase the productivity of the economy, and generally to contribute to family and community life. They also contribute to the demand on Federal and State social services and welfare programs. Thus, there is a legitimate national interest in encouraging and providing limited assistance to State, local, and private bodies to carry out their responsibilities to meet the educational needs of Americans.

Certain population groups in the United States with special needs have been particularly undereducated in the past. These have included children from poor families, social and ethnic minorities, and the handicapped. In recent years, the academically gifted also have been neglected in many public schools. Helping these groups with special needs has been a particular focus of Federal education programs; helping to strengthen the capacities of State, local, and private entities to meet their special educational needs should be a continuing Federal concern in the future.

Decisions on whether the Federal Government ought to provide funds to help remedy these nationwide deficiencies in American education should be contingent on the following criteria:

1. the seriousness of the deficiency for the nation or target population;
2. a determination that failure to assist would result in the problem continuing because of State and local inability to take action;

3. the probability that the problem could be solved through Federal funds; and
4. a conclusion that it is in the national interest to allocate scarce resources for this purpose when the need has been weighed against other demands for Federal funds.

Past Federal efforts to attack these deficiencies in education or to serve special target populations have resulted in disruptive interference with the State, local, and private educational entities. Narrow categorical programs were enacted, with numerous subcategories and process requirements detailed in the statutes. Multitudinous rules and regulations specified further requirements. These provisions could not accommodate the variety of conditions found in different States and communities, or jibe with the wide variety of State laws and financial assistance programs. As a result they distorted State and local priorities, intervened in the choice of curriculum, and placed onerous and excessive burdens on State, local, and private educational agencies and institutions.

When Federal financial assistance is justified, funds should be allocated in block grants that give wide latitude to harmonize Federal monies with funds appropriated from State and local sources. There must be recognition of State and local responsibility, and there should be no Federal control. State and local education agencies should decide how to more adequately serve the target populations that are the object of Federal concern. State plans ought to demonstrate perfor-

mance accountability to the State's electorate. While the Federal government should not exercise control and direction, it should play a role of constructive review and comment on State intent, and should be prepared to provide expert assistance to States and localities, including consulting and other services which the States and localities might wish to buy with their funds. The Federal Government should also monitor use of block grant funds so that the Congress and Executive Branch can be informed as to the results of Federal laws. These are the principles behind our proposed Elementary and Secondary Education Consolidation Act of 1981.

5. Assisting Students With Limited Finances

Many students in the United States who are talented and academically able have not had sufficient funds to attend colleges or vocational institutes. On the Federal level, financial aid to higher education should be concentrated on aid to students rather than aid to institutions. Students should be helped to help themselves. Thus, the aid should be mainly in the form of work-study programs, other aid conditioned on prior work, and loans rather than simple handouts

and should place minimum reliance on Federal grants. (If some emphasis or incentive could be placed on links to the military strength and economic well-being of the nation, a two-fold purpose could be served. For example, high school graduates who enlist in the military for two years followed by four years of service in the Reserves could receive generous G.I. Bill benefits to attend college or receive occupational training. Another option would be to review Federal tax and other policies in order to encourage businesses to pay for education as well as job-specific training for their employees.) Any Federal grants should go only to assist students who can contribute to our economy and security and whose financial condition is such that they need some aid in addition to work and loans in order to be able to attend college.

6. Administration of Federal Laws

American education has been both assisted and obstructed by legislation enacted by Congress. If the role described above were to guide future Congressional action, we could avoid well-meaning but nevertheless obstructive legislation

that puts the Federal Government into an unnecessarily intrusive role vis-a-vis the States and localities. A case in point is P.L. 94-142, the Education of the Handicapped Act. While providing funds to assist States and localities with the extra costs of meeting the needs of their handicapped students, it also prescribes in excessive detail the manner in which these needs should be met. Details of that nature are best left to the people at levels of government most sensitive to the particular circumstances of their localities. The Federal role should recognize the vast diversity and tradition of autonomy in the American educational system.

In addition to Congress, the Federal courts have become deeply involved in educational practice and policy. At times the basis for litigation is the Constitution, but more frequently it is Federal statutes and companion rules and regulations that stimulate legal action. In some instances, action is initiated to test how far the courts will go in interpreting Federal statutes and regulations, with results that sometimes go well beyond the intent of either the Executive or Legislative branch. An example would be the California case where the court ruled that a school district had an obligation to provide psychotherapy to a handicapped student as a "related service" in order to permit the student to receive educational services in the "least restrictive environment feasible". Action should be taken to review basic education and civil rights statutes and their resultant interpretive rules and regulations. This review should be

conducted with a view both to eliminating unwarranted and unnecessary intrusion by the Federal Government and to clarifying the limits to which Legislative and Executive branch interpretation of the statutes and regulations extend. In particular, the regulations should focus on the objectives to be achieved, and not get bogged down in detailed prescription of the ways in which to achieve them.

But Federal requirements will remain. The Constitution, the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and many statutes demand Federal Executive attention. After Federal laws and regulations have been reviewed, there will still be a Federal administrative role of considerable magnitude. In exercising this role, the Federal Government should assume a leadership posture vis-a-vis the States and localities rather than a coercive one. The threat of Federal funding termination for States and localities in non-compliance with Federal statutes is essentially too drastic a response, and, for that reason, is rarely invoked. A more positive approach should be explored, such as encouraging States and Local Education Agencies to establish their own complaint procedures for aggrieved beneficiaries of educational services. This approach would not remove the Federal Government from enforcement of education and civil rights laws, but would make local and State complaint resolution followed by court action the first recourse in individual cases, and focus Federal attention on the broader patterns of meeting Federal Constitutional and legislated objectives.

Should an approach to administration of Federal laws which starts with State and local review and thereby minimizes direct Federal intervention be a component of the Federal role in education?

SUBJECT: Proposed "Foundation" Bill for Education Department

I gather from various sources that the decision on the "Foundation" bill is still substantially up in the air.

As I mentioned in my memo yesterday to you on the subject there will be considerable unrest among the President's supporters on this bill, and it is virtually certain that such a bill will not pass.

Under the circumstances, I think it might be useful if you would bring my memo to the attention of Jim Baker before a final decision is made about including the "Foundation" in the State of the Union message tonight.

MEMORANDUM - DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

FROM: SUSAN PHILLIPS, DIRECTOR, RESEARCH AND PUBLICATIONS

Little improvement was made during FY 81 in stopping the flow of Federal tax dollars to groups who actively lobby for increases in public spending and increased Federal control in Education. The National Organization for Women Legal Defense and Education Fund, which supports Federally supported affirmative action programs in the schools and Federal intervention in local school spending decisions (for example, they feel that schools should not be allowed to spend any more money on athletic programs for boys than they do on girls' programs), has received more money from the Department of Education since President Reagan took office in January, than they did in the last year of the Carter Presidency. (\$105,577 on September 18, 1981 and \$330, 281 on June 30 from the Women's Educational Equity Program.)

Planned Parenthood, whose official policy is that parents are not routinely notified when their minor children receive birth control or abortions, received an August 1, 1981 grant of \$328,390 under the Handicap Research and Demonstration Model Centers program.

The American Friends Service Committee which is part of the Coalition for a New Foreign and Military Policy (an anti-defense lobby), received a June 30, 1981 grant of \$149,553.

Operation PUSH - EXCEL, despite Jesse Jackson's constant attacks on the Administration and, according to news reports, unfavorable comments in a Commerce Department inspection of their accounting system, received \$656,664 on September 30, 1981.

Other grant recipients include the Federation of Southern Coops (\$23,656.00 on 09/25/81), LULAC (\$2,427,600.00 on 05/31/81), the Feminist Press (\$64,635.00 on 07/02/81 and \$249,589.00 on 07/30/81), the National Council on the Aging (\$38,620.00 on 08/31/81), the United States Student Association (\$107,630.00 on 07/31/81), and the Mexican American Legal Defense and Education Fund (\$215,945.00 on 06/25/81).

Organized labor also benefitted from grants from the Department. The United Automobile Workers received \$214,812 on January 30, The Institute for Labor Education - \$195,368 on July 15, Working Women- \$155,314 on April 27, from the the Fund for the Improvement of Post Secondary Education.
