RED FLAGS:

1. Conservative organization leaders feel that tinkering with the Balanced Budget Tax Limitation Amendment, which apparently has been suggested by Secretary Haig, will so complicate the matter as to make it difficult to generate the grass roots enthusiasm needed to pass the amendment.

2. Unless the issue of tuition tax credits is separated from the controversy over the "Bob Jones University wording" of the tax exempt status bill, this bill will be thoroughly defeated due to conservative as well as liberal opposition.

MISCELLANEOUS:

Conservative support of the President's proposed amendment for voluntary school prayer runs wide and deep. If the wording is appropriate, there will be a massive grass roots crusade on this issue.

SUMMARY:

Rose Garden ceremony where the President announced his support of a voluntary prayer in school amendment to the Constitution. In the negotiations leading up to this announcement, we lost the battle to issue the text of the President's proposed amendment but it is likely that we won the war. The background paper and questions and answers paper which were distributed at the meeting were enthusiastically received by the school prayer supporters in attendance.

The language of the amendment is virtually certain now because of the lucid and detailed explanation contained in the materials distributed at the Rose Garden to the media and guests.

This issue, if we promptly announce an appropriately worded amendment, will be the source of immense organizing efforts by pro-prayer groups. More mail will probably go out on this topic in the next several weeks than in any previous public policy contest since the Panama Canal fight.

Virtually all of the foes of this proposed amendment from the religious ... community will be people who:

Already oppose virtually every Reagan Administration initiative.
 Are diametrically opposed to the opinions on this issue of the overwhelming majority of their grass roots congregations.
