Interview with Walter Shapiro of the Washington Post Sunday Magazine on pro-life activists in the Reagan Administration.

RED FLAGS

Conservative grapevine aflame with outraged rumors that Dave Stockman is about to be replaced by Dave Carlucci who was opposed by the Kitchen Cabinet for his current job and who is perceived by movement conservatives as a mortal enemy.

Also circulating is story that Ambassador Malone will be replaced at the increasingly controversial Law of the Sea Conference by a former Cy Vance underling named Ridgeway who would, with Chief Counsel Leigh Ratner, take us to the cleaners.

Continued lack of action and failure to give even enthusiastic lip service to the President's prevailing expressed positions on the social issues is weakening grass-roots effort available for 1982 elections.

MISCELLANEOUS

Major effort afoot by conservatives in behalf of Sam Hart's nomination. They accuse Hart's opponents of fierce prejudice against conservative blacks.

SUBJECT: OPL Activity Report (February 1-15)

I. ISSUE UPDATES

Voting Rights Act: Hispanic organizations urging the Administration to either support the House bill or take a walk. Little support will be forthcoming on an Administration alternative.

NAACP Legislative Mobilization: Scheduled for March 9, in an effort to lobby Congress on the Voting Rights Act, budget cuts, federal court limitations, tax exempt status, affirmative action, jobs and tuition tax credits.

New Federalism: Early reaction from business is cautious but supportive. Early opposition from big oil and gas royalty owners has been successfully turned around.

Budget Cuts: The business community will be well organized and as enthusiastic for budget cutting as in 1981; still very upset over large deficit.

Small Business: Good progress made on Presidential message to Congress on small business proposals. Plans for major Presidential event in late February. Hispanic flare-up over Mike Cardenas firing has subsided.

Clean Air Act: Business continuing full-court press to pass Clean Air Act. Working with co-sponsors on H.R. 5252. Passage prospects looking better.

Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA): Broad interpretation of this law may cripple OPL and damage Administration relations with the entire private sector. Tom Boggs, Bill Timmons, ASAE, and business government relations departments are prepared to assist the Administration in changing FACA.

Tax Policy: Business community is divided on Reagan revenue enhancement. Primary concern is that minimum corporate tax will undo virtually all ACRS gains.



Education: Serious concern among educators regarding sudden withdrawal of Pell grants. Conservatives irked that the President is abandoning his pledge to abolish Department of Education. They consider the "foundation" bill a sure loser, assuming ultimate continuation of the status quo.

IRS: IRS movement to tax corporation PACs has conservative PAC community disturbed.

Israel: Many favorable responses to United States veto against Jordanian resolution calling for sanctions against Israel for its actions on Golan Heights. Growing concern regarding Weinberger trip and "tilt" toward Arabs.

Agriculture: Overall agriculture situation is worsening; correspondence indicates farmers are beginning to look to the Administration for some type of relief. Growing fears of possible grain embargo and our policy on marketing orders.

Housing Industry: Continuing bad economic news causing strains with National Forest Products Association, National Association of Realtors, and National Association of Home Builders. These groups may propose subsidized mortgage programs; charges that this Administration is "anti-housing".

Viet Nam Memorial: Kudos to H. Ross Perot, who engineered a meeting between opposing factions which resulted in changes in the design of the memorial and diffusion of controversy.

HHS Regulations on Birth Control: Most pro-family groups are pleased at proposed HHS regulations requiring parental notification when contraceptive devices are dispensed by prescription. Opposition is led by Henry Waxman and Pat Schroeder, with assistance from AMA and other medical organizations.

Made two speeches on citizen political involvement before large student gatherings at Liberty Baptist College, Lynchburg, Virginia.

Spoke at National Prayer breakfast for Israel sponsored by Ed McAteer's Religious Roundtable.

Chaired OPL briefing by Don Moran for veterans and defense groups.

RED FLAGS

Broad support from conservative and evangelistic communities of Sam Hart's nomination for civil rights commissioner. Hart supporters believe opposition to him is based on liberals' fierce determination to veto appointment of any conservative blacks.

Foes of education department are contemptuous of Administration's "foundation" bill which they know will not pass.

Conservatives hopeful that Administration will back some version of Hobbs Act change which will force liberal Democrats to "vote for union violence."

MISCELLANEOUS

Efforts are afoot within pro-life movement to reach a unifying compromise on legislative strategy.

While we have followed Roosevelt's 1930's model by keeping the issue initiative, we have not rallied our troops as he did by focusing in on any targeted opposition.

RED FLAGS

Published leak raised suspicion among conservative groups that the President is abandoning his pledge to abolish Education department. They consider "foundation" bill abominable and sure to lose, resulting in continuation of awful status quo.

Reports that IRS is moving to tax corporate PACs has conservative PAC community disturbed. In conversations this move is linked with provisions in Justice Department endorsed criminal code reform bill which would remove Hatch Act protection against political organizations of federal employees.

Pro-defense community very disappointed over renewed possibility that former Javits staffer Winslow Wheeler may get legislative relations job at Arms Control Disarmament Agency. (ACDA)
