#### WHY YOU SHOULD OPPOSE THE FOR MEMORIAL:

- 1.FDR would have. In response to a question from Supreme Court Justice Black, Roosevelt once said that he only wanted as a monument "something that would be no larger than his desk." We already have such a monument, located at the southeast corner of 9th and Pennsylvania Avenue NW on the northside of the National Archives Building.
- 2.It's a boondoggle. It will cost \$30 million to build and more than \$1 million a year to operate.

#### STATUS OF THE FOR MEMORIAL:

H.J. Res. 400, which appropriated the funds for the FDR memorial, was passed by the Senate earlier. It recieved House passage last Thursday. It has now gone to the President. Within the next ten days, he will make the critical decision of whether or not to sign or veto the bill.
