Lyn tells me you are aware that this pending proposal has become a matter of increasing concern among conservative leaders. It is a shame the system has not yet gotten you a copy of it.



Re: Evangelical/Pro-Family Meeting for Budget Cut Support

Last week when representatives of the Family Policy Advisory Board met with the President, I mentioned to him an idea, of which this memo is, at your request, an elaboration.

The evangelical/pro-family movement would probably be willing to support the President's proposed budget cuts, if asked. However, they have not been asked yet. I recommend strongly that a particularized overture be made to ask for their support.

Why is a special overture needed? When we speak of leaders of the religious revival (which overlaps but is not co-terminous with the "evangelical right"), we are speaking of people with full agendas and hectic schedules. Many are people who do not ordinarily think in political or policy terms, and who do not hear political conversations. Many are green to politics; thus, in all candor, it would not occur to them to realize how they could be helpful. Some of them retain ancestral shyness from politics; some are skeptical of giving their support. Most of them are of sufficient stature in their own circles that I suggest they be personally asked to support the President. With the predictable storm of protest that the budget cuts are going to provoke from the National Council of Churches/U.S. Catholic Conference types, some favorable editorializing and preaching from the religious community will be needed by the Administration.

I would be happy -- and hereby offer -- to work with you and anyone else from the White House to set up a meeting for this purpose.

I suggest the following scenario: a day be chosen, on which the President himself will come for at least 10-15 minutes to speak to the group, to be preceded and followed by perhaps Director Stockman, Secretary Schweiker, or others familiar with both the budget process and the special concerns of this group. I will be happy to co-sign telegrams inviting leaders to the meeting; if need be, I will foot the bill for such telegrams.

The invitation list ought to include many of those attached. Principles only -- with this exception: in the case of a few evangelists with national or international following, whose schedules have been set for months in advance, an alter ego ought to be allowed. I am sure, however, that with just a little advance notice, most of them would be able to come in person.

I look forward to hearing from you.

As I understand the idea, it was first proposed by my friend Connie Marshner. As you know, Connie is chairman of the national Pro-Family Coalition, chairman of the Family Policy Advisory Board for the Reagan-Bush campaign and one of the really talented and knowledgeable people on our side.

I am writing this letter to ask that the White House reconsider your decision not to hold a presidential briefing for leaders of the religious and pro-family communities.


As you will recall, the idea for such a briefing was first proposed in February by Connie Marshner, who in addition to being a Chairman of the Library Court Group and Chairman of the National Pro Family Coalition was Chairman of the Family Policy Advisory Board for the Reagan-Bush campaign. Connie made the proposal in response to a call for help with President Reagan's budget from Morton Blackwell, who had gone to work as Elizabeth Dole's assistant. Connie believes that such a group has the capacity to motivate large numbers of people and bypass usual media outlets because they have their own means of communication. She proposed various people who, at the White House's request, could be part of this briefing. She would include major ministers such as Reverend Jerry Falwell and Reverend James Robison including large pro-family organizations who have a demonstrated record of responsible activism evolving into favorable and positive results.
