I received your letter, and am elated over your plan for a Presidential meeting relating to economic development on Indian reservations. I've put together some considerations on the representation from Indian country and the private sector.

On the tribal representation, I presume you have requested suggestions from the NCAI, NTCA, CERT, and possibly other organizations and federal agencies. Since equitable representation from among the various organizations and interests is important to the success of such a meeting, I've devised a matrix against which such considerations can be quickly checked. The fifty names I've recommended provide a good organizational, geographical, and resources cross section.

I apologize for not being able to provide the addresses for all the private sector corporations, but I'm sure the White House has directories for them.

Please let me know if there are any other ways I can be of assistance to you in this most important conference.

TRIBAL REPRESENTATION

FIFTM

I'm submitting about thirty names of tribal leaders (mostly chairmen) whom I feel are important to the conference. They're progressive in the sense that their respective tribes have shown significant development. I've attempted to assure a good cross-section of development potential, organizational representation, and geographic representation. These factors are politically important, and they do not compromise the quality of the audience for the purpose of the conference. You may wish to use the matrix for additional names that are recommended from other sources.

For any statements from the Indian side, I would suggest the following, and I would be happy to work with them on the format and content of their statements.

Phillip Martin, President of NTCA and Chairman of the Mississippi Band of Choctaws: Chairman Martin is the model of tribal leadership in economic development. In their reservation industrial park, they have major industries of General Motors and American Greeting Card Co., plus many smaller industries. To build the factory for American Greeting Card Co., Chairman Martin wanted to float industrial development bonds. And when he learned that tribes couldn't do that, he got the neighboring city of Philadelphia, Mississippi to issue thebonds. In an area that generally suffers racial tension, that move did much to improve community relations and the area economy. He didn't need a dime of federal money.

Peter MacDonald, Chairman of CERT and Chairman of the Navajo Tribe: Chairman MacDonald is an eloquent spokesman and, of course, a major figure in the national Indian scene. I believe that the private sector representatives at the conference would be greatly impressed with MacDonald.

Earl Old Person, Chairman of the Blackfeet Tribe of Montana: I've enclosed a clipping from the Rocky Mountain News on Chairman Old Person. As you can see, he's "right on" as far as development goes. He also has a traditional dignity about him, and is eloquent in his presentation.

Norman Hollow, Chairman of the Fort Peck Tribes of Montana: Chairman Hollow represents stable and progressive tribal government. In his decade-long term of office, the Fort Peck Tribes have grown tremendously in their industrial base. There is no tribal leader more experienced at joint-venturing with private industry, and risking tribal financial assets to achieve development.

Willie Hensley, NANA (Alaska Native Regional Corp.): Mr. Hensley is the best known Alaska Native leader. He's president of a bank, a Republican member of the Alaska legislature, and an eloquent spokesman.

PRIVATE SECTOR REPRESENTATION

The possibilities for development in Indian country cover a wide range. Although many tribes have an excellent base of natural resources development potential -- energy, minerals, agriculture, aquaculture, timber, tourism and water -- their needs from the private sector are for industrial relocation, technology transfer, management and marketing expertise, and financial investment. I suggest that the private sector representation at the White House conference be sought in the following major areas:

- Industry (Manufacturing and Assembly)
- o Agriculture and Food Processing
- o Energy and Extractive Industry
- o Financial Institutions

Manufacturing and Assembly:

In the economic development scheme for Indian country, manufacturing industry is extremely important. Recent developments in Congress and in the Department of Defense point to significant opportunities for reservation-based industries to enter the arena of defense contracting and procurement -- particularly in joint venture with major private contractors and suppliers. The following corporations have exemplary work on Indian reservations:

Brunswick Corporation: Brunswick has two sister operations on two separate reservations: Devil's Lake in North Dakota and Fort Peck in Montana. Both are joint venture businesses manufacturing camouflage netting for the Army.

General Dynamics/Pomona Divison: GD/Pomona has an electronics manufacturing operation on Navajo which has been going for some 10-12 years.

Raytheon Service Company: Raytheon Service Co. has done some creative thinking in the development of Indian industry for repair and refurbishing of military equipment. The corporation is in the process of joint-venturing with Laguna Pueblo in New Mexico on a major plant.

Non-defense corporations which have good experience on Indian reservations include the following:

American Greeting Card Corporation: American Greeting Card has contracted with the Choctaw Greeting Enterprise to hand finish high quality greeting cards. This is the project that was developed with the industrial bond issued by the city of Philadelphia, Mississippi, on behalf of the Choctaw Tribe -- a great story.

General Motors: GM has contracted with Chahta Enterprise on the Choctaw reservation for that reservation industry to supply electrical wire harnesses for GM's Packard Electric Division. That operation provides some 220 jobs on the Choctaw reservation.

Agricultural:

In light of increasing world demand for American food, feed and fibre, the tribes with their abundant lands and superior water rights should realize significant development in agriculture. And with the alarming shrinkage of productive agricultural land base, the pressure to develop agribusiness on Indian land will be great.

Two firms which have done excellent work in Indian country are the following:

Rural Venture, Inc.: RVI is an innovative concept created by Control Data Corporation. RVI is a consortium of several major firms (CENEX, Super-Valu, Land O'Lakes, Steiger Tractor, CDC, and others) which have invested in the organization for the purpose of brining together the technology and expertise for effective rural

development. RVI's concepts on reservation development are extremely good, and their determination (and corporate patience) to bring these concepts to Indian country is commendable.

Ball Agricultural Systems of Colorado: Ball Agricultural Systems is developing and managing the massive Navajo Agricultural Products Industry for the Navajo Tribe. The corporate leadership of BAS has excellent concepts and attitudes on doing business with Indian tribes. BAS President Ray Hill serves on the American Indian Economic Development Advisory Committee.

Others in this category that I would recommend are:



Hiefer International Con Agra Land O'Lakes Dairies Steiger Tractor

Energy and Minerals:

Although the energy and mining companies have more activity in Indian country than do all other outside private interests combined, these "extractive" industries tend to offer only royalties and lease payments to the reservation economies, and these are looked upon by the tribes as largely inequitable. And, following the recent Supreme Court battle between the Jicarilla Apache tribe and the oil companies over taxation, the feelings aren't mutually warm.

The White House meeting might stimulate the energy companies to consider some possible energy-peripheral industries on the reservations, but they tend not to see it in their best interest to offer any part of the action to the tribes. I would suggest that the energy representation not be too heavy.

Firms in this category that have shown some good will and creativity in tribal participation in ventures include the following:

AMAX: This firm is party to America's single largest joint venture between the private sector and an Indian tribe. The venture is a massive molybdenum mining and processing operation on the Colville Indian reservation in Washington State. Although the operation startup is awaiting greater moly demand and cheaper money, the joint venture agreement is historic in itself.

Rocky Mountain Energy is working on some interesting joint-ventures with tribes in uranium and coal mining, and ESARCO has worked cooperatively with the Papago Tribe in Arizona for quite some time now.

Other energy firms operating on Indian reservations include the following:

Sun Oil Company
Gulf Oil Company
ARCO
Phillips Petroleum
Peabody Coal

The major timber and paper companies tend to be viewed, with energy and mining, as extractive industries. However, there appears to be greater opportunity for diversification and reservation development with lumber and wood products. Among the major timber and paper companies are:

Georgia-Pacific Kimberly-Clarke Weyerhauser Fort Howard

Financial Institutions:

A major impediment to development on the Indian reservations is the inaccessibility of private capital markets to tribes for financing projects. There are a number of banks which have done excellent exploratory work into overcoming legal and jurisdictional barriers to reservation investments. These should be invited to the White House conference as well. They include the following:

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The following are individuals who should be given special consideration for invitations because of their deep interest in Indian economic development, their accomplishments in Indian affairs, and their stature among the Indian tribes and the private sector.

Ted Bryant: Ted is with the accounting firm of Deloitte, Haskins & Sells in Denver. He is a founder and President of the American Indian National Republican Federation of the National Republican Heritage Groups Council. He's deeply involved in national Indian affairs, serving on the NCAI Economic Development Committee and often assisting the Council of Energy Resource Tribes. He's recently put together a private sector advisory council on Indian Economic Development.

Joseph Baca: Baca is with the American Indian Development Corporation, and is considered the single most outstanding leader in the area of Indian economic development. He is currently putting together major hearings testimony for all three major Indian organizations (NCAI,NTCA & CERT) for the Senate Select Committee on Indian Affairs.

William Norris: Bill Norris is Chairman of the Board and President of Control Data Corporation. Through the years, he's been greatly interested in economic development on Indian reservations. It's my understanding that he's also quite deeply involved in the Presidential Task Force on Private Sector Initiatives.

Louis R. Bruce: Louis Bruce is widely respected in Indian affairs, having served as executive director of NCAI and, during the Nixon administration, as Commissioner of Indian affairs. He was also director of the national dairy organization and is widely respected in the private sector.

Conley Ricker: Mr. Ricker is Chief Executive Officer of the American Indian National Bank. He has helped bring together many major financial institutions in the West to work on overcoming the many barriers to financing development projects on Indian reservations.

Robert McLaughlin: Bob McLaughlin assisted the Reagan-Bush campaign devise their Indian position paper. He is instrumental in devising federal Indian economic development policy and in working with the tribes.

Blackfoot Indians proving they can make it in corporate world

NEW YORK — The Blackfoot Indians have shown they can make it in modern corporate America.

From a factory in the town of Browning at the center of the isolated 1.5 million-acre reservation bordering Glacier National. Park in northern Montana, the Blackfoot Indian Writing Co. has captured 1 percent of the nation's pencil, disposable ballpoint pen and marker market.

In the process, the Blackfoot have offered reservations across the country a model for solving chronic American Indian unemployment, running at a staggering rate of 39 percent nationwide as of April last year.

They also have shown how government and business can cooperate successfully to help minority businesses get started.

But most important, says Chief Earl Old Person, leader of the 12,000-member tribe and chairman of the company, they have shown American Indians throughout the country they can succeed in the private enterprise arena and attain self-sufficiency.

"Indian tribes have to look for something more permanent than government programs," Chief Old Person said on a recent business trip to New York. "Something that will be ours, where the government can't say, 'We're going to phase this out."

Chief Old Person began approaching corporations and government agencies more than a decade ago to get the funds to start his company. It now numbers among its customers 300 of the Fortune 500 largest companies which eagerly buy products bearing names like "Thunderball," "Swagger Stick" and "Featherwriter" in an effort to fulfill their minority purchasing goals.

The company has achieved a 115 percent jump in sales in three years to \$5 million in fiscal 1979. Earnings last year came to 2.5 percent of sales and are expected to reach 3.5 percent this

year, according to William F. Meyer, vice president for marketing and sales.

The factory, the only wood-cased pencil plant west of St. Louis, employs 115 of the reservation's 6,000 regular residents, and touches the lives of 750 people in all when families are taken into account.

"There is a real feeling of pride about the factory," Chief Old

He now plans to build a plastics plant near the pen and pencil factory in Browning's Blackfoot Industrial Park.

He hopes other firms seeking to relocate to an area with a solid labor force also will consider Browning.

The Economic Development Agency has spent \$29.3 million since its formation in 1964 to help build 54 industrial parks on 49 Indian reservations in 19 states.

Of the 124 firms built in these parks, 48 are more than 50 percent owned by Indians, making everything from arrows to electronic components, according to an EDA official.

But he says not many of them deal in end products as the Blackfoot.

The beginnings were not easy for Chief Old Person, faced with an isolated location, a potential work force which was nonindustrial by heritage, and 70 percent unemployment in the winter and 40 percent in the summer on his reservation.

But he successfully sought financing from tribal funds, private investors, the U.S. Small Business Administration and EDA, and in April 1971 incorporated his company.

Most of the firm's top management currently is non-Indian, including President Peter Tracy, Meyers and a nationwide sales force of 12.

But Indians are being trained for management positions and currently occupy all but three posts in the factory itself.
