SUMMARY. This memorandum forwards for your consideration a proposed Executive order which would extend the time for submission of the report of the Presidential Commission on Indian Reservation Economies.

BACKGROUND. Executive Order No. 12401 of January 14, 1983, established the Presidential Commission on Indian Reservation Economies and provided that it would report to the President by September 30, 1983. The Commission has yet to hold its first meeting. The proposed order would extend the time for the Commission to conduct its study and submit its report until six months after the appointment of the last Commissioner or April 30, 1984, whichever comes earlier.

None of the affected agencies has objected to the proposed Executive order.

RECOMMENDATION. I recommend that you sign the proposed Executive order.

#### EXECUTIVE ORDER

PRESIDENTIAL COMMISSION ON INDIAN RESERVATION ECONOMIES

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and laws of the United States of America, including the Federal Advisory Committee Act, as amended (5 U.S.C. App. I), it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. Section 2(d) of Executive Order No. 12401 is hereby amended to provide as follows:

"The Commission shall submit its final report to the President and the Secretary of the Interior by November 30, 1984.".

Sec. 2. Section 4(b) of Executive Order No. 12401 is hereby amended to provide as follows:

"The Commission shall, unless sooner extended, terminate

30 days after it transmits its final report to the President.".
