
Dear Mr. President:

A wrong that has been suffered by two of our Episcopal clergy and the resulting relationship problems affecting the Episcopal Church, our Federal Government and a large segment of our Hispanic population cause me, as Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, to bring an urgent request to you personally.

I have discussed the issue with the Vice President. I have informed both Mr. Fielding, your White House Counsel, and Mr. Deaver, the Deputy Chief of your Staff, of my concern, intention, and determination. While I believe such a predicament is properly a concern of the President, your determination that Government must better serve the people and your call to Churches and the private sector to relieve governmental agencies where possible in directly ministering to human need encourage me to request your attention, time, and good service in correcting a wrong and improving relationships.

My schedule will be adjusted to meet with you whenever you can share some time. With prayers and best wishes for the good service and leadership required of you, I am,

Statement to the Court
Doss/Frade Case
January 25, 1982

Your Honor:

With your permission and with gratitude and appreciation both as Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church in the United States, and as a private citizen, I respectfully and gratefully present this statement of affirmation to the Court.

I affirm belief in the due judicial process in our country.

I affirm the responsibility of governance and protection by law.

I affirm the high purpose of the law to be justice and well being for all the people.

I affirm the necessity for comparative evaluation, understanding and compassion in administering the law, as in the determination of any beneficial human endeavors.

Accordingly I do also affirm the dedication and ministry of the Rev. Joseph Doss and the Rev. Leo Frade, both of whom are clergy in good standing in the Episcopal Church. I identify with them as they stand to receive the judgment of this court.

We are here as a result of a sudden abrupt change in a policy by our national government which quite unexpectedly and ironically placed restrictions on a ministry of mercy which these two clergy had been instrumental in carefully planning, providing for, and in due course, efficiently and effectively completing, namely the safe and open delivery and secure settlement into our country of family members, relatives and friends of their parishioners. They weremade liable when restrictions were imposed after their having begun a process which to have abandoned in course would have left people depending upon them for deliverance in acute jeopardy.

We are here as a result of their choosing to proceed with their commitment and mission of mercy and deliverance, risking the violation of our government's policy, because of the consensus and conviction they share with many of us concerning the justice and freedom which are both our national and religious heritages. Comparative evaluation and understanding of the possibilities for compassion in administering law in the two governments involved, prompted them to put their trust in our country's expressed dedication to justice, mercy and freedom.

It is not my purpose here, your Honor, to condone or ask for special privilege in the violation of laws and governmental

regulations. It is my purpose to affirm and encourage every reasonable effort in administering law for the welfare and freedom of humanity and the enabling of proven works of mercy.

Your Honor, the truth would be neglected by me, as a citizen of this country, if I did not express regret that the Justice Department of our government chose and declared this case to be used as an example by our government in controlling the problem of refugee influx into this country. Certainly sadness comes with awareness of the significant energy, time and financial resources which have been required in this legal process, compared to both the obvious need for such resources to minister to deprived and oppressed people and to deal with the many gross incidents of profiteering and smuggling in human traffic.

The irony is bitter with tragic consequences when the servants of two institutions in this land, both by constitution dedicated to justice, mercy and freedom, and the well being of humanity, are drawn into legal contest and away from the pursuit of their primary purposes.

Your Honor, in the name of the Church in whose mission these two clergy and I serve, and with knowledge of their good records of beneficial service in relieving human distress, I respectfully request Your Honor to free them from the burdens of sentence or fines which would interrupt acceptable helpful ministries and claim financial resources needed for ministries to the increasing human need throughout our human societies.

Your Honor, I conclude with gratitude and appreciation for courtesy and consideration offered by this Court.


Dear Mr. President:

Asked if he thought it wrong to fine civilian boat operators who bring Cuban refugees in private vessels, Mr. Reagan said, "That's right. I think that as long as there are thousands of refugees who are still trying to get here until we know we have a better system set up I just can't understand the lack of humanitarianism in shutting that off."

Mr. Reagan added that he was not worried about Cuban refugees putting Americans out of work. "If the building is burning and you are getting people out of the upper windows do you worry about whether or not they are going to take someone's job? That's what it really amounts to."

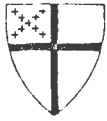
