SUBJ: BRIEFING SCHEDULED FOR HISPANIC EVANGELICAL RELIGIOUS LEADERS

1. Henry Zuniga will be briefing a group of Hispanic religious leaders on 6 July at 10:00 in Room 194. Henry would like you to talk to the group sometime between 10:00 and 10:30 for about 15 minutes about what you have been doing with Evangelical groups.
2. There will be approximately 20 leaders, from states including Texas, Florida, New York, and Virginia. The religions represented include Lutheran, Presbyterian, Assembly of God, Methodist, Pentacostal, Holiness Church, and others.
3. The meeting was suggested to Henry Zuniga by Reverend Gimenez of the Rock Church in Virginia Beach, Virginia. This group is meeting for the first time to discuss what directions they might take. SUBJECT: Charitable Contributions and the
President's Economic Program

In my speech to Washington, D. C. area religious leaders I mentioned that high tax rates and government spending programs had caused charitable contributions by private donors to decline. IRS Statistics of Income shows that contributions per itemized tax return have generally declined since 1968. Therefore, I argued that the tax and budget reductions would produce new incentives for individuals and businesses to increase their charitable giving.

The larger after-tax incomes resulting from the tax cut should allow persons to make greater contributions to their preferred charity. In addition, reductions in government transfers to charitable organizations should lead to expanded giving from the private sector as individuals and businesses reevaluate their role in caring for the poor and disadvantaged.

Attached is a copy of a study that contains findings supporting my conclusions about the effect of the President's program on charitable giving.
