One of our great sins is that we don't realize that all God needs to help the poor can be found within our congregations. If the world is not made better, it is our fault. ... The STEP Foundation is a Christian movement where business leaders, clergy, community and parachurch volunteers join hands through their spiritual and professional skills to help the poor people of inner-city America. The strategy is simple: The poor are everybody's business and through local churches and through the creative insights of business leaders, new hope and life can be given to those who need help. STEP is a response to over 400 passages admonishing, commanding, promising and describing assistance to the poor in the Bible.

The government has tried to assist the poor and failed. STRATEGIES TO ELEVATE PEOPLE

The STEP Foundation is developing national prototypes in designated neighborhoods in Dallas, Denver, and Los Angeles to demonstrate effective projects to help the poor. These models can then be replicated across America.

DENVER

The block-by-block strategy developed by Dr. E. V. Hill to reach an inner-city area is becoming reality in Denver as the World Christian Training Center was launched here with the cooperation of 15 inner-city pastors. Suburban churches are also becoming involved, most notably Bear Valley Baptist Church, 50 of whose members are serving as volunteers in a Department of Social Services Child Abuse Program and with the Juvenile Court. In addition, students from Denver Conservative Baptist Seminary are using the STEP program as a tool to expand their outreach to Denver's urban areas.

LOS ANGELES

Dr. Hill is laying the foundation for a suburban church coalition to reach the poor in the Los Angeles inner city. This coalition will recruit out of both inner city and suburban church groups experts who will form more than 75 ad hoc committees. They will seek solutions of problems such as convalescent homes, the deaf, urban gangs and children through backyard Bible studies, etc. In the meantime, the WCTC program is training students in the basics of Christian outreach and evangelism. To date the training-center has 1,362 block chairman from 128 churches. Job training programs have been developed which recruit/train young people who are out of school and out of work and place them in full-time employment.

DALLAS

Ten suburban churches are involved through the leadership of Pastor E. K. Bailey of Concord Missionary Baptist Church to form the Dallas prototype. Also participating are faculty and students from Dallas Theological Seminary and Criswell Center for Biblical Studies, and staff from Baylor Medical Center. In addition, women's groups and business leaders have developed many additional projects to assist the poor.

The Step Foundation (Strategies to Elevate People) is a non-profit charitable organization which mobilizes churches to bring aid to the poor and needy in innercity neighborhoods. This is accomplished through volunteer job banks, food and clothing distribution centers and other volunteer charitable means.

STEP is sponsoring a two day training seminar in the Washington area on April 7th and 8th, and they have written to the President requesting a "drop-in." Scheduling responded directly with a standard regret letter.

I feel this meeting is of vital importance to the President's Private Sector Initiative, as STEP embodies the very effort the President envisioned in his initiative. The meeting is also important for a number of other reasons: primarily political considerations.

Though the President has recently spoken to Religious Broadcasters (NRB) and an evangelical group (NEA), he has not touched all of the political bases in the evangelistic arena: not by a long shot. The NRB is only Broadcasters, and the NEA is comprised almost entirely (95%) of northern denominations. This excludes Assemblies of God, Pentacostals, Southern Babtists, etc. groups represent a constituency of 30 million Americans! Jimmy Carter won the South because he had the Southern Christian vote. President Reagan will need that vote in 1984. Key leaders in evangelical circles will be present at this STEP meeting, including 300 pastors and leaders. So will many prominent benefactors from the Dallas area (Bunker Hunt, Mary Crowley, the Murchisons, etc.) as well as Holly Coors from Colorado. Finally, his presence would punctuate a genuine concern for the poor.

I recommend we try to get the President to appear briefly for a "drop-by" to show his interest and appreciation in this group taking the reins on his Private Sector Initiative.

STEP FOUNDATION STRATEGY

The purpose of the STEP Foundation is to provide resources and strategies to help the poor. In the light of today's fiscal restraint, this can only be accomplished through better management of existing resources and through the infusion of volunteers.

Crucial to this process must be greater involvement by American churches. They are strategic to bringing new hope to the poor. The congregations of America are filled with corporate, political and community leaders. They have the ideas and resources and spiritual message to change urban America. Churches throughout America are an excellent instrument to help respond to the needs of the poor. They have a Biblical mandate to help the poor which provides motivation and they meet at least once weekly which provides organization.

Billions of dollars are spent annually through federal, state and local agencies and through private sector initiatives to improve the life of our Nation's poor. Most of this resource has been channeled through large urban institutions. These structures do not work very well. New answers are needed. Our staff are presently seeking successful programs in combating poverty with no additional federal funds, but emphasis on volunteerism. The STEP Foundation is developing several initiatives that suggest promise:

- 1. The STEP Foundation is creating a National Task Force to explore and suggest new resources and strategies to help the poor.
- The STEP Foundation is creating an Urban Think Tank
 It is functioning in the areas of education, recreational
 and cultural activities, housing, jobs/economic
 development, welfare/social services, medical, criminal
 justice systems, drug and alcohol abuse, spiritual development, and environmental factors. Units of these task
 forces are now being created in various churches,
 organizations, corporations and agencies. Many people

have answers to poverty. The STEP Foundation task force will attempt to provide a practical way for the contribution of ideas and implementation of strategy.

3. The STEP Foundation is developing national prototypes in designated poverty neighborhoods of Denver, Dallas, Los Angeles and New York.

For example, presently there are three major churches which give leadership in the Dallas model (several others are in the decision-making process). These congregations include many of the corporate, business, civic and political leadership in the city. Forty-five additional churches will be asked to join by the fall. In addition, staff members from Baylor Medical Center are organizing to provide assistance and students from Dallas Theological Seminary and Criswell Bible Institute have already organized personal ministries in the STEP project and have led hundreds of people to Christ. Also, women from suburban churches, through the Dorcas Program, have organized to help manage many aspects of the project.

In the Denver project one large church is supporting a federally-funded child abuse program by giving personal help and support to this effort.

In Los Angeles 15 of the suburban churches of the city will be surrounding the efforts of E. V. Hill in the Watts area, through the World Christian Training Center, house by house and block by block to help the total community spiritually and economically and to fight crime. These efforts will attempt to produce national models which could be replicated throughout urban America.

The STEP Foundation is building a national coalition of churches and para-church ministries to encourage and sustain deeper involvement with the poor. Much of this effort is to help strengthen the urban church which has not had the resources or staff to function to potential. The STEP Foundation works in partnership with the World Christian Training Center to help the inner-city church in its emphasis of discipleship and evangelism in fifteen major cities in America. The Foundation also has the cooperation of some of the largest para-church ministries, prominent TV evangelists, and Christian leaders, and is developing a specific plan to bring their combined resources to urban America in concert.

5. The STEP Foundation is producing a docu-drama depicting the needs of urban America and offering realistic and practical solutions.

Basic to the STEP Foundation approach is the conviction that many of our urban problems are spiritual and they will only be solved spiritually. Work ethic, drug and alcohol, crime, abandonment of family and so many other aspects of poverty are rooted in spiritual causes. Any meaningful urban strategy must be centered in strengthening the urban church and its proclamation of Jesus Christ. If there is nothing unique about the message of Jesus Christ, then let the Church no longer be the Church and let it pass its function over to private and government agencies. The Gospel of Jesus Christ must ring out from the churches of urban America, but they also must be surrounded by the organized resources of affluent congregations and business leadership.

The STEP Foundation's strategy is simple. We will organize groups of congregations to affect a given neighborhood. This group of laypersons will then organize into task forces to help strengthen or change the existing institutions -- police, schools, hospitals, churches, etc. -- and to develop new programs. These efforts will be undergirded by the STEP Foundation's Urban Think Tank and its national organization of prominent para-church ministries.

The ultimate answer rests with supplying specific skills, talents and resources, including spiritual, to specific needs of inner-city America doing it in a personal and thorough manner. There is no other solution. The STEP Foundation is committed to this task.
