SCHEDULE AUGUST U.S. MEETING

Washington, May 24. - Reserve officers from a dozen NATO countries will meet here in early August for the 35th Congress of the Interallied Confederation of Reserve Officers.

Otherwise known as CIOR, for its French title, Confederation Interalliee des Officers de Reserve, the organization represents the reserve officers of all NATO countries which have reserve forces. Its present membership is 360,000 with the potential for a million. The Reserve Officers Association of the U.S. is the host for this Congress.

More than 1,000 are expected for the August 8-15 sessions. They will be at the Sheraton Washington Hotel with military athletic competitions at Fort Meade, MD.

Meeting simultaneously will be the 36th annual conference of the Interallied Confederation of Medical Reserve Officers (CIOMR). Their sessions also will be at the Sheraton Washington and at area military hospitals.

The tentative CIOR program includes presentations by Caspar W. Weinberger,
Secretary of Defense; Army General Bernard W. Rogers, Supreme Allied Commander in
Europe; and Navy Admiral Harry D. Train, II, Supreme Allied Commander, Atlantic.

Marine Corps Commandant General Robert H. Barrow will host the Marine Barracks

Evening Parade during the conference. Guest of honor at the parade will be

The military competitions at Fort Meade will include marksmanship shooting of the pistol, rifle, and submachine gun; obstacle course and utility swimming; and a day-long land navigation orienteering exercise against an aggressor enemy. About 200 officers are expected to participate in these competitions, both as individuals and as teams representing their parent countries.
