

# MX Missile Center of Debate on Capitol Hill

As Defense Watch goes to press, final appropriation levels for the MX (missile experimental) in fiscal 1983 remain to be resolved, but will be sharply lower than the amount requested by President Reagan.

Congress, after a legislative struggle, agreed to a compromise authorization measure for the MX which was announced on August 13th by a joint House-Senate conference.

The conference slashed almost 800 million from President Reagan's MX request, which had called for 1.14 billion to procure the first nine MX missiles, 2.76 billion for research and development, and 715 million for an interim basing of the MX in existing Minuteman III silos.

The conference approved 830 million for five rather than nine MX missiles and 2.51 billion for research and development of the MX.

Full funding for research and development of an interim basing of the MX was also approved, but withheld until 30 legislative days after President Reagan informs Congress how the MX will be permanently based.

## Future of MX Missile Still to Be Determined by Congress

Advocates of interim basing fear that the withholding of funds will allow the rapid deployment of the MX to be killed in Congress at a later date.

The next legislative hurdle for the MX missile system will be action by the Senate

Appropriations Subcommittee on Defense chaired by Senator Ted Stevens (R-AK) and the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Defense chaired by liberal democrat Joseph P. Addabbo (D-NY).

Addabbo is an opponent of the MX missile and has declared his intention to cut 20 billion out of the defense authorizations voted by Congress.

Plans for the deployment, development and procurement of the MX announced as part of a strategic arms plan by President Reagan on October 2, 1981, has been a center of controversy on Capitol Hill.

## MX Missile a Key Ingredient in American Strategic Defense

The MX, a new generation of land-based strategic missile is designed to replace the ageing Minuteman III and become the foundation of America's land-based deterrents against Soviet nuclear blackmail.

Advocates for the rapid deployment of a new generation of nuclear deterrent were only partially successful against opponents who tried to kill or delay the MX program.

The most significant victory in the ongoing MX battle occurred on July 21st when the House of Representatives in a close 212 to 209 vote approved funds for the procurement of the MX.

During prolonged floor debate, pro-MX forces pointed out the necessity of preserving our Triad system of strategic missile defense.

The Triad system consists of land-based, sea-launched and bomber missile forces, which are a hedge against Soviet technological breakthroughs that could nullify any one type of strategic weapon in our arsenal.

The MX is America's only land-based strategic deterrent capable of countering the Soviet advantage of very accurate ICBM's, especially the Soviet SS-18, the most deadly missile in the world.

## MX Will Deter Possible Soviet Nuclear Blackmail

Failure to challenge the Soviet nuclear advantage over the United States would raise the possibility of Soviet nuclear blackmail.

Only the MX is accurate enough to destroy Soviet missiles even in their armoured underground silos.

Pro-MX forces called for the rapid deployment of the MX to counter a "window of vulnerability" which has developed partly as a result of the SALT treaties, and which gives the Soviets the ability to destroy 90% of our currently deployed land-based ICBM's.

The United States Defense Committee strongly supports the MX, and backed

proposals for its interim deployment in existing Minuteman silos until more advanced basing methods are developed.

## President Reagan Calls for Rapid Deployment of MX

The Reagan strategic arms plan calls for an upgrading of all strategic weapons systems, especially the MX.

Specifically, the MX will have greater throw-weight (the ability to carry larger payloads), increased accuracy, greater mobility and carry more warheads per missile.

Currently, the Minuteman III can carry three warheads while the MX will be capable of carrying ten.

The MX would also have the advantage of forcing the Soviet Union to make its own strategic forces more survivable, and force the Soviets to divert billions in funds which otherwise would be used to pose an even greater threat to the United States.

To make this threat more credible, President Reagan called for an interim rapid deployment of 40 MX missiles in silos of the Minuteman III.

While there is debate about the value of further hardening the present missile silos, there can be no doubt that the MX would be an improvement over the present Minuteman III's.

Legitimate controversy exists over how to deploy the MX — the so-called Racetrack system which would have used up a great deal of land in Nevada and Utah is one example.

## High Frontier Missile Defense Needed for MX Program

The United States Defense Committee believes that the defensive systems described in the High Frontier concepts will allow President Reagan's plan of putting the MX in current silos to succeed.

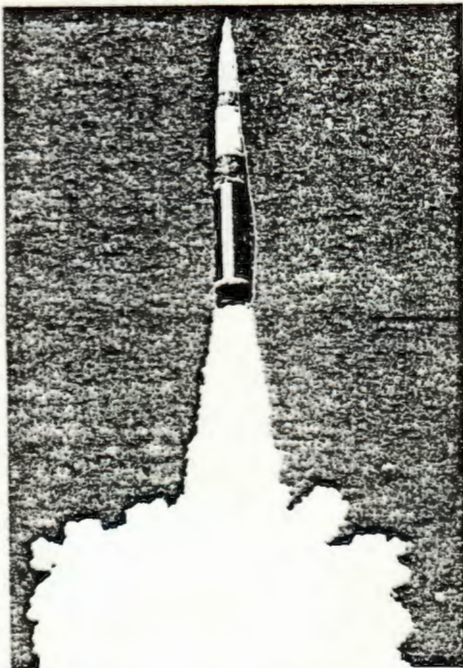
In addition, the sooner the MX is put into production, the sooner we will be able to deploy them in a new basing mode.

The United States Defense Committee believes that an interim deployment of the MX will help to close the "window of vulnerability" which has developed between the United States and the Soviet Union.

The MX is vital to preserve the deterrent capabilities of land-based strategic missiles.

Any action to delay the deployment of the MX will be viewed by the Soviets as a sign of weakness and will perpetuate their advantage in strategic weapons.

Only by acting swiftly and decisively will we dispel doubts about American resolve to counter the Soviet build-up. ■

# Reagan to reveal MX basing plan

President Reagan will announce his decision Monday on how the United States will base the MX missiles, a few hours before appearing on national television to make what the administration said will be a major arms-control speech.

Well-informed administration officials indicated it is almost certain that Reagan will disclose that he has decided to employ the so-called "dense pack" basing mode for the new American nuclear missiles. "Dense pack" would cluster most of the missiles closely together on the theory that the first incoming enemy missiles would create a shield of nuclear debris that would trigger late missiles and enable the United States to launch a second retaliatory strike.

The speech, scheduled for 8 p.m.

Monday, is billed as a "confidence-building" message designed to convey to the new Soviet leaders the U.S. desire for an improved relationship as well as the vital importance of achieving mutual arms reductions.

Administration sources said the timing of the MX decision next Monday afternoon before Reagan goes on the air is "in the overall context of the president's arms control proposals."

The intended signal to the Soviets and new Soviet party chairman Yuri Andropov is, administration sources said, that while Reagan wants improved relations, he also wants to serve notice on the Kremlin that the MX is his insurance policy if the arms negotiations do not make progress.

At present the United States and

the Soviets are discussing both the intermediate nuclear weaponry to be deployed in Europe as well as the strategic nuclear arms talks in Geneva. Conventional arms balances are also under negotiation in Vienna.

Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger has said repeatedly that the Soviets will never take U.S. arms reduction proposals seriously until America begins deploying some new hardware. Officials here contend that the Soviets are 20 years ahead of the United States in nuclear intercontinental weapons. The United States has not manufactured a new ICBM since 1965 while the Russians are in the third generation of new nuclear weapons, including the incredibly accurate SS-18.

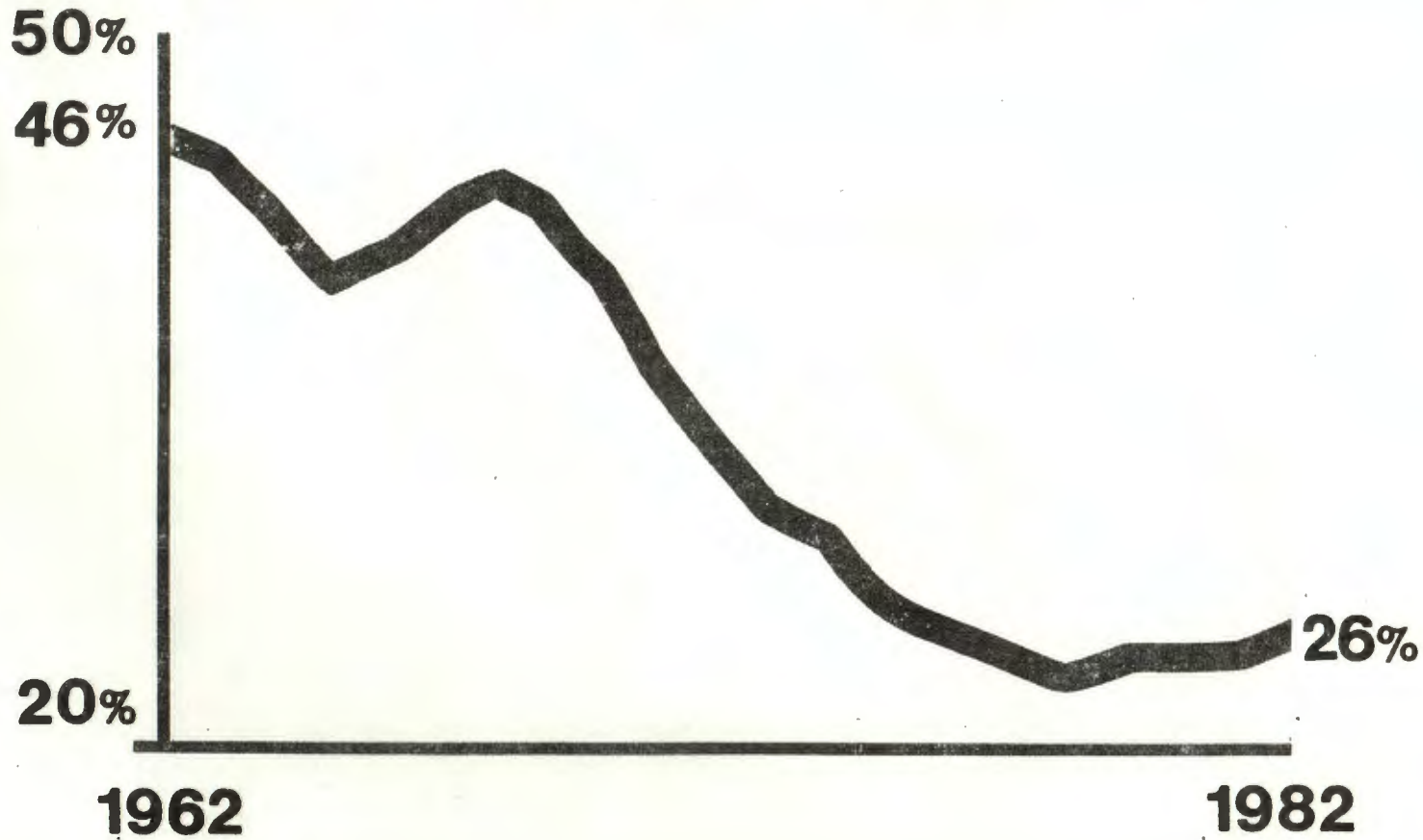
The decision for Reagan has not been whether to proceed with the MX program but which basing mode

to use. A variety of options have been put forward including "dense pack," airborne MX missions, race-track launchers or movable launchers and deep underground silos.

The president will follow up his MX announcement with further discussion in the 8 p.m. speech of the decision as well as his "confidence-building" proposals. One of these is increased use of the hot-line between Washington and Moscow, and another is the mutual advantages for the United States and the Soviet Union in reaching an accommodation on the nuclear arms buildup.

Reagan also is looking ahead to the need for convincing Congress to appropriate the funds for continued manufacture of the MX missiles and their basing in the 1983 and 1984 budgets.

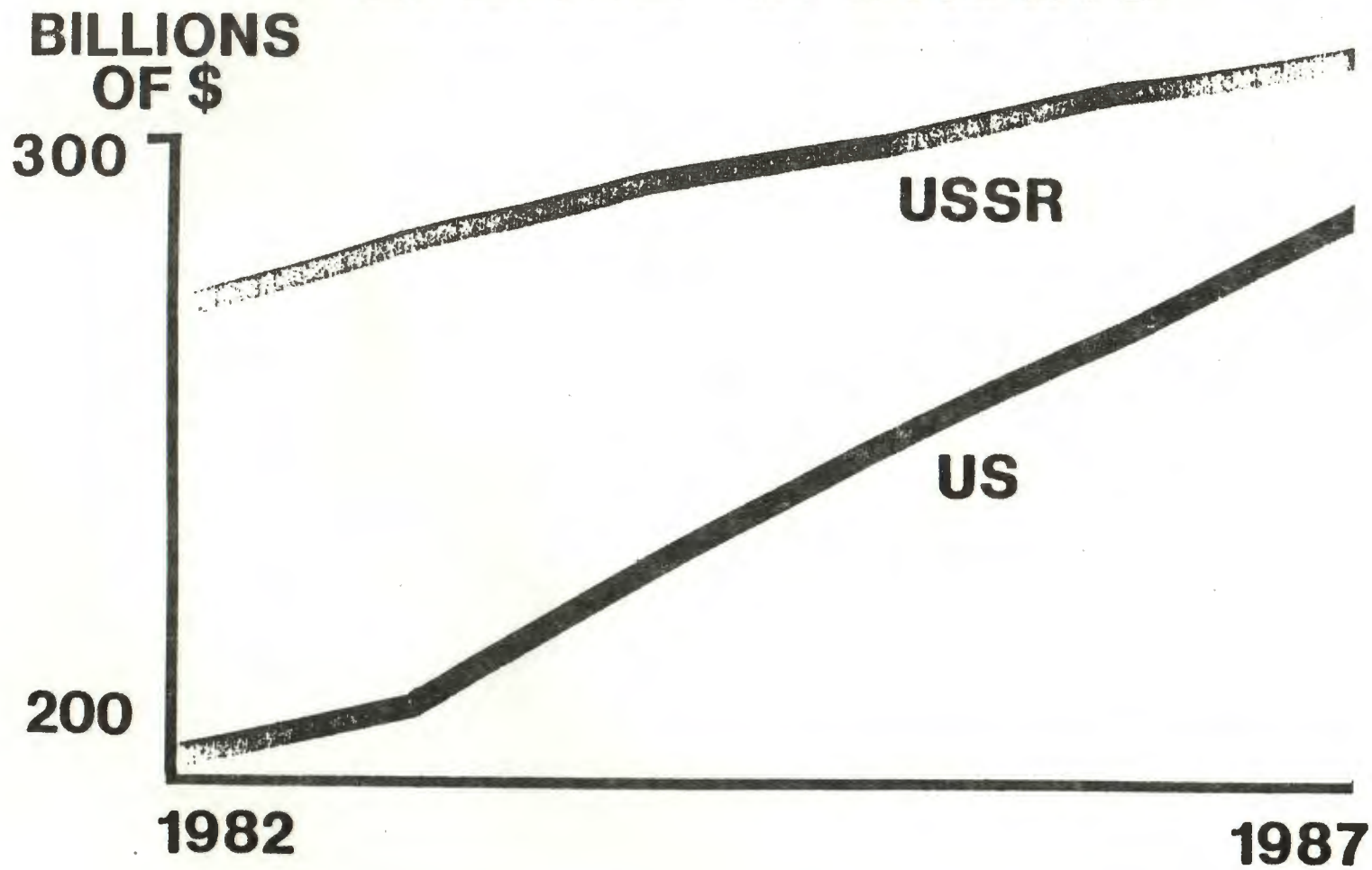
# DEFENSE SHARE OF FEDERAL BUDGET

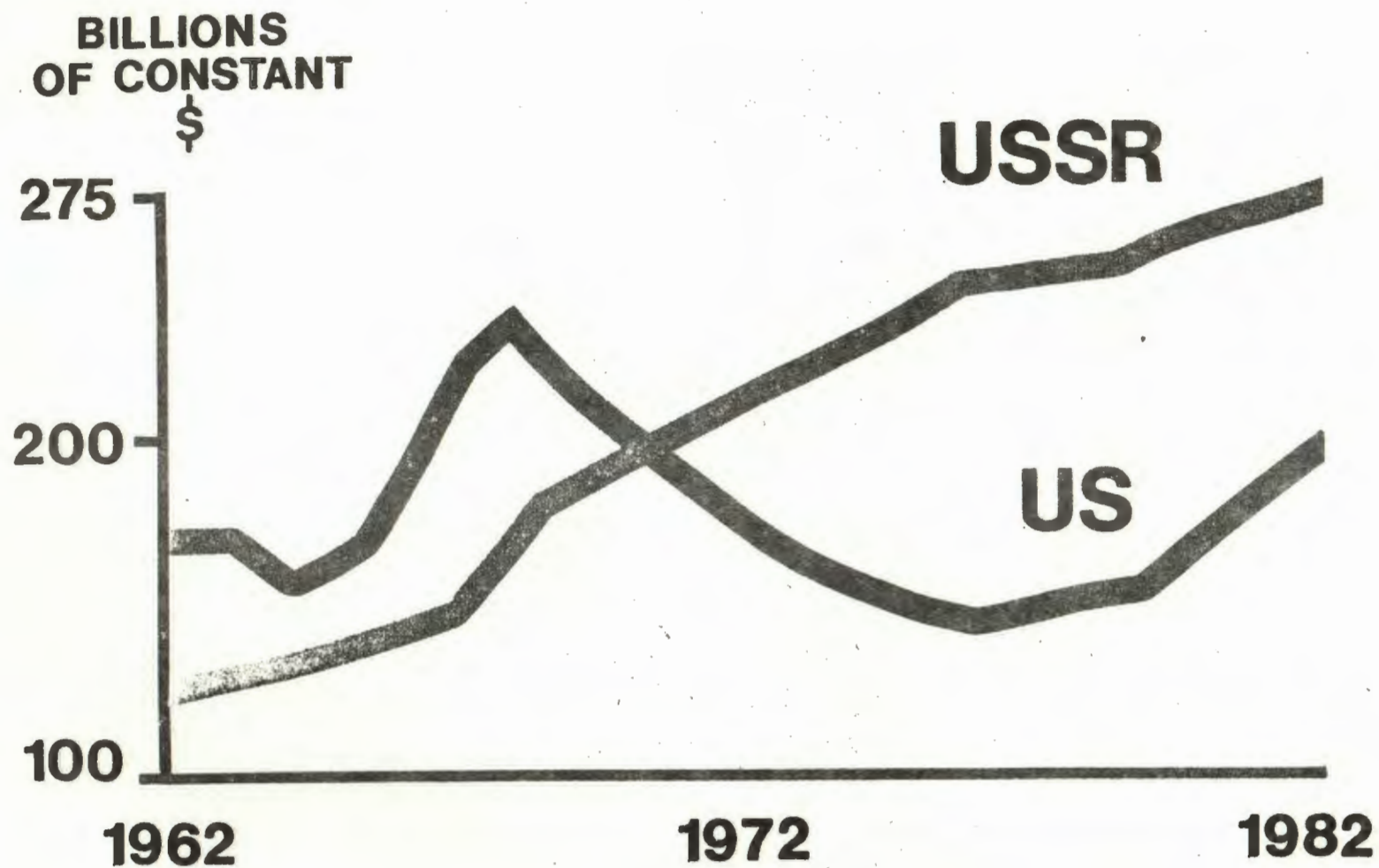


# PROJECTED DEFENSE SPENDING



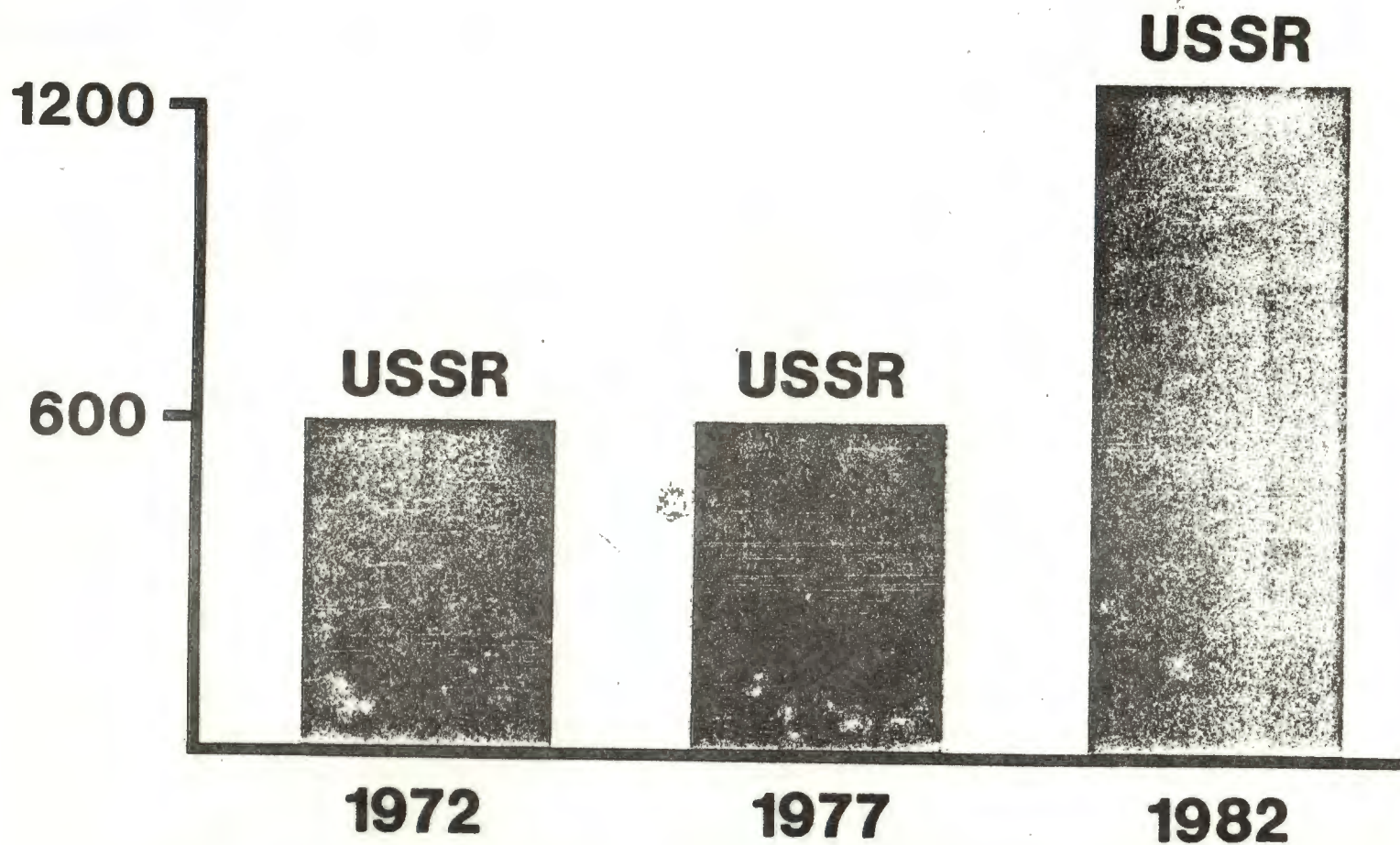

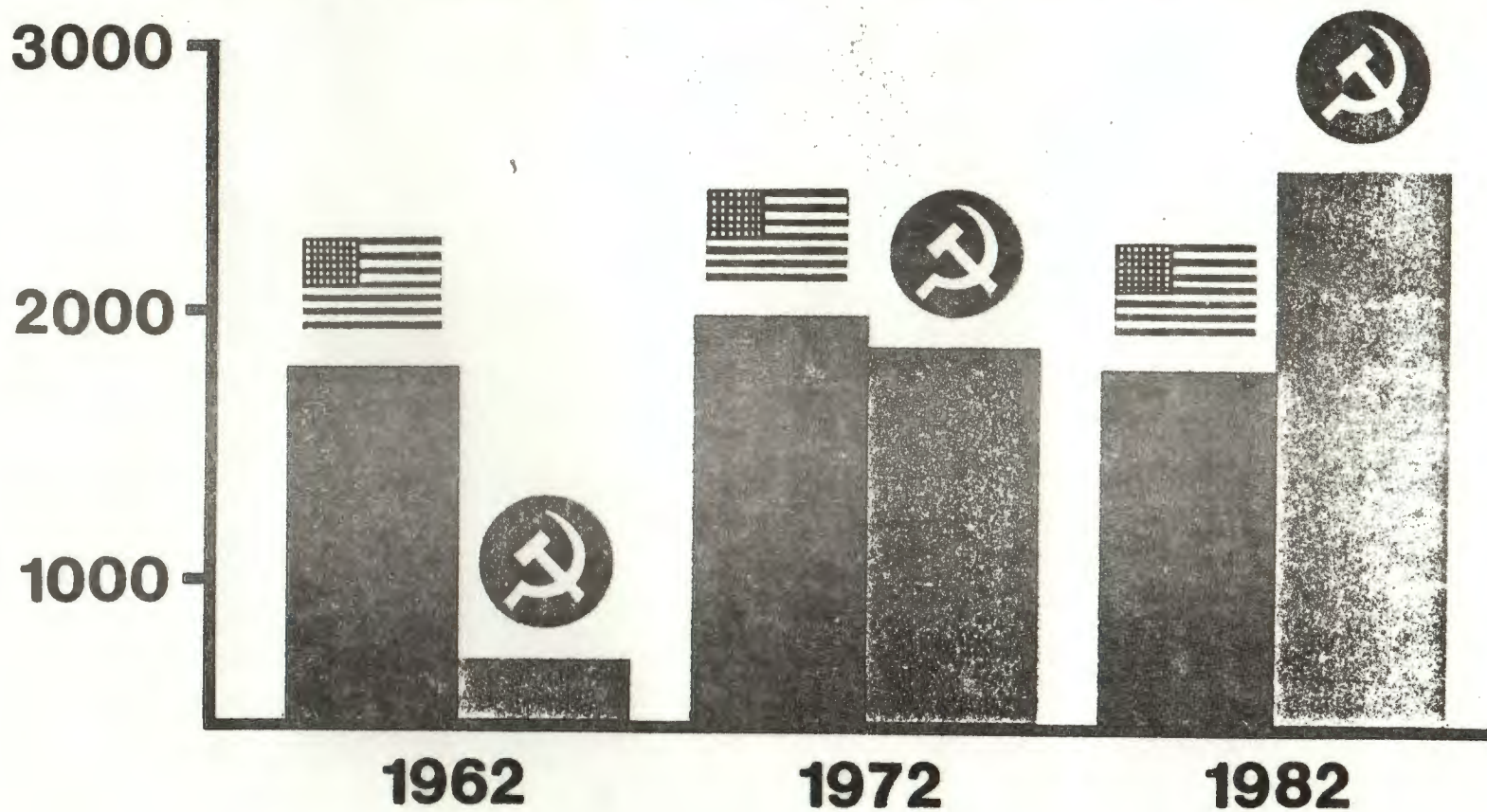
# MISSILE WARHEADS INTERMEDIATE RANGE • LAND BASED

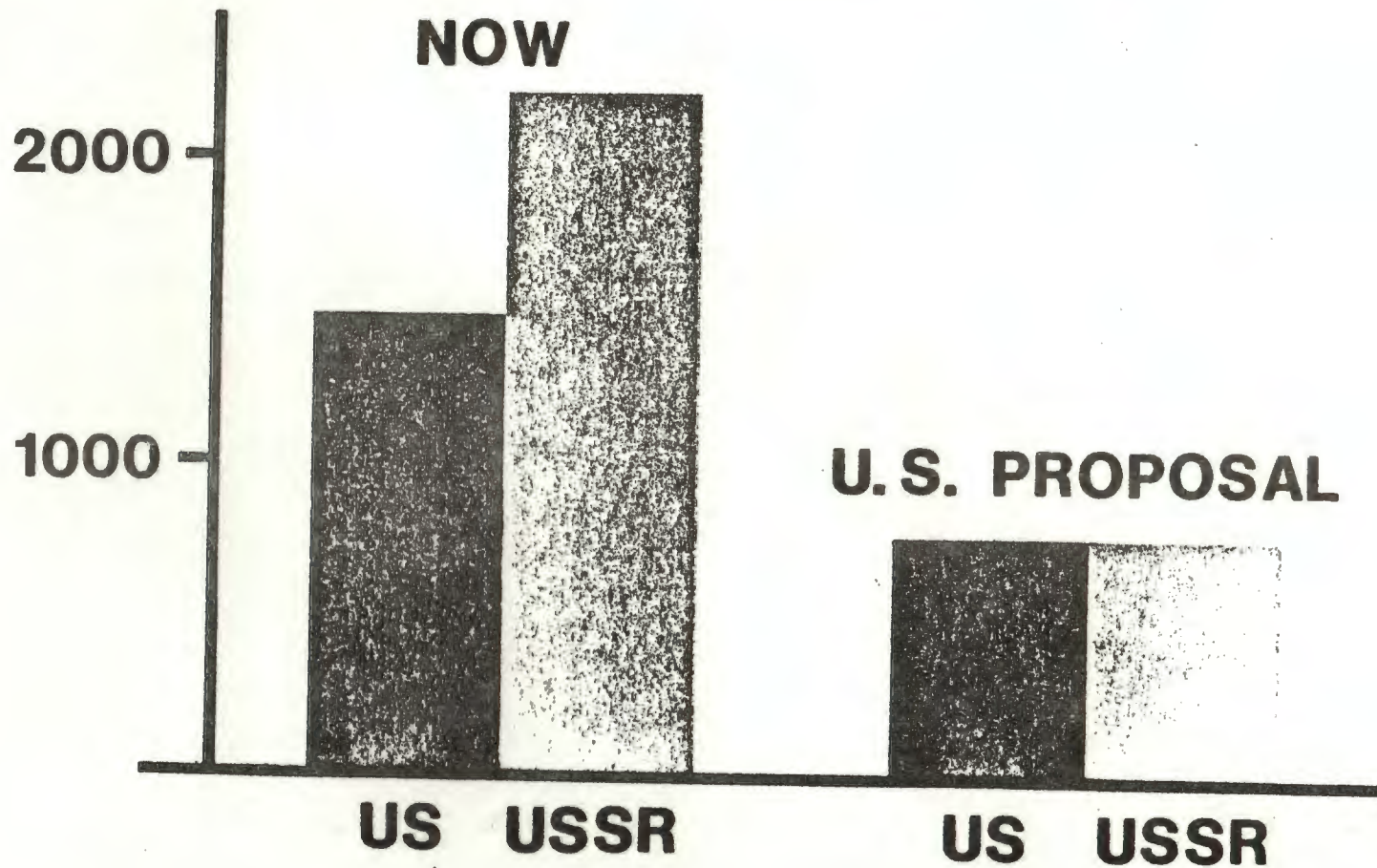
# STRATEGIC MISSILES AND BOMBERS
