To lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and to be the principal speaker at the Memorial Day Services.

II. BACKGROUND

This is the 114th Memorial Day Service to be held at Arlington National Cemetery. This ceremony was established by order of Major General John Logan on May 5, 1868 "with the hope that it will be kept up every year". (Issued to the Grand Army of the Republic.)

This year's program is dedicated to the 325th Air Force group, nicknamed the Checker Tail Clan because of the yellow and white checker board pattern on their planes. This Air Force group fought in the Algeria/Mediterranean battle zone.
