In early February, two representatives of the VVAW National Office and the Washington, BO coordinator for VVAW met with 12 police representatives in: Washington DC. The police represented various Washington police agencies including the Capitol Police, the DC Police, the Park Police, the Secret Secret vice, and the Department of the Interior Police. The meeting with atranged in order to finalities permits for Dewey Canyon IV.

WAW got almost everything we asked for! Pennits for all the marches, demonstrations, picket lines and rallies are now cleared: we have permits to use the Mall and put up three largetents, plus permission for 50 people to stay there 24 hours day... Negotiations are still gaing on for the right to sleep on the Mall; other negotiations are continuing for alternative housing.

VVAW representatives also met with three members of Congress--Cardiss Collins of Illinois, Ron Dellums of California, and Henry Reuss of Wisconsin, all of whom are writing letters to the Mayor of Washington urging that the City of Washington allow VVAW to use a school near the Mail for housing.





Mey LAD THE WREATH

Dear Ms. Dole:

On behalf of the National Office of Vietnam Veterans Against the War, I am contacting you at the suggestion of Camille Haney, a friend and former co-worker of mine at the Wisconsin Department of Justice. As you probably know, "Operation Dewey Canyon IV" under the auspices of our national organization is scheduled to take place in Washington from May 12 through May 15, 1982. The basic objective is to focus attention and attempt to obtain remedial program changes and/or legislation with regard to matters which are of vital concern to Vietnam veterans and their families including, in particular, Veterans Administration job, medical, and educational benefits; and Agent Orange testing, treatment, and compensation.

One of the events scheduled for the final day is a wreath laying ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery. On each prior occasion that Vietnam Veterans Against the War has requested a permit to perform this ceremony, the permit has been denied. Each time the Vietnam veterans still peacefully went to Arlington only to be locked out. To me, and many other veterans and non-veterans alike, this is a real tragedy--especially for veterans of a war whose service and sacrifices have basically gone unrecognized to date. It appears that the Arlington permit for May 15,1982 will also be denied. There are reasons I am sure which can be used to justify doing so including certain federal regulations. However, the equities involved should override these factors.

On May 15th, the Vietnam veterans and their families want only the opportunity to enter Arlington National Cemetery to lay a wreath in the memory of those Vietnam veterans who will never come home, as well as those who are struggling with the effects of Agent Orange and delayed post-traumatic stress disorders so they can eventually come home. If necessary, those present will conduct the ceremony silently. In no event will there be any chants or protest signs. They would like the chance, if possible, to have taps played at the time the wreath is laid and to have either a Vietnam veteran's widow, child, or Gold Star mother present a brief eulogy.

I shall be in Washington approximately a week prior to May 12 and respectfully request an opportunity to discuss this matter with you in Ms. Elizabeth Hanford Dole Page Two April 13, 1982

person to explore what can possibly be done to facilitate the granting of the Arlington permit. Needless to say, if there is anything you can do prior to that time, it would be greatly appreciated. I shall call your office in about a week to schedule an appointment with you. If you desire to contact me prior to that time, my direct mailing address is 6627 Columbus Drive, Middleton, Wisconsin 53562 and my telephone number is 608/836-6586.

I might add a personal note. I served in Vietnam with the 25th Infantry Division, was exposed to Agent Orange, and am presently on an extended medical leave of absence from the Department of Justice primarily due to a delayed post-traumatic stress disorder resulting from my tour in Vietnam. I have worked for the Department of Justcie for almost eleven years as a senior staff investigator and if I had any reason to believe there was a potential for the Arlington ceremony being anything other than a peaceful one, I would not be contacting you now. It is not the desire of Vietnam veterans and their families to embarrass the President, their country, or themselves in any manner at Arlington. The President himself has recently referred to the Vietnam War as a noble cause. The granting of the Arlington permit would be one appropriate way in which the President could help honor the veterans of a war who most Americans have chosen to forget.

I look forward to our meeting in Washington in early May.
