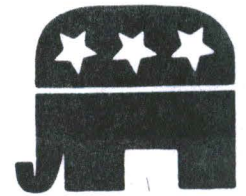





3. and both charm and humor



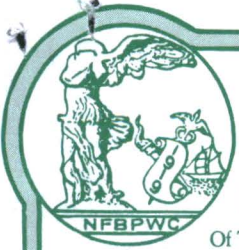


