SUBJECT Background for 10/25/88 luncheon

#### I. PURPOSE

To meet with former Soviet refuseniks who gained their freedom because of the work of this Administration. These refuseniks will be meeting with the POTUS after the luncheon to present him with a valuable Passover Haggadah. The Hagaddah is the story of the Jewish Exodus from Egypt during the time of the Pharoah's. It has a message of freedom and hope for all enslaved people, but especially for the refuseniks.

#### II. BACKGROUND

Senator Rudy Boschwitz requested the photo opportunity for this group through the office of Congressional Affairs, but will not attend the luncheon or the Oval Office meeting. Consequently, you are the hosting official.

#### III. PARTICIPANTS

Morris Abram is the Chairman of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry. He is known by the President and has been an Administration appointee (Member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights). He is also the immediate past president of the Conference of Presidents of Major Jewish Organizations.

Marvin Ashendorf is director of the American Friends of Shamir. Shamir is an organization of orthodox professionals who emigrated from the Soviet Union to Israel. Mr. Ashendorf is an American.

Yaacov Agam is the famous Israeli artist who designed the Hagaddah being presented to the POTUS. Mr. Agam was not a refusenik.

## IV. PRESS PLAN

The luncheon is private and without press coverage.

## V. SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

- -- The guests will arrive in my office at 12:30 PM. I will escort them to the Roosevelt room at 12:55 PM.
- -- Lunch will begin at 1:00 PM. I will ask Rabbi Kogan to bless the meal.
- -- Lunch will end at 1:40 PM and you will escort the group into the Oval Office for the photo opportunity.

Yoisuf Begun is one of the most famous Jewish refuseniks. He was trained as a radio engineer and mathematician in the Soviet Union and received a doctoral degree in 1967 from Moscow University. In 1971 he was refused an exit visa on the grounds that he possessed "state secrets." He was then dismissed from his job and refused other employment. Six years later he was arrested on the charge of parisitism. Between 1977 and 1987, Begun suffered internal exile, imprisonment and torture. President Reagan spoke out several times on behalf of Begun and is credited with applying the pressure necessary to force the Soviets to release Begun.

Professor Herman Branover is a professor of magnetohydrodyamics at Ben Gurion University in Israel. He also serves as chairman of Shamir in Israel. Dr. Branover arrived in Israel in 1972 from the Soviet Union.

Nachum Donner - No information -

Rabbi Yitzchak Kogan is called the "Tzadik of Leningrad" (Tzadik is the Jewish equivalent of a Saint). He was a refusenik for 12 years during which time he dedicated himself to supervising all aspects of Jewish practices in the city of Leningrad. At present, he organizes reception committees for new Russian immigrants arriving in Israel and assists them with their immediate needs and general absorption.

Menachem Lubinsky is the President of Lubicom, an advertising and public relations company in New York City. He is handling the PR needs of several members of this group.

Moshe Oirichman is the head of R'mach, a social service agency in Israel, which assists Soviet emigres. Mr. Oirichman is not a refusenik.

Natan Sharansky is another of the more celebrated refuseniks to be released during the Reagan Administration. In his book Fear No Evil, Sharansky credits the President and the Administration with forcing the Soviet hand on his behalf.

Joseph Wassner is an American businessman and philanthropist who has been active in the fight to free Soviet Jews.
