

Morgenthau Hall at Harvard University's B'nai B'rith Hillel building stands as a lasting monument to your unstinting devotion to the cause of Armenian-Jewish friendship.

In response to your appeal four distinguished Armenian-Americans HIRAIR HOVNANIAN EDWARD MARDIGIAN STEPHEN P. MUGAR ALEX MANOOGIAN and chose to honor the memory of my late grandfather, who as the United States Ambassador to Turkey during the dark days of the 1915 massacres acted with great courage in behalf of the benighted Armenian people. Later when he returned home he spoke out almost alone in an attempt to arouse the conscience of freedom loving people of the world to the full horror of these events.

As Ambassador Morgenthau's grandson and namesake I choose to think of myself as an honorary Armenian. I therefore take personal pride in your memorial bearing his revered name which stands as a shining symbol of the undying friendship between Armenian and Jewish Americans bonded by common memories of the world's two most brutal and tragic holocausts.
