Following are recommendations for the NFRW speech:

Page 1, 3rd paragraph:

Remove last sentence: "And a gain of just sixty-seven seats nationwide can give Republicans control of forty-nine State legislative chambers." After hearing the President say this yesterday, it is confusing to an audience and does not translate well verbally.

Suggested replacement: "It is said that the Republican Party is under-represented some 25-35 seats in Congress, due to the last redistricting. We don't want this to happen again."

Page 3:

Retain the first sentence, but eliminate the next one, inserting instead some remarks on the importance of the '88 election. Suggested text: "In 1988 we will elect someone to succeed me. I'm going to do everything in my power to ensure that that person is a Republican, but I can only do it with your help. I'm counting on you to come through for me as you have before. Thank you and God bless you."

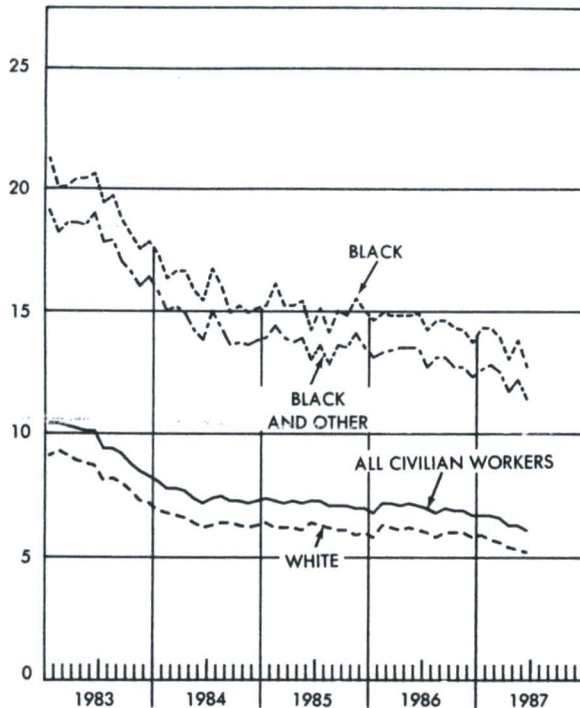

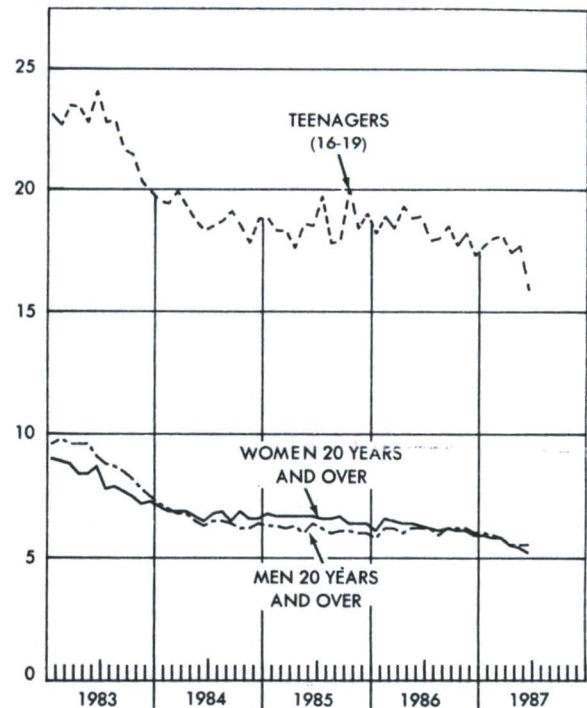
SELECTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATES
