Welcome to the White House.

During the playing of Honors for the President and the Visiting Dignitary, it is customary that White House Guests observe the following:

Stand at attention during the playing of Ruffles and Flourishes (Musical Salute).

Stand at attention during the playing of Hail to the Chief.

During the playing of the National Anthems, salute by placing your right hand over the heart. If gentlemen's hats are worn, the hat is held over the left shoulder with the hand over the heart.

- 9:55 a.m. His Excellency The General Secretary of The Central Committee of The Communist Party of the Soviet Union and Mrs. Gorbachev proceed by car to the White House.
- 10:00 a.m. Arrival at the White House where General Secretary and Mrs. Gorbachev will be greeted by the President of the United States and Mrs. Reagan, the Vice President of the United States and Mrs. Bush, Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz, a Representative of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, a Representative of the Diplomatic Corps, and other officials.

Military honors will be rendered.
