# President Reagan: A Remarkable Man

By VERMONT ROYSTER

Ronald Reagan continues to confound all who watch him, friends or critics.

The events of Monday were but the latest example, impressive though that was. Here was a 70-year-old man with a bullet in his lung, walking under his own steam from car to hospital emergency room. There he underwent more than two hours of emergency surgery and emerged from it in a condition that would have been remarkable for one half his age. Even the doctors who attended him were astonished at the stability of his vital functions, presaging a rapid recovery. One of them noted that his "physiological age" belied the calendar.

So much for those who feared he might be too old for the presidency. His foes tried

to make his age a major issue in the campaign, his friends and supporters were nervous that he might not be physically up to the demands of the presidency. We are not likely to hear of that again any time soon.

Mr. Reagan is the fifth U.S. President to be the target of an assassination attempt

in this century, beginning with McKinley in 1901 and running through the two attempts on Gerald Ford. Just why this should be so in this country, of all countries, must remain a puzzle. The targeted Presidents have been both Democratic and Republican; except for the Puerto Rican gang at

presidential possibility. Before that he couldn't even win the Republican nomination.

But when the tide of fortune turned Mr. Reagan was ready to greet it. What the voters had come to feel about the state of the country, and what ought to be done

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tempt on President Truman, all the attempts seem to have been the work of isolated gunmen. Not organized terrorists, just individual madmen.

What is unusual in the Reagan case is that he is the first President-in-office to be actually shot and to recover. Teddy Roosevelt, who was wounded in 1912 and also recovered, was then several years out of office. McKinley died within a few days of being shot, John Kennedy within a matter of minutes. All the others escaped.

That Mr. Reagan survived is due both to his own efforts to keep his body in good shape and to sheer luck that the bullet didn't hit three inches closer to his heart. In many ways that's the story of his life, a combination of foresight and fortune.

Ronald Reagan was elected President in 1980 because, in large measure, the times were right for him. He had been standing in the presidential wings since 1966 when to everyone's surprise he was elected governor of California. But not until last year had disillusionment with a generation of liberal Democratic policies shifted the public mood enough to make Reagan a strong

about it, he had felt for a long time and he was able to articulate the people's feelings.

Indeed, for a politician, President Reagan has been remarkably consistent in his political advocacy. Ten years ago while still governor of California, he would express to any visiting journalist essentially the same thoughts, frequently using the same words and homely parables, that he used so skillfully in his successful campaign. He did not have to change his rhetoric to fit a new political mood. He waited patiently until the public mood matched his own.

Since his election his consistency of thought and action have been equally remarkable. Every new President in the past quarter century, seeking the office, has talked of reducing government spending, with a balanced budget promised in the near future, and of cutting the people's taxes. To everyone's astonishment President Reagan from his first day in office actually set out to do what he said he would do.

What's more, he seems to have thus far carried the people with him, in defiance of

the conventional wisdom that cutting the government's budget is politically impossible. At least, his friends have been surprised, his foes confounded.

President Reagan is no deep philosopher or intellectual giant. What President of our times has been? But he has proved more than a match for the intellectual snobs who have sneered because he was once a movie actor and scoffed at his use of the copybook maxims. What has been overlooked is that this man has lived a long and varied life, and somewhere along the way found out who he is, what he thinks and why he thinks it. That's a rare thing for any man.

Two small incidents from Monday: When Mrs. Reagan rushed to the hospital and asked him what had happened, he replied, "I forgot to duck." And as he was wheeled into the operating room he looked up at the surgical team and remarked, "I hope you are all Republicans."

One-liners, to be sure, and not even too original. But not lines fed by any gag-writers, to whom his scorners attribute his wry humor. These are the words of a man a little frightened by what he faces but determined to face it with grace, a man who has come to terms with death as well as life, which is the measure of true courage. Such a man is not easily bent with every wind.

So the suspicion grows that there is more to Ronald Reagan than has met any one's eye. I will no longer be surprised he proves to be both a strong and successful President, one who in the end of the country's imagination and turn of rection around as no President has since Franklin Roosevelt.



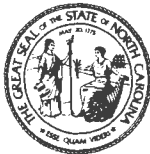

Dear Mr. President:

I haven't a typewriter so will just have to write this, have to state all so you will understand. I hope in some way this information may help to save this nation, that the ruination of my life will not have been in vain. Bear in mind this was all started and started to me in <sup>1930's</sup>

Do you know and realize that all of our wars problems and programs were all plans started in Roosevelt Admin. by Roosevelt + Kremlin. It seems fantastic but true and Mrs Roosevelt saw to it that many plans were put through + carried out.

I was in 1930's, I was working in Treas Dept when the subject came up that all employees were to join the C. I. O. I contacted the White House. My boss Mr. Schoen immediately transferred me to another floor D.C. Accts office of Treasury Dept.

I was not in this office very long before a Russian woman named Rose, said "she was Stallings daughter" she was placed in job by Presidential appointment as were thousands of others.

She had not been in this country very long, was not a naturalized citizen and could hardly speak English. She stated to me that she knew it had refused to join C. I. O. which she said was a Communist Organization. She also said she was sent by Krumler as head of the Clan to create more cells when she was gone. Gus Hall was to be head of Clan. There was a great conspiracy working in our country had been since before the 1st world War that they were going to ruin and destroy our country, get control by 1965, take it over in 1980's without firing a shot.

They would create an inflation so great that everything would be so high that only the rich could own a home. Diamonds would be the only thing of intrinsic value and no one could buy them.

Then she proceeded to tell me their full plan each day giving me notes and telling me to destroy them. I just tossed them in waste basket.

Then the Russian woman asked me to have lunch with her one day and told me that I had not destroyed the notes, they had found them and she was in trouble those people in hall everyday were communist watching us. She wanted to tell me everything so I would try to save the nation. I told her I was too insignificant but, she said, "there was no more time and I had to listen and do it." I was terribly upset and begged her to tell someone else. But bosses followed us, she said, "they were communist and were reading our lips." When she had finished she gave me a hammer & sickle club and a metal mirror with some kind of words and numbers scratched on it. Said to give it to who may try to save the nation. My husband & I were gassed & they got them away from me when we had to leave the house.

Before she left she told me I was the only one in the nation that knew the full plan, that even to Roosevelt or <sup>or</sup> Lew Hall, they only knew step by step as they were instructed by the Kremlin. I asked her about F.B.I. J. Edgar Hoover and she said, very little only anonymous as he was in administration. This I did. He knew who I was he said, "his hands were tied" after I was talking to him I received pamphlets in the mail.

1. The Communist then were 50,000 strong from Wash D.C. to New Jersey and increasing all the time. Pres. and Mrs. Roosevelt had made great commitments and pledges to the Kremlin. I asked why? She said, "Partly for vengeance and partly for financial gain". I said, "Our Pres will do this to our country?" She said, "He will or else." I was perplexed.

she said, "They would both be in Supreme Court". The Democrats had caused the depression, to fool the people and secure their faith in the administration so that it would stay in for many years. They would try to throw out and kill the other party.



5. The start of their plan had been Income Tax which would be increased each year until people would be choked to death with taxes and many people would lose their homes and everything. In this way they can start big Gov. and give away plans.

7. That there was going to be a 2nd World War, a long hard one, we would lose many men and it would cost this nation greatly. The Kremlin would be the only one to gain. "There was not then any any sight?" She said "Our executives were planning for it to start in South Seas. Just when that was over a war would start in Korea then there would be uprisings and skirmishes all over the world. Only Kremlin would gain and U.S. would be drained of their finances.

They will force and fake grievances in the Orient and trick your nation into a war in South East Asia. It will only be to kill off your men, build up their country and drain your economy. And they mean to kill off your <sup>men</sup>. The Orient will never go against them as some of hierarchy are blood kin.

So U.S. should not get involved in any way with their plans as U.S. would gain nothing as they do not care how many of their peasant people they kill off.

Even though most of these plans have taken place there are still a lot that you can protect this nation from in many ways.

Our nation should be put back on total standard. Our defenses should be increased to kill. Power in strength. The only thing Kremlin pays any attention to.

If Roosevelt could clean out and change the Supreme Court to carry out his and Kremlin plans, why can't you? It must be done. Also the juvenile Cts must be done away with to protect people from being molested.

The Clan of which Lust Hall is head of and all the cells, must be revealed and dealt. McCarthy is the only one that ever died. But they got him.

## The Plan

The Kremlin Plan to take over This Nation as stated to me in 1930.<sup>5</sup>

We must expose and defend as we cannot negotiate with a "setup" plan.

1. Integration was their first and main issue, to break this country down, socially, morally, and economically, then destroy the negro by annihilation, when they took over this Nation, which would then be completely disarmed and under their full control by an organization, which was to be instigated and set up by Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, which had not even been named then. They would talk peaceful coexistence from beginning to end.
2. Increasing size and power of government, killing, and destroying private enterprise and taking away states rights. Putting fear in people to go on the streets, so businesses would have to close.
3. Infiltrating schools by PIA's to brain wash all the children. So induce them to take dope & children to also drink.

13. They would drain this country of its wealth by foreign aid programs. Starting skirmishes in other countries even killing their people to carry out their plan and get this nation involved.
14. They would induce the United States to carry on cultural exchange, teacher exchange, student exchange and by defecting refugees, would secure entrance into this country to carry on their instructions for Revolution. There are no defectors. (Refugees in Florida state this).
15. There would be strikes caused by unions, and there will be lots of mob violence and rioting.
16. They will connive in every way to break down all standards to completely demoralize this nation. Even to smearing the reputation of men in high office.
17. AFL-CIO, an organization to control and ruin.
18. NAACP - to ruin, destroy; to break down morally, socially and economically; to render this nation one of crime and terror.
