Dear Craig:

The New York Times article about you and Richard Darman made its way to the Santa Ana Register. I'm sure you saw the picture. Is he 7 feet tall, or was he (Darman) standing on a box? You are getting a good deal of publicity as a dynamic duo!

I did hear from James Rosebush and plan to respond to him with some ideas. I look forward to meeting him when I am in Washington in February, and hope that by then I will have a better idea of the President's Program.

I am writing to let you-know that I have given your name as one of three references on a form which I had to fill out for the Army Corps of Engineers. I have been nominated for a position which requires approval from the Under Secretary of the Army who is a friend of the President from California, William Giannelli. The position is on the Environmental Advisory Board of the Chief of Engineers (the 3 star general who heads the Corps). I have been working with the Chief and the second in command, General Hieberg who is in charge of Civil Works. The Board has six members, and it is my understanding that 5 of us have been nominated for what is one vacancy presently. I doubt that they will call you, but since I gave a Corps reference, and an academic reference, I thought a political reference might be useful. I would be the public policy person on the Board. It is now made up of biologists and a planner, and more scientific types. As you know, I have been interested in resource management and how the public and private sector play their respective roles in that process. Most of my research and writing has been in the area of how citizens impact the public policy process and how that impact can be measured.


