Al Mazewski, president of the Polish American Congress, is being honored at a large testimonial banquet in Chicago, on Friday, June 26 in the evening. Over 1,000 tickets have already been sold and they anticipate a crowd of 1,200-1,400 people. Governor Jim Thompson and Mayor Jane Byrne will make appearances and the audience will have representatives from various parts of the country. All proceeds go to the purchase of medical supplies for Poland.

Al asked me yesterday if you would do him, and the Polish American Community, the honor of being the main speaker. I told him that your schedule was undoubtedly a tight one, but I would make the request nonetheless. Al feels that your presence would have great significance among Polish Americans and win many points for the Administration.

Dear Florence:

In accordance with our telephone conversation, I will outline in writing my concern to you. The National Association of Regional Councils (NARC) had about 600 locally elected officials—mayors, city councilmembers, supervisors—from all over the country in Washington on January 27-29, 1982. Among that group there are a smattering of active, supportive Republicans, including Charles Horn. Mr. Horn was recently elected Second Vice-President of NARC and will be President of the organization in 1984 when President Reagan, I assume, will be running for re-election.

Our current President, Corky Kirkpatrick from Portland, was tremendously disappointed when Al Homer, who had been scheduled to speak, called up the morning of his speaking engagement to say that he would not be able to make it. Corky and some of the other officers of NARC felt quite snubbed and wanted to make the matter a topic of discussion at our Board meeting. I was able to prevent this on the basis that I would talk to Ed Meese and, hopefully, get a better reception from The White House with regard to future situations. On March 18 and 19, 1982, I believe the officers, including Charles Horn, will be in Washington. They constitute about five people and I would hope that they could arrange a meeting with Ed Meese or Rich Williamson at that time. Also, May 17 through 19, 1982, there will be about 1200 locally elected officials in Louisville, Kentucky, for the annual meeting of NARC. I would hope that we could have a major speaker from The White House at that time.

Generally speaking, the group agrees with the thrust of reducing the federal budget, working towards a balanced budget, and returning controls back to local government. It is, however, clear that in many situations the emphasis is somewhat different in The White House as to what constitutes local government. We feel that an Association of local governments is more local than the state in some situations.

However, while not always agreeing on the specifics of The White House proposals, most everybody admires the President and are supportive and I would like to maintain that support which would erode rather rapidly if they got the feeling that they were being snubbed and overlooked by The White House, which of course by history is not President Reagan's style.

Therefore, I hope that you will be able to help Charlie Horn and me help the Administration by responding to NARC's desire to have better communication with The White House. I think it will be most helpful that Charlie Horn will be President of the organization in 1984; he is a strong supporter of the Administration. It would also be nice if some communication could be had from The White House with Charlie (his card is attached). He and I are Republicans who have managed to get elected and re-elected in heavily populated Democratic districts, and he is in a position to be helpful and to receive help.

At one time Rich Williamson told me that he would like to make contact with Charlie, but I was neglectful in not putting anything in writing so I assume that Rich just forgot it with the many millions of things he has to look at. I would appreciate it, Florence, if you would share these things with Ed Meese. I really do not personally need a reply, but I would appreciate it if somebody would make it easy for Charlie, at least, to make contact with The White House.

The feeling I get from several organizations is that Rich Williamson has moved into a policy position and therefore does not have the time really needed for adequate communications. Maybe there should be an addition to the staff with the main responsibility of letting us all know about details regarding what is going on at The White House.
