Dear Mr. President:

I have intended to write you for some time to express my pleasure in the way you are directing our country. Upon hearing that you will now have the opportunity to name your first appointment to the U. S. Supreme Court, it seemed an appropriate time since that matter is of vital concern to me as well as many other citizens.

First, let me say that I, as well as many other citizens in Oklahoma, am extremely pleased with your program and the manner in which you are administering it. A great many of us who had followed you for many years had no doubt that you would keep your campaign promises. However, as Vice-President Bush recently said, it is a radical concept to some people when a President does. You and your administration have renewed a great many peoples' faith in the American dream. You certainly have my support in your economic recovery program as well as in many other areas.

As a legislator vitally interested in the proper Federal-State relationship and as a lawyer concerned in the direction many federal court decisions have taken this country in the last four decades, I would consider your Supreme Court appointments as important as any decisions you make as President. I know from your remarks that you feel the same way. As you recently indicated, federal judges have too long been making law by judicial fiat, instead of merely interpreting the law.

If any appointment should be completely separated from political considerations it is the appointment of Supreme Court Justices. It should not matter whether a candidate for that office is Republican or Democrat, white or black, man or woman, but the prime consideration and criteria is I believe: that the candidate be the best possible person available to accept the office. If a superior candidate is rejected because he or she is of the wrong sex, or the wrong race, the country is the loser. I believe your criteria is ideal for the consideration of such appointments.

In the above regard, Thomas Jefferson who was a very outspoken critic of the judiciary in his day once wrote:

President Ronal Reagan Washington, D. C. 20500 June 23, 1981 Page Two

"On every question of construction, carry ourselves back to the time when the Constitution was adopted, recollect the spirit manifested in the debates and instead of trying what meaning may be squeezed out of the text, or invented against it, conform to the probable one in which it was passed." Ford, The Writings of Thomas Jefferson, X 231 (1899)

All too often nowadays, federal judges, particularly Supreme Court Justices, do not adhere to the wisdom of Jefferson, but instead use their own social, economic or personal philosophy as their guide for Constitutional construction. When that occurs, the will of the People, whom Madison called the ultimate authority, is subverted and Republican government denied.

If the complex Constitutional problems created by forty years of destructive judicial precedents are ever to be corrected, our nations' highest court needs new justices who will not just sit and affirm these precedents, but will reverse them. I wish you Godspeed in your search for the highest qualified people to sit on the Supreme Court.

In closing, let me add that when you were wounded by the gunman, you inspired the whole nation by the manner in which you reacted to the situation. The nation is thankful to God for your seemingly quick recovery. If that recovery is not total (although it seems to be), I hope it soon is.

Please keep up the good work.

Although I am certain that you presently are considering many outstanding candidates to fill the vacancy on the U.S. Supreme Court created by the resignation of Associate Justice Potter Steward, I am writing to urge your serious consideration of a superlative New Hampshire justice for this appointment, also. The Honorable David H. Souter of Weare, Associate Justice of the New Hampshire Superior Court.

While I will comment more directly on this nominee below, I think it appropriate to note that no New Englander is currently a member of the Court, nor has there been an appointment from this region for many years. While our distinguished former Chief Justice of the New Hampshire Supreme Court, the late Frank R. Kenison, was considered seriously for appointment to the Supreme Court by President Eisenhower, New Hampshire has not figured strongly even in speculation about an appointment for many years. I request that you take mind of this factor and the need for geographical balance on the Court in your deliberations.

Justice Souter, 41, has served on the New Hampshire Superior Court since 1978. Prior to that, he served with distinction as the Attorney General of New Hampshire, succeeding now- Senator Warren Rudman in that position in 1976, having been Rudman's Deputy Attorney General for five years prior to that. Justice Souter is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Harvard University and the Harvard Law School, and was a Rhodes Scholar. Prior to joining the Attorney General's office, he practiced law privately in Concord.

David Souter is a brilliant, conservative judge who understands the way government operates. He is a strict, although reasonable, constructionist who recognizes the appropriate role of the courts in our society. He is articulate and writes with force and persuasion. In my judgement, he would be recognized in a short time as an outstanding member of the Supreme Court.

I am pleased to be able to recommend this excellent man to you. His ability, preception and youth make him an exceptional candiate and warrants, I believe, his serious consideration for this and for future vacancies.
