Dear Mr. President:

We are writing today to respectfully ask your consideration of the possibility of appointing an American of Italian heritage to the next vacancy on the United States Supreme Court.

As you know, Italian Americans have made tremendous strides in all sectors of the American society in the last few decades. We stand at the very highest levels in education, business and public service. Yet no Italian American has ever been nominated to the Supreme Court.

In this past year, the National Italian American Foundation has conducted a nationwide search, under the chairmanship of Ambassador John A. Volpe, assisted by Attorney Donald Santarelli, of Italian Americans who are qualified for such an appointment. In this search, we have discovered numerous individuals with truly distinguished credentials. Two sitting jurist in particular have been cited as being eminently qualified for an appointment to the Supreme Court. These are Judge Joseph L. Tauro, Federal Judge, U.S. District Court (Massachusetts); and Judge Antonin Scalia, U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. Their resumes are enclosed.

We applaud with great enthusiasm your previous appointments to the federal courts and urge your serious consideration of either of the individuals cited above or others of Italian-American heritage with similar qualifications for a Supreme Court appointment.
