Senator Danforth has recently recommended for your consideration Judge Albert L. Rendlen as a nominee for Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court. I wholeheartedly endorse Judge Rendlen for this crucial appointment to the Court.

For many years I have known Judge Rendlen. 
Having in mind your desire to become the first President to appoint a woman to the United States Supreme Court, the National Association of Women Lawyers wishes to endorse and recommend the appointment of the HONORABLE CORNELIA G. KENNEDY to fill the vacancy on the Court created by the retirement of Justice Potter Stewart.

Judge Cornelia G. Kennedy has an outstanding record as a lawyer and as a jurist. She now sits on the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit, to which she was elevated September 26, 1979, after having served as District Judge on the United States District Court, Eastern District of Michigan, from 1970, and as Chief Judge of that Court from November 1977, to the date of her appointment to the Court of Appeals. Before her service on the Federal Bench Judge Kennedy served as Judge of the Third Judicial Circuit of the State of Michigan (which includes Detroit), to which she was elected November 8, 1966. Prior to going on the Court she engaged in private law practice in Detroit, Michigan, for some sixteen years. Following her graduation in 1947 from the University of Michigan (with distinction) she served as law clerk to the late Chief Judge Harold M. Stephens, United States Court of Appeals, District of Columbia Circuit (1947-1948).

Judge Kennedy is now a Member of the Board of Trustees of the Federal Judicial Center, Washington, D.C. I am sure you have available the records which show her service in many leadership roles to the legal profession, as well as to her community. From her record you undoubtedly will conclude that she merits the distinction of being the FIRST woman justice to sit on the United States Supreme Court.

The National Association of Women Lawyers is the only NATIONAL organization of women lawyers, having been founded in 1899 and an affiliate of the American Bar Association since 1948. Therefore, we speak for and in behalf of women lawyers throughout the United States in urging the appointment of this HIGHLY QUALIFIED and DISTINGUISHED lawyer and jurist to our highest court.

Dear President Reagan:

Today, the Washington Post reported that you are seriously considering Judge Sandra D. O'Conner for the Supreme Court vacancy. I have checked into her judicial and legislative background and have discovered some rather disturbing information. It is my understanding that in 1974, she cast the deciding vote against a memorial from the Arizona legislature to Congress urging Congress to pass a pro-life amendment. It has also come to my attention that she was active in the liberal, pro-ERA International Women's Year.

I am deeply concerned that the next Supreme Court justice shares your conservative philosophy. I urge you to examine her record closely before making a final decision. Her position on the pro-life amendment is especially troubling in the light of our party's 1980 platform pledge to select Supreme Court justices who respect life.

In light of your campaign pledge to select a woman as a Supreme Court justice as "one of the first" nominations you will have, allow me to recommend Congresswoman Marjorie Holt as a nominee. She has served admirably in Congress for the last nine years. Before that she was a practicing attorney for over 20 years and served as the Clerk of the Circuit Court in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. She would be a fine addition to the Court. I will be sending you a letter soon recommending her and several other highly qualified people for the nomination.

In closing let me say that I believe in you, Mr. President. I campaigned for you and am proud to serve in Congress today during your administration because I share your conservative philosophy. The third branch of our government deserves the same type of quality individuals serving in Congress and the White House who embrace the conservative philosophy. Thank you for your consideration.



Dear Mr. Friedersdorf:

Today, the Washington Post reported that you are seriously considering Judge Sandra O'Conner for the Supreme Court vacancy. I have checked into her judicial and legislative background and discovered some rather disturbing information. It is my understanding that in 1974 she cast the deciding vote against a memorial from the Arizona legislature to Congress urging Congress to pass a Pro-life amendment. It has also come to my attention that she was active in the liberal, Pro ERA International Women's Year.

I am deeply concerned that the next Supreme Court justice shares your conservative philosophy. It does not appear that Mrs. O'Conner shares that philosophy. I urge you to examine her record closely before making a final decision. Her position on the Pro-life amendment is especially troubling in light of our party's 1980 platform pledge to select Supreme Court justices who respect life.

In light of your campaign pledge to select a woman as a Supreme Court justice as "one of the first" nominations you will have, allow me to recommend Congresswoman Marjorie Holt as a nominee. She has served admirably in Congress for the last nine years. Before that she was a practicing attorney for over twenty years and served as Clerk of a Circuit Court in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. She would be a fine addition to the court. I will be sending you a letter soon recommending her and several other highly qualified people for the nomination.

In closing, let me say that I believe in you Mr. President. I campaigned for you and am proud to serve in Congress today during your administration, because I share your conservative philosophy.
