Oregano...

Oregano (*Origanum vulgare*), also called wild marjoram, was used in early times in hot bags as an application for rheumatic swellings. The most flavorsome oregano is a small-leaved (almost trailing) plant with white flowers. Use leaves, fresh or dried, in spaghetti sauce; sparingly in salads; on tomatoes; in herb seasoning mixtures. Use flowers fresh in summer arrangements or dried in winter wreaths and flowers.
