Dear Mayor Wier:

Your letter to President Reagan concerning the werdict in the John Hinckley, Jr., case has been referred to me.

As you know, a jury found John Hinckley, Jr., not guilty by reason of insanity on June 21, 1982, on all thirteen counts with which he was charged, including attempted assassination of the President of the United States. Due to the provisions of the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, there can be no appeal by the Government from a finding of not guilty.

In a statement made the day after the Minckley verdict was announced, Attorney General Smith supported legislative changes in our Federal statutes, including reform of the insanity defense, in order to reduce crime and protect our citizens more effectively. For your convenience, I am enclosing a copy of that statement.

We appreciate the interest and concern which prompted you to write.
