Well the last time I wrote you, you weren't our President. I am very proud and elated! And as I write this please understand if I sound a bit incoherent for Sandy is dead. We were married nearly 36 years, and I'm sure you remember her when we were together in Boca Raton in 1950.

Sandy, as you know, had emphysema. She went into the hospital; her seventh time in August of last year. She was in a private room, then went into Intensive Care a month later. This was followed by her going on a respirator, followed by a tracheostomy, being fed via IV etc. etc. On December 14th, when Debbie and I were in church, she died.

I read and hear a lot about your kids. I'm so happy that Mike deserted his Quarterback goals, and went into Ballet: I think it's super.. And Maureen an actress! I'm happy you both approve of it for I believe kids should be taught to think for themselves, even if, at times, we parents might not like it.

Jeanne is still living on their estate in Studio City, Cal. Her husband of many many (12) years is David Haskell, who has a re-occurring role on Knots Landing. Last week he completed a movie in Texas, while Jeanne and the kid and the dog went up to their lodge in Tahoe to ski. No snow, but at Big Bear she found some. They call me twice a week and of course will come here for Debbie's wedding which is June 13th. Michael, the man she is marrying becomes a doctor on May 30th, and will Intern at Saddlebrook Hospital which is near here. They will honeymoon in Greece and then live with me for at least until we buy another home, which will be here of course.
