Biography

Biography

William Lloyd Stearman is a veteran, a retired government official, an aviator, and an author.

William Lloyd Stearman was born on June 2, 1922 in Wichita, Kansa, the son of Lloyd Stearman, the founder of Stearman Aircraft. After graduating high school in 1940, he went into the Navy's V-12 program, studying at the University of California, Berkeley. He received a B.A. majoring in math. He is also a graduate of the Armed Forces Staff College.

In 1944 he was commissioned as an ensign and attended midshipman's school. After training Stearman was deployed to the Pacific. He was in the 7th Amphibious Fleet and was involved in the Philippines Campaign, 1944-1945 and in the Borneo Campaign, 1945.

After World War II, Stearman entered the foreign service. He was stationed in Vienna, Berlin, Bonn, Saigon. He was also able to pursue his graduate studies and earned an MA and a Ph.D. from the Graduate Institute of International Studies, University of Geneva.

While in Saigon, Stearman became somewhat of an expert on the North Vietnamese and studied the strategies and actions of the war extensively. Upon returning to Washington he joined the State Department's Intelligence and Research Bureau as an expert on North Vietnam and other southeast Asian issues.

In 1971, Stearman joined the National Security Council (NSC) staff under National Security Advisor Henry Kissinger. He was brought over to be the resident "Hanoiologist" on staff. He remained on the NSC until 1976. During this time period he was heavily involved with the Paris peace negotiations with the North Vietnamese, the struggle to enforce the peace agreement, the fall of South Vietnam, the evacuations from South Vietnam, the *Mayaquez* incident, and the POW/MIA issues with Vietnam.

Stearman left the NSC to be an Assistant Director at the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency (ACDA) working on the Multilateral Balance Force Reduction in Europe; the Committee on Disarmament 64; and SALT issues. He left in October 1977 when the newly appointed director arrived. Stearman then became a senior

research fellow at the National Defense University.

In 1977, Stearman also began an association with Georgetown University as an adjunct professor. He began to increase his involvement with Georgetown and by the end of the decade was the Director of the Russian Studies Program. Also at this time, Stearman retired in October 1978 from the Department of State taking advantage of a unique government offer to retire at nearly full pay.

During the 1980 Presidential campaign, Stearman was asked to serve on Governor Ronald Reagan's Foreign Policy Advisory Team, and then after the election as a member of the National Security Transition Team. He joined the NSC for the second time in January 1981 working with Richard Pipes on European and Soviet issues on U.S.-Soviet relations, eastern Europe (especially Poland and Yugoslavia), Central Europe and some work on his specialty area, Indochina. Stearman left the NSC on January 19, 1993.

In his service at the NSC, Stearman served under four presidents: Nixon, Ford, Reagan and George H.W. Bush, and eight National Security Advisors: Henry Kissinger, Richard Allen, William Clark, Robert "Bud" McFarlane, John Poindexter, Frank Carlucci, Colin Powell, and Brent Scowcroft.

In 2012, Stearman wrote a memoir entitled *An American Adventure: From Early Aviation Through Three Wars, to the White House*, which has been described as "a fascinating accounting of his own remarkable life and the tumultuous times in which he lived."

Scope and Content Note

Scope Note

William Stearman was brought into the National Security Council staff for the second time in January 1981 after serving as a member of Governor Reagan's Foreign Policy Advisory Team and as a member of the National Security Transition Team.

Stearman remained on the National Security staff until January 19, 1993. He was probably acting as a consultant or "service by agreement" basis past 1982, but the

Library has not verified this information. From 1981-1982, Stearman was working directly for Richard Pipes on U.S.-Soviet relations, Eastern European issues (especially Poland and Yugoslavia), Central Europe and Indochina, a previous regional specialty of Stearman). This collection contains material covering the 1981-1982 time period only. No further material has been identified for Stearman.
