Biography

Douglas J. Feith worked in the Reagan Administration as a Middle East specialist for the National Security Council and then served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for negotiations policy. Under President George W. Bush, Feith served as the Undersecretary of defense for policy from July 2001 to August 2005. In 2008, he authored *War and Decision*, a memoir of his Pentagon work on the war on terrorism. For his service, Feith has received the Distinguished Public Service Medal, the Defense Department's highest civilian award.

Scope and Content Note

The Office of Political Affairs included offices with the responsibility for various geographic regions. Under the old Office of Political Affairs, Douglas Feith worked in the Near East and South Asia Office. These regional responsibilities were later revised, renamed and elevated to directorates.
