Biography

Biography

Franklin Lavin was born in Canton, Ohio in 1957. He was interested in politics from a young age, including an active part in College Republicans organization. In the 1970s, he worked at the Republican National Committee, other Republican organizations, and several state-level political campaigns. In 1980, Lavin earned a degree in international politics from Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service. The following year he worked for the American Institute in Taiwan, the organization serving as the *de facto* U.S. embassy in Taiwan. Returning to the United States, Lavin worked in the Reagan 1980 campaign and 1980-1981 transition.

Lavin received a Master's degree in Chinese language and history from Georgetown in 1985. He later earned an M.A. in International Relations and International Economics from Johns Hopkins University, and an M.B.A. in Finance from the University of Pennsylvania. (Wharton School).

Lavin first joined the White House staff in early 1981, as Assistant to the Deputy Director, Office of Presidential Personnel. He left the White House later that year, and worked in the Agency for International Development (AID), and the President's Commission on Executive Exchange. In March 1984, he returned to the White House as a member of the Office of Public Liaison. Lavin left Public Liaison in March 1985 to become finance director for the National Republican Senatorial Committee. Following a period of self-employment, he joined the National Security Council in June 1986. He was the NSC's Deputy Executive Secretary for Coordination, with responsibility for planning and coordinating presidential meetings and trips.

In March 1987, Lavin replaced Haley Barbour as head of the White House's political affairs unit. He held this position until the end of the Reagan Administration. Lavin reported to Frank Donatelli, the Director of the Office of Political and Intergovernmental Affairs. The two men had worked together at AID in 1983-1984.

In the George H. W. Bush administration, Lavin served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Asia and the Pacific. Lavin spent much of the 1990s as a banker and venture capitalist in Hong Kong and Singapore.

Lavin was U.S. Ambassador to Singapore from 2001 to 2005. He then served as Under Secretary for International Trade, in the Department of Commerce, until 2007. Lavin is currently CEO of Export Now, the company he founded to help other companies sell on-line in China. He is co-author of the 2011 book *Export Now: Five Keys to Entering New Markets*.

Scope and Content Note

Scope and Content

The Franklin Lavin collection consists of 14 series. The series are as follows: SERIES I: National Campaign File; SERIES II: 1988 Campaign Issues: SERIES III: Subject File; SERIES IV: Organizations; SERIES V: Administrative File; SERIES VI: White House Memos; SERIES VII: Speech File; SERIES VIII: Trip File; SERIES IX: States; SERIES X: Voter Surveys and Summaries; SERIES XI: Telephone Logs; SERIES XII: Decision Making Information Inc.; SERIES XIII: Arthur J. Finkelstein and Associates; and SERIES XIV: Publications.

As head of the political affairs unit, Mr. Lavin had the twofold task of assisting President Reagan and his staff in political matters, and serving as White House liaison to the Republican Party and Republican candidates for office. Lavin coordinated the Reagan Administration's involvement in the 1987 and 1988 elections, including its contacts with Republican Party officials, Republican candidates for office, and the Bush-Quayle presidential campaign. His files also reflect his interests in his home state of Ohio and issues affecting the Jewish American community.

This collection includes a small amount of Lavin work product from before his time in Political and Intergovernmental Affairs (see the oversize calendar cards in Series V), and some earlier reference material that he retained for ongoing use. At this time, we have not located any distinct Lavin files in our holdings from his Administration positions prior to Political and Intergovernmental Affairs. However, material documenting Lavin's earlier Reagan Administration work is scattered throughout our holdings. For example, see Coordination Office, NSC collection for material documenting Mr. Lavin's time in the NSC.

SERIES I: NATIONAL CAMPAIGN FILE, 1987-1988

This series consists of material relating to presidential endorsements of 1988
Republican candidates for office; the drafting of campaign-related boilerplate letters to constituents; the 1988 Bush-Quayle presidential campaign, including contacts

between Lavin, other members of President Reagan's staff, and Bush campaign staff; information pertaining to Vice President Bush, Michael Dukakis, and other 1988 candidates for President; articles, analyses, and campaign literature pertaining to state and Congressional 1988 elections; proposed campaign-related events for President Reagan, including television and radio ads; the 1988 Republican National Convention and platform; broad strategy for state legislative races; White House involvement in state races that would affect Congressional redistricting in 1990; reports on the Political Affairs office's ongoing work; public opinion polls; and information on state Republican Party organizations. The files are arranged alphabetically.

SERIES II: 1988 CAMPAIGN ISSUES

This series consists of material relating to elections for statewide offices and the U.S. Senate; requests for presidential letters supporting Republican candidates; boilerplate presidential messages such as birthday greetings; correspondence between Lavin and members of the public or Administration staff; Administration fact sheets and talking points on domestic and foreign policy issues; information on state government officials, especially Republican; unsolicited resumes and personnel recommendations; Hatch Act issues; public opinion polls; and policies regarding government travel and use of the White House Mess. The files are arranged alphabetically.

SERIES III: SUBJECT FILE. 1987-1988

This series consists of material pertaining to 1988 presidential, Congressional and state elections; the 1988 Republican National Convention; reviews of Reagan Administration accomplishments; periodic Office of Political Affairs reports to President Reagan or the White House Chief of Staff; the drafting of boilerplate presidential letters supporting Republican candidates for office; public financing of campaigns; political action committee (PAC) contributions; White House staff involvement in the 1988 George Bush presidential campaign; scheduling of presidential events; schedules for President Reagan and Vice President Bush; event invitations for Mr. Lavin; conservative political organizations; public opinion polls, especially concerning 1988 elections; Lavin's contacts with Jewish American organizations; the Robert Bork Supreme Court nomination; Central America; and the Middle East. The files are arranged alphabetically.

SERIES IV: ORGANIZATIONS

This series consists of material pertaining to the Republican Party and Republican organizations, conservative political organizations, ethnic organizations, business groups, White House Office units, and a few liberal political groups. It includes publications, letters and boilerplate mailings, fundraising materials, membership lists, and requests for presidential events and endorsements. Topics include the 1988 Republican National Convention, 1988 presidential and Congressional campaigns, U.S.-Soviet relations, Central America, the 1988 drought in the Midwest, and the 55 miles per hour speed limit. The files are arranged alphabetically.

SERIES V: ADMINISTRATIVE FILE, 1987-1988.

This series consists of material pertaining to the scheduling of events for Mr. Lavin and Cabinet officials, Lavin reports on his ongoing work, unsolicited resumes and personnel recommendations, requests for events, Office of Political Affairs meetings and meeting follow-up, the role of the Political Affairs office in 1987 and 1988 elections, information on Office of Political Affairs staff, guidance on White House staff political involvement, the fiscal year 1989 federal budget, nominations to the Supreme Court and other federal judicial positions, Central America, presidential speeches, and correspondence with political leaders and the public. The files are arranged alphabetically.

This series also contains material pertaining to daily schedules during Lavin's time in the National Security Council (NSC) (1986-1987) and Office of Political and Intergovernmental Affairs (1987-1989). The scheduling information is kept on 3X5 inch "Calendar Cards." Each card lists the scheduled appointments for the day. The cards from Lavin's time in the NSC also include some schedules for other staff. The cards were maintained in a single set beginning with Lavin's NSC position, the Library is maintaining them as one unit. Most cards are arranged in reverse chronological order and they have been transferred to an appropriate size box at the end of the collection (Box 54).

SERIES VI: WHITE HOUSE MEMOS, 1987-1988.

This series consists of material pertaining to proposed presidential and White House staff events for the 1988 campaign season, the Office of Political Affairs' role in the 1988 campaigns, presidential and White House staff political travel, correspondence

with national and local campaign organizations, response to the Iran-Contra affair, and lists of Office of Political and Intergovernmental Affairs files. The files are arranged alphabetically.

SERIES VII: SPEECH FILE, 1987-1988.

This series consists of material pertaining to speeches and travel in support of Republican candidates for office. It includes draft and final speech texts for President Reagan, Mr. Lavin, and other White House officials; correspondence with state and local Republican campaign organizations; reference material compiled for use in speeches and events; travel forms and receipts; and documentation and talking points on topics including Reagan Administration accomplishments, foreign relations, and religious rights. Most folders are in reverse chronological order by date of speech/event.

SERIES VIII: TRIP FILE, 1986-1988.

This series consists of material pertaining to travel by Mr. Lavin, President Reagan, and other Administration officials, primarily during the 1988 campaign season. It includes trip proposals, recommendations for events, speeches, and administrative papers pertaining to travel, including reimbursement for political events. Most folders are in reverse chronological order by trip date.

SERIES IX: STATES, 1987-1988.

This series contains material pertaining to state and local elections and political groups, including: correspondence with Republican campaign organizations and elected officials; Administration events in support of Republican organizations and candidates; Office of Political Affairs meetings with state Republican leaders; Republican National Committee political briefings on states; information on 1988 statewide primaries; public FEC information on candidate campaign funds; publications from campaigns; unsolicited personnel recommendations; and use of President Reagan's signature and endorsement. The files are in alphabetical order by state/territory/district. In a few cases, material pertaining to a state is interfiled with records for an adjacent state.

SERIES X: VOTER SURVEYS AND REFERENCE MATERIAL, 1984-1988.

This series contains material pertaining to Republican National Committee briefings on states, issues, and upcoming elections; contact information for state Republican Party officials; analyses of Congressional and gubernatorial races; biographical information on candidates for Congress; Congressional votes on legislation; public opinion polls; proposed government funding for transportation projects; antitrust policy; and policy on releasing information on military personnel. The files are arranged alphabetically.

SERIES XI: TELEPHONE LOGS, 1987-1988.

This series contains material pertaining to telephone calls for Mr. Lavin. It includes telephone log forms that list call dates and times, names and phone numbers of callers, and information on return calls or other follow-up. Some logs are in reverse chronological order, but there is no overall arrangement.

SERIES XII: DECISION MAKING INFORMATION INC., 1985-1986.

This series contains material pertaining to public opinion polls from Decision Making Information Inc., the organization founded by longtime Reagan pollster Richard Wirthlin. There are chronologically arranged "Flash Results" reports, and a chronologically arranged set of large bound volumes.

SERIES XIII: ARTHUR J. FINKELSTEIN AND ASSOCIATES, 1985-1986.

This series contains material pertaining to public opinion polls from the Republican consulting firm Arthur J. Finkelstein and Associates. Most polls are bound "Southeastern Surveys" focusing on Alabama, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, and South Carolina. Arranged alphabetically.

SERIES XIV: PUBLICATIONS, 1984-1987.

This series contains material pertaining to books and reports regarding Congress, the Republican Party, the federal budget, foreign relations, the textile industry in the South, and conservative organizations. Arranged in alphabetical order by title.
