Biography

David McIntosh was born in <u>Oakland, California</u>, but was raised in <u>Kendallville,</u> <u>Indiana</u>. He attended <u>Yale University</u>, where he graduated with a B.A. in 1980, and later received a J.D. from <u>University of Chicago Law School</u> in 1983. In 1982, he was a founding member of the Federalist Society.

In June of 1985 David McIntosh, (1958-) served in the Deputy Assistant Attorney General's Office of Legal Policy and in June of 1986 he became Special Assistant to the Attorney General. In July 1987, he was picked by Kenneth Cribb to work in the Office of Domestic Affairs and in December of 1987, he became Special Assistant to the President for Domestic Affairs. He left the White House in August of 1988 to work on Christopher Cox's successful campaign for the House of Representatives in Southern California.

In the <u>George H. W. Bush</u>'s administration, he served as executive director of Vice President <u>Dan Quayle</u>'s Council for Competitiveness. McIntosh later served as the <u>U.S. Representative</u> for <u>Indiana's 2nd Congressional district</u> from 1995 to 2001. McIntosh was also the Republican nominee for Governor of Indiana in 2000. Since 2001, McIntosh has been a partner in the Washington law firm of Mayer Brown. In December 2014, McIntosh was named the president of the Club for Growth.

When the Library arranged this material, it was discovered that a portion of folders had been removed by David McIntosh at the White House in August of 1988. The Office of Records Management inserted out cards for the missing folders. They do not appear to have been returned. If they are discovered later, they will be integrated at that time. These folders are marked (White House Checkout Card Only).
